# Bryan Holladay's Update on Water

- As of 11:00 AM on November 18th, Asheville has drinking water.
- Asheville's water system includes three plants, with 80% of the service coming from the North Fork plant, which is currently subsidizing another plant that remains non-operational.
- A new issue of concern is lead in the water. Properties with plumbing installed before 1988 are at risk, and free testing kits are available from the city.
- While water donations are still appreciated, the demand has decreased. Residents are urged to prioritize drinking and cleaning water and avoid filling pools, hot tubs, or other large water containers.

# Multifamily Market Report

- Tina Baker presented key statistics, trends, and forecasts for the Asheville apartment market.
- The report includes vacancy forecasts and budgeting insights for the coming years. Attendees are encouraged to review the report for detailed data.

# **Recovery Stage Update**

- Bryan highlighted that Asheville has moved from Stage 1 (Crisis) through Stage 2 (Recovery) to Stage 3 (Restore/Return).

- Acknowledgment was given to USAA for scheduling their Board Retreat in Western North Carolina, supporting the area's recovery efforts.
