## AASPA Awards Executive Human Capital Leaders in Education Certification to 14 Individuals

OVERLAND PARK, Kan. – December 1, 2023 — The American Association of School Personnel Administrators announced the first round of graduates from the Executive Human Capital Leader in Education (eHCLE) Certification Program. 14 individuals were awarded their eHCLE Certification on December 1 at AASPA's Human Capital Leadership Summit in Tucson, AZ.

The eHCLE Certification Program is a new professional development opportunity for accomplished human capital leaders serving in education organizations. Through a ten-month cohort model, participants receive intensive support from peers and subject-matter experts in areas of human capital management and complete an independent project to drive improvement in their organization.

In 2021, AASPA, Experience Management Institute, and a national committee of PK-12 human capital leaders collaborated to create the eHCLE standards. The standards define the core HC knowledge domains along with the skills needed to improve talent practices in education.
