Replacing the locally owned structure carrying North Gallatin Avenue over Redstone Creek in the City of Uniontown. The District plans to use an innovative prefabricated CIP T-beam system for this bridge.

NATIONAL PIKE TUNNEL REHABILITATION

The project is the rehabilitation of a Pre-Civil War railroad tunnel along an abandoned CSX rail line. The tunnel will eventually be used for a section of the National Pike Trail. The proposed rehabilitation efforts primarily include masonry and drainage items.







FOURTH STREET BRIDGE



Replacement of the structure carrying SR 7421 (Fourth Street) over Norfolk Southern Railroad in North Irwin Borough.









PA 18/PA 21 IMPROVEMENTS



This project (aka West Waynesburg turn lane) will install a two-way left turn lane in a corridor that is currently a two-lane, two-way roadway with many driveways and intersections in Franklin Township. It currently lacks proper refuge for vehicles waiting to make left turns.

LVTIP: PLEASANT UNITY TO AIRPORT

This project extends about 2.5 miles along Hill Churches Road / Bell Memorial Church Road (Route 2023), from the Bingham Road intersection in Mount Pleasant Township, northward to Route 981 at Airport Road in Unity Township.





Improvements

- Two twelve-foot travel lanes and eight-foot shoulders on each side of the roadway
- 45-mile-per-hour speed limit
- include: Improved curves and grades
 - Three new roundabout intersections at
 - Bell Memorial Church Road (Route 2023) @ Route 130 0
 - New Route 981 @ Bell Memorial Church Road (Route 2023) near Green Street Ο
 - Route 981 @ relocated Airport Road



US 119 MCCLURE & KINGVIEW ROAD INERCHANGE

This project will reconstruct US 119 from the approach to Kingview Road to the Westmoreland County line. The Kingview and McClure Road Intersections will be eliminated by constructing a new bridge to be known as Connector Road over US 119 that will connect Mount Pleasant Road to Kendi Road.

- Kendi Road will be reconstructed and extended on the Western side of US 119 and utilized as an • interconnecting road to the eliminated intersections.
 - Kendi Road will remain a locally owned and maintained road 0
- Mount Pleasant Road on the Eastern side of US 119 will be resurfaced and will adjoin with the new Connector Road via a 3 leg Roundabout.
- The intersection of Mount Pleasant Road and Prittstown Road will be upgraded to improve sight distance.
- Crossroads Road will be rehabilitated and will be converted to a one way right in from US 119N. •
- There will be on and off ramps at the interchange of US 119N and Connector Road. •
- McClure Road will be a right in right out on both sides of US 119.







LAYTON BRIDGE





The Layton Bridge project includes the structure carrying Route 4038 (Layton Road) over the Youghiogheny River and River Trail, a smaller structure over Washington Run, a small bridge preservation, roadway realignment, and overlay from Route 51 to the tracks in Layton.

The District is working aggressively to let this project this year while continuing to perform significant work to keep the current structure open.
