

2024 General Business Meeting Minutes Approved March 24, 2025

Call to order and Land Acknowledgement

The President called the meeting to order at 12:35 pm CT.

Reminded Inclusive Presentation Guidelines.

The President acknowledged the land where the 2024 AAAL conference took place. The acknowledgement reads:

The region from Galveston, Texas to Corpus Christi, Texas is the ancestral and current homeland of the Karankawa, Lipan Apache, Ishak (also known as Atakapa), Cotoname, and other tribal and detribalized peoples from before recorded history to the present day. We express gratitude to these peoples who have stewarded these lands and waters since the beginning of time. We acknowledge the land on which AAAL 2024 takes place as sacred, historical, and significant to the Karankawa Kadla peoples and relatives. Let us treat these lands and waters with dignity and respect, as we would our own relative.

Confirmation of Quorum and Review of Rules of Order

The Secretary confirmed quorum (110) and reviewed the following rules of order.

- The agenda sets the order of business for the meeting; the meeting will proceed according to the agenda.
- If anyone would like to discuss a new topic or consider a new proposal not on the agenda, they should (a) contact the Chair(s) of the relevant committee(s) or (b) contact any member(s) of the EC, before or after the Business meeting.
- It is important to follow parliamentary procedure to ensure the meeting runs smoothly and fairly.



Approval of the Agenda

It was moved by Paul Matsuda and seconded by Sarah Cushing that the meeting agenda be approved. The motion carried.

Approval of the March 2023 General Business Meeting Minutes

It was moved by Meg Malone and seconded by Patsy Duff that the March 2023 Annual Business Meeting Minutes be approved. The motion carried.

In Memoriam Reflection for Past President Tim McNamara - Patsy Duff

Past President Patsy Duff presented a moving eulogy of Tim McNamara, offering reflections on his impactful professional achievements and his remarkable personal qualities. The audience respectfully observed a solemn ten-second silence as a tribute to Tim McNamara's memory.

Report of the President - Lourdes Ortega

The President thanked the membership, the volunteer leaders, committees, and the business office. She highlighted a few specific accomplishments in the past year:

- AAAL conferences go multilingual starting with AAAL 2024.
- Our bylaw changed in October 2023, adding a new JEDI Officer to the EC.
- We created a designated JEDI contingency fund to deposit 20% of net operation yearly income.
- We developed the following public communications:
 - AAAL Conferences: Locations, Principles, Logistics (April)
 - Recognizing the International Decade of Indigenous Languages (July)
 - West Virginia University Proposal to Eliminate World Language Department (August)
 - In Memoriams: Jon Henner (August), Tim McNamara (September)
 - Solidarity Statement for the People of Iran (October)
 - AAAL Executive Committee Solidarity Statement on the Violence in Israel and Gaza (October)



The President praised and thanked the OEOC and the PAEC for their extraordinary efforts to enrich the Association with their AAAL Oral History Project, AAAL's Advocacy Campaigns on social media, AAAL Webinars and Workshops, and Briefs. She encouraged the membership to take advantage of the resources created by OEOC and PAEC.

The president expressed gratitude toward past AAAL leaders for generosity and prescience. Specifically,

- New Grabe/Stoller Graduate Student Award, endowed with \$50,000 to FFAL by Fredrika Stoller and Bill Grabe (President 2001-2002)
- Networking Event designed by and for Early Career Scholars, an initiative of Patsy Duff while President (2021-2022), will now be a permanent element in the conference program.

Lastly, the President expressed her gratitude for having the honor and privilege to have served AAAL.

Report of the Treasurer - Scott Jarvis

The Treasurer presented detailed balance sheets for assets, liabilities and equity, detailed conference statements from the last three years, and income and expense statements. The Treasurer stated that AAAL is doing better financially than expected. 2023 was a good year financially, with good revenues from our annual conference as well as from investments. The Treasurer cautioned that, at the same time, given cost increases, there will be a need to increase conference registration fees.

Report of the Secretary – Agnes He

The Secretary provided a general summary of the work related to AILA and JEDI in the past year. She shared with the membership that the EC has received responses to the AAAL announced Call for Nominations for the AILA Executive Board and that the President will soon communicate the EC's decision to the AAAL nominee and AILA. She informed the membership that the AAAL Inclusive Presenter Guidelines have been submitted to AILA for consideration for AILA Endorsement. She also reminded the membership of the 2024 AILA Congress.

With respect to JEDI, we continue to be guided by principles of JEDI as we recognize and celebrate excellence, in terms of the types of awards we give, the composition of the award committees, the awardees selected, as well as the eligibility requirements for applications for the awards. Moving forward, we will continue to review



and revise AAAL policies and procedures to ensure JEDI is adequately addressed and incorporated. We are eagerly looking forward to the new JEDI Officer joining the EC.

Report of the Ad Hoc Committee on Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (JEDI) – Ashley Moore/Liz Miller

Ad Hoc Committee Chair Ashley Moore and AAAL Member-at-Large Liz Miller shared the history, mission, membership, actions and initiatives of the JEDI ad hoc committee. Specifically:

JEDI Officer

- In October 2023, the AAAL membership voted to create a new officer of the Executive Committee devoted to justice, equity, diversity and inclusion.
- To achieve a quorum, 206 members (10% of the membership) needed to vote, and a two-thirds approval was required to make this change to our Bylaws.
- 256 AAAL members voted, of which 224 members (87%) voted in support.
- You will vote for the JEDI officer in the next AAAL election.

Actions taken in the past year:



- Revised the approach for inviting accommodations requests
- Drafted the language for the creation of a permanent JEDI Standing Committee once the JEDI Officer is in place
- Developed a list of questions related to accessibility and equity concerns for Conference Chairs to ask when visiting hotel sites
- Developed a list of questions and concerns related to accessibility and equity concerns for Conference Chairs and their teams to keep in mind when planning the conference more generally
- Developed the Inclusive Presenter Guidelines now posted to the AAAL website

Current and upcoming initiatives:

- Working on an Anti-Harassment policy for AAAL
- Will analyze data from 2024 post-conference survey related to accessibility and inclusion
- Anticipate looking at AAAL's diversity auditing structures
