





JEDI Officer

- In October 2023, the AAAL membership voted to create a new officer of the Executive Committee devoted to justice, equity, diversity and inclusion.
- To achieve a quorum, 206 members (10% of the membership) needed to vote, and a two-thirds approval was required to make this change to our Bylaws.
- 256 AAAL members voted, of which 224 members (87%) voted in support.
- You will vote for the JEDI officer in the next AAAL election.

JEDI Ad Hoc Committee: Actions taken in past year

- Revised the approach for inviting accommodations requests
- Drafted the language for the creation of a permanent JEDI Standing Committee once the JEDI Officer is in place
- Developed a list of questions related to accessibility and equity concerns for Conference Chairs to ask when visiting hotel sites
- Developed a list of questions and concerns related to accessibility and equity concerns for Conference Chairs and their teams to keep in mind when planning the conference more generally
- Developed the Inclusive Presenter Guidelines now posted to the AAAL website


