- Throughout last spring and into the summer, we mixed 12 cohort schools with IDEO's Design for Learning Studio to explore innovative and sustainable business models. These were presented in our publications and at our Fall Conference in New Orleans. The cohort schools and the IDEO designers were eager to share what they learned: both what works and what doesn't and more importantly, why some initiatives are more successful than others. <u>misbo.com/ideo</u>
- In the early fall, we published a groundbreaking piece on the ethics of purchasing in independent schools.
 School people and vendors came together to hash out what is correct and what isn't permissible in our community. The document serves as a tool that schools are using to ensure that their approach to purchasing matches their mission, their values, and their beliefs about how we treat those in and around our community. missocom/ethics
- During the past semester, colleagues posed questions to each other and got answers on the robust MISBO list-servs on topics such as cyber security insurance, playground equipment, tax reform, multiple recommendations, tuition dependency, background checks, tuition remission, video streaming services, LMS platforms, perpetual enrollment, and many others. - The purchasing consortium, designed exclusively for the independent school industry and the only one
 managed full-time by independent school professionals saw an average savings to each school of over
 \$7,500. These are precious funds that can be directed back to students and fulfilling the mission of the
