# Notes from Statewide Multifamily Housing Industry on Hurricane Helene Relief Thursday, October 17, 2024

#### **FEMA Requests:**

- 1. Direct Lease Program
- 2. Multifamily Lease & Repair Program

#### Mud Issue:

- **Problem**: Several properties are facing issues with contaminated mud, and there is nowhere to offload it.
- **Current Solution**: The only available option is the <u>Hendersonville Transfer Station</u>, but there is a cost involved. They are also accepting damage-related items.
- Bryan mentioned that they are waiting for the state to provide a long-term solution.

#### **Firewatch Update:**

- Retail and hospitality sectors have raised concerns.
- The issue is being escalated for a state-level solution.

### **Supplier Focused Call:**

- **Upcoming Call**: Next Thursday morning, a call will be held for suppliers and management companies to discuss how suppliers can assist with recovery efforts.
- **Key Suppliers**: Roofing contractors, restoration companies, and insurance partners will be invited to participate.
- **Focus**: The call will address short- and long-term needs, especially for properties that are behind in recovery, and how suppliers can proactively plan to support without straining resources.

#### **Eviction Moratorium:**

- Status: No movement on the eviction moratorium yet.
- **Upcoming Discussion**: Jon has a call scheduled today to discuss the situation further.
- **Data Collection**: Mary suggested gathering data on the impact of the COVID-related eviction moratorium on properties and residents.
- Resource Request: Bethany proposed creating a resource on the eviction moratorium.

#### **Renters Insurance:**

• **Proposal**: Jon requested that information on renters' insurance be shared, as it could be a valuable state-level resource that residents may not be aware of.

## **Water Supply Updates:**

• **Current Status**: Water is on at most properties, but it may be inconsistent due to ongoing pipe testing for leaks.

## • Advice for Residents:

- Fill bathtubs with water to flush toilets if water pressure drops or goes off again.
- Be mindful of when to turn water heaters on or off, as fluctuating pressure could cause additional issues at the property level.
