#### **REQUIREMENTS for the FIES COMMISSION POSTER CONTEST:**

- Entries for traditional art posters **MUST** be completed on 12x18 inch paper and may be done in crayon, pen and ink, watercolors, pastels, and/or magic marker. The captions may be in French or English.
- Digital Art submissions **MUST** be one page only (no larger than 12X18). The captions may be in French or English.
- The theme in words must appear on all poster submissions (French or English)!
- Grade categories are K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-8.
- There will be traditional art and digital art sub-categories for each grade category.
- The sponsoring teachers MUST be current members of AATF.
- Each poster submission **MUST** be accompanied by the following information:

- Each teacher should save the posters as PDFs and email EACH poster in a separate email by March 29, 2024 to kkcdanser@verizon.net.

Winners will be notified in early May.

The first-place winners in each category will receive a cash prize from the national office.

Winners in second and third place will receive gifts from the national office.

All place winners will receive electronic certificates from the contest chair.

Electronic certificates of participation will be sent to all students from the contest chair too.
