#### Célébrons nos 50 ans !

Sponsors who met for breakfast in St. Louis considered several items of business and information. Among these were a progress report on, and evaluation of, two ongoing projects.

Materials are being collected and created for a handbook for sponsors. These currently take the form of a set of insert pages for a 3-ring binder. Sponsors were asked to evaluate materials included to date and to make suggestions of additional pages/topics which would be of help. Contributions of sample invitations, local by-laws, visuals, activities, ceremonies, etc., may be sent to the address below.

An SHF brochure would be used to promote Société Honoraire to potential sponsors of chapters, to inform students and parents, and to serve as a vehicle for general publicity. Sponsors evaluated three samples and made suggestions for changes and additions.

Avenues for publicity were discussed in light of our goal of 2000 active chapters in 2000. It was suggested that we submit an article to the AATF National Bulletin, encourage networking between active sponsors and potential/new sponsors, and that we work toward a web site linked to AATF.

Concerns were expressed about the effects of block scheduling in situations where contined study is required for continued student membership. Questions have also arisen concerning initial eligibility (grades, exchange students, lack of current enrollment due to the block at the time of chapter induction), continued enrollment, membership (grades, continued conduct), and the requirement of service projects. Adjustments will need to be made in by-laws so that requirements responsibilities are clearly stated.

Samples of T-shirts and a new blue/white/red braided cord were on display. The latter is appropriate for wear at induction and/or graduation. Information about ordering may be found elsewhere in this issue.

Plans are underway for a birthday celebration breakfast in Paris. Join us for input into decisions which will affect our next half century of service.

SHF members at West Seneca West HS (NY) are expected to serve on one of their five committees: eligibility for new members, activities, sales, induction of new members and service records of current members. Students must also serve as tutors or French teacher's aids for 8 sessions each semester.

A postcard competition to celebrate la Francophonie (prize to the student collecting the most postcards from French-speaking countries) was held at Atlantic HS (FL).

French-3-and-above students served as monitors and judges for French 1 and 2 students in the Grand Prix de Mesa, including participants from Mountain View HS (AZ) competing in listening, reading, writing and speaking contests.

Members at Paraclete HS (CA) produced a video, in French, advertising French products.

- · Applicant must be registered or able to register in a program approved by the SHF sponsor. Although independent travel is discouraged, exceptions will be made if applicant and the sponsor provide a detailed program of

study/travel and justification.

- Applicant must be a member of the SHF by the application deadline, currently studying French, and possess a good knowledge of the language.
- ·Only applications which are complete will be reviewed. The sponsor must mail the following items in one envelope:
- © completed application, including hand-written essay.
- ② transcript
- Two letters of recommendation, one from his/her current French teacher, the second by another faculty member of the school he/she is now attending,
- a program prospectus or sponsor's justification

#### La Course du flambeau

The group forms a circle, an old member next to a new one. Each new member is then introduced to the organization. In order to familiarize new members with the purposes and duties of the Société Honoraire de Français, membership requirements drawn from the Constitution are read. This is followed by a report of the activities of the chapter. Then the ceremony, La Course du flambeau, takes place. The following passages are read, first in English, then in French.

"The transmission or handing on of the torch is a ceremony which used to take place in Ancient Greece. For this solemn occasion the citizens lined up at equal distances one from the other, forming a sort of chain. The first one in line lighted the torch at the altar, ran to transmit it to a second, who transmitted it to a third, thus from hand to hand, each citizen ran without a backward glance, keeping alive the flame which he was to hand to another. Plato recognized in this running with a torch the image of the succeeding generations of life."

We who shall be leaving you in a few months transmit to you the torch of our enthusiasm and out motto: "L'homme qui sait deux langues en vaut deux!"

"La course du Flambeau est une cérémonie qui avait lieu à Athènes dans la Grèce antique. Pour cette solemnité, des citoyens s'espaçaient formant une sorte de chaîne. Le premier allumait un flambeau à l'autel, courait le transmettre à un second, qui le transmettait à un troislème, et ainsi de main en main, chaque citoyen courait, sans regarder en arrière, préservant la flamme qu'il allait remettre à un autre. Platon a reconnu dans cette Course du flambeau l'image des générations de la vie."

A lighted candle is then passed around the circle, and as it goes from hand to hand, the motto is repeated by each member. The ceremony may then be continued as the chapter desires, perhaps with a talk by the principal or some invited guest, or a few words from the sponsor or a chapter officer. the *Marseillaise* or another representative French song is sung.

#### Initiation ceremony cont'd

Alternate pledge:

"Par ce flambeau, symbole du transfert des Connaissances, je m' engage à continuer sans relâche mes efforts pour m' instruire et transmettre aux futures générations mon amour pour la langue et la culture française."

Alternate initiation ceremony:

Two podiums are separated by a table on which have been placed a membership book, the SHF charter, and a large host candle. The president stands behind the right podium, and the vicepresident behind the left. Initiates stand outside the auditorium during opening greetings and a description of the Society. Upon a signal, they enter and sit in the first two rows. President and Vice-president read the description of the ceremony in French and English. As each student's name is called by the president, he/she lights a small votive candle (previously distributed with paper candle holders to initiates), signs the membership book, and then walks to the left where the vice-president awards the membership certificate. They walk behind the officers to wait until everyone has been called. They all recite the pledge after the president, blow out their candles. Closing announcements and congratulations follow.
