MIDTOWN & SILER-RUFINA DISTRICTS

Home to the internationally acclaimed Meow Wolf immersive arts collective and its House of Eternal Return permanent exhibit, the areas around Siler, Rufina, St. Michael's, Second, and Baca streets hold an emerging art market and are home to art studios, performance spaces, and other creative endeavors. Small, informal galleries are popping up in this once-industrial area, and Baca Street is home to workshops and studios where you can find the proprietor creating a painting or blowing glass.

SANTA FE PLAZA

The Santa Fe Plaza has been the heart of Santa Fe for over 400 years. Native American artisans sell their handcrafted jewelry under the portal of the Palace of the Governors Museum. In addition to award-winning hotels, fabulous restaurants, and unique shopping, other gems to be uncovered include the New Mexico History Museum, New Mexico Museum of Art, Georgia O'Keeffe Museum, Loretto Chapel, Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis Assisi, and the oldest church in the United States, the San Miguel Mission.

THE RAILYARD

Once a stop along the famed Santa Fe Railroad, the Railyard is an eclectic and contemporary collection of boutique hotels, micro-breweries, the Santa Fe Farmer's Market, SITE Santa Fe, El Museo Cultural de Santa Fe, and the Vladem Contemporary Art Museum, projected to open in 2021. The Railyard showcases some of the city's best contemporary visual and performing arts and shopping.





MUSEUM HILL

Set in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains, Museum Hill is a short car or free shuttle ride from the Santa Fe Plaza. Home to four marquee museums: Museum of Indian Arts and Culture, Wheel-wright Museum of the American Indian, Museum of Spanish Colonial Arts, and Museum of International Folk Art.

CANYON ROAD

One of Santa Fe's oldest roads, Canyon Road is a pure delight to the senses. Many of the beautiful old adobe homes are now galleries, while others continue to house Santa Fe families who have lived here for generations. Inviting gardens, award-winning fine-dining, monumental bronze sculptures, custom jewelry, and paintings from contemporary to traditional to Western are among the treasures you'll uncover on Santa Fe's historic eastside.



SANTA FE MARGARITA TRAIL

Over 40 uniquely crafted margaritas – only on the Santa Fe Margarita Trail. You're guaranteed to Uncover Your Different and find several favorites on the trail. As if a delicious margarita isn't enough, each margarita earns a stamp in your Margarita Trail Passport, which may be redeemed for prizes and induction into the Margarita Trail Society.
