Would you please take a minute to make sure your chapter number is correct? This is the number that should appear on your address label and which you fill in the blank on the initiate name sheet and annual report. It should be in the lower left-hand corner of your charter. If it is not, please write it in. My apologies to those of you whose name I could not fit on the line and so had to abbreviate it!

"HINTS FROM ELIZABETH"

While filling in for Steve Foster this year, I noticed several items which each chapter should be observing to make the information flow more easily. Please take note of each item below and see if it pertains to you.

1. A2234 is not your chapter #. It is the mail billing code for SHF at Old Dominion University. Your chapter number should follow your name on your address label. If it does not, that means that we no longer have ready access to it without extensive searching. It would help if you could locate your original charter (perhaps hanging on the wall in a school office?) and get your number from that. If that is not possible, let us know and we will try to hunt for it in back files.

"HINTS" CONT'D

- 2. If you began your charter this year, please check to make sure you got all the important documents: Constitution, Suggested Guidelines, and the Initiation Ceremony. If your file is not complete, let me know and I will forward on missing items.
- 3. Each chapter should make out only one check per certificate order drawn from either the bank of the school or the sponsor. cannot accept individual checks from students as processing time is too great and several of these checks bounce each year if we accept them. All checks should be made out to Société Honoraire de Français. If you need to renew your membership in AAFT, that should not be included with the certificate/charter fees, but should be a separate check sent to headquarters in Illinois.
- 4. Be sure and put your name and address on each sheet or staple several sheets together. We handle a tremendous amount of paperwork, and I had several items I could not place in the proper file because they had no school name or address on the request forms. We file under state and zip code, not under chapter name and number, so the complete address on each sheet is absolutely essential for good service.
- 5. Please note that Steve Foster is no longer at Washington State U and has not been in 6 years! If you are still using that address, your mail is being delayed.
- 6. Be sure and specify if you want lettered (calligraphied) certificates or blank ones.
- 7. If your chapter has not been active in recent years, you have been dropped from the mailing list. You need to reapply to activate your charter and receive a new chater number. You may not just pick up again and start sending in requests for certificates. You would also need to pay the \$5 fee to be issued a new charter.

"HINTS" CONT'D

Please be sure official information is sent in under the chapter sponsor's name, not that of the club secretary. When students graduate or leave the school, mail is returned and we do not know to whom to send It is fine to have the club secretary do the correspondence-just be sure the sponsor name is somewhere on the letter. If you order by telephone, you need to pay for the number of certificates you order, not the number you use. You may always keep the extras and use them the following year and note on your initiate form that you have pre-paid the prior year. If you do not want to pay for the extras (this does not include the couple extras we put in in case of error), you must return them in pristine form to us. do not fold them up in a rectangular business #10 envelope for return. We cannot use them and they are no good to us in that state. 10. Remember March to May is the RUSH period for everyone in education. We are grateful to those of you who order as early as you can, although we know this is not always possible when you are waiting for grades to come out before you select.

We are currently making a concerted effort to bring the address list up to date. There have been numerous complaints of folks not getting mail. The Foreign Languages Secretary who handled SHF mailings in her offwork time moved to Florida just after Christmas and I am trying to get all labels corrected and complaints straightened out before I hand the address list back to Steve. Please let us know as soon as possible if your address still is not correct, for we don't want you to miss out on important scholarship information and issues of L'ELAN this next school year.

Information about this year's scholarship winners and Creative Writing Contest winners will be in the next issue of L'ELAN. I must say I was impressed with the entries!


