
WHAT IS THE INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS DERBY?

CAR SPECIFICATIONS

CAR BODY

- 1. The main body structure must be made from wood.
- 2. Measurements:
 - a. Total Car Height: Not to exceed 3 inches.
 - b. Total Car Length: Not to exceed 7 inches.
 - c. Total Car Width: Not to exceed 2 ¾ inches.
 - d. Total Car Weight: Not to exceed 5.00 ounces. The official race scale shall be considered final.
 - e. Wheel base: Any as long as wheels do not exceed the 7" total length requirement.
 - f. The car must have 1 ¾" clearance between the wheels.
 - g. The car must have 3/8" clearance underneath the body.
 - h. The front end must be at least ½" wide in the middle.
- 3. No part of the car may extend beyond the starting peg.
- 4. The wheels may not extend beyond the rear of the car.

AXLES

- 1. 4 axles and wheels must be installed to the side of the car body directly across from one another / no more than a 45-degree angle. Rear wheels cannot be reversed.
- 2. Minimum diameter 0.084.
- 3. Axles must have a nail head.
- 4. Lubrication: only dry lubrication will be allowed.

WHEELS

- 1. May be BSA, Maximum Velocity, Awana, or Pinecar.
- 2. May be CnCed, lathed, polished, and/or sanded to true the edge of tread, surface, and circumference.
- 3. The tread / contact surface must remain flat and parallel to the bore as humanly possible.
- 4. No Angling, Reshaping, Canting, Round Crowning, Tapering, H-ing, V-ing, Dishing the outside of the wheels and/or tread surface.
- 5. Lettering must remain visible on the inside and outside of the wheel. In the case of a wheel that has no lettering on the outside the original shape must remain. A wheel cannot be machined flat on the outside sidewall.
- 6. Wheel covers may be used only if entire wheel is visible.
- 7. 7.50 mm Minimum Tread Width.
- 8. Wheels have no weight restriction as long as they meet the above requirements.

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED: Springs; starting devices or propellants; liquid, wet paint, oil, sticky substances, or powders other than axle lubrication; glass or excessively fragile parts; wheel bearings; or loose material of any kind (such as lead shot).

RULES

DECISIONS OF THE RACE OFFICIALS ARE FINAL.

REGISTRATION

- Proceeds go to ACEC-SC Infrastructure Works Institute
- Race entry is included with each sponsorship and exhibit purchase.
- Additional entries (team or individual) are \$75.00 each and are tax deductible.
- One car building kit will be provided with each registration.

- Participants may purchase (at their own expense) alternative pinewood blocks, axles, wheels, and other accessories, provided they meet race specifications.
- Participants do not have to be present to race. See Race Rules for more information.
- Limited "rentals" will be available the day of for racing in support of the ELB.

RACE RULES

- Check-in: begins at 7:30AM
 - • Cars must be checked in by 10:30AM.
- Inspections: All cars must pass inspection
 - Cars will be inspected by a race official for compliance with Car Specifications.
 - After cars are inspected, they will be moved to the "pit area" and may not be touched except to race.
 - Cars that do not pass initial inspection will be given 30 minutes to make modifications and have the car reinspected.
 - During the race, cars will only be handled by a race official.
 - Lubrication of wheels and axles may take place prior to check-in and prior to the final race.

Racing

- Ladder less elimination system will be utilized.
- Cars will be assigned points based on finishes in each heat.
- On race day, a point total will be established (based on number of entries.) Once a car reaches a maximum point total, it will be eliminated.
- Heat races will continue to be run until a group of finalists is established. The final races will be run at the end of the event.
- o Prior to the final race, finalists will be allowed to re-lubricate; no other modifications will be allowed.

PRIZES

- Prizes will be award for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd fastest cars, as well as for the slowest car and a "fan favorite" car based on voting by conference attendees.
- Participants do not need to be present to win.
- The fastest <u>car</u> may represent ACEC-SC at the ACEC National Derby in Phoenix, AZ in October 2026.

 **ACEC-SC will take the car and enter it. Should you choose to attend, attendance and travel is the winner's responsibility.
