## American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina Board of Directors Meeting December 6, 2018 Parrish & Partners, Columbia, SC

<u>Call to Order:</u> ACEC-SC Chair, Cameron Nations, PE, called the meeting to order at 10:05 am. The following were in attendance: Keith Overstreet, PE; Jeff Mulliken, PhD, PE; Kevin Shoemake, PE; Kylie Page, PE; Petrina Butler, PE; Rick Fauteux, PE; Jason Eppley, PE, Adam Jones and Elaine Mikell. On conference call were: Chuck Black, PE; and Jerry Carter, PE.

<u>Consent Agenda:</u> Motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the November 1, 2018, Board of Director's meeting minutes.

The following firms were confirmed for membership.

- Alfred Benesch & Company (sponsored by Rick Fauteux, HDR)
- Gannett Flemming (sponsored by Chuck Black, S&ME)
- Subsurface Utility Solutions (Affiliate Member)

Executive Director Adam Jones said GHD would like to become a member. GHD is a member of ACEC national. They were recruited in New York but want to join in every state where they have offices. They are working on an office in Charleston. They pay national dues directly every year. The vote for GHD will be at the next Board meeting once an application has been received.

Jones said those that have not paid their dues thus far have been notified and have assured us the check is in the mail.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Secretary/Treasurer Jason Eppley reported on the Financial Statement.

- Year to date income is \$346,884.63, expenses of \$148,885.20, net income of \$197,699.43.
- Motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the financial report as given.
- There will be more expenses that are associated with the ACEC-SC/SCDOT Annual meeting as well as more income from the event. There was a discussion of upcoming expenses as part of the conference and what additional income was outstanding.

### **Chairman's Report (Cameron Nations):**

Strategic Plan Progress

- Grow/Diversify Membership-Chair Kevin Shoemake
  - One action item was to assemble managed company data of graphs/spreadsheets containing company names, contact names and addresses.
  - o Membership in ACEC-SC is only 78 firms out of a total of 766 statewide.
  - Set a goal of new members each year of at least 5.
  - o In the process of reviewing recruitment materials.

### Two action Items

• Shoemake will send the list of potential members to the Board members.

- Jones is to send the Board the promotional materials that are normally sent to potential members.
- Grow the Brand-Co-Chairs Kylie Page/Keith Overstreet:
  - Working on transparency of the nominating process
  - Sending to the Board for review a procedure documenting what is already outlined in the ByLaws.
  - Bylaws state the nomination process begins after January 2.
  - Working on the way nominations are accepted, the process and where submissions should be made.
  - o The nomination process will begin with the next Board meeting.
  - Invite new members to the Board Retreat in March and announce at every Board meeting and committee meeting that nominations are being accepted.
  - Hold a membership meeting breakfast prior to the start of the Board meeting at the Board retreat.
  - Overstreet said that work on the communication piece has moved to the Communication Committee (Ricky Ward).
  - Overstreet reported that ACEC said ACEC-SC may use the webservice. Executive Director Jones will speak with Ricky Ward on web service.
  - Revamp ACEC-SC website since ACEC has a platform, improve the website by using ACEC national as much as possible.
  - Jones said there was a totally revamped website for the ACEC-SC/SCDOT Annual Meeting, Tuesday, December 4.
  - o Jones said the cost now is \$100.00 a month but at \$1200.00 this is not excessive.
  - Working on having information on the website to push alerts.
- Legislative influence-Co-Chairs Adam Jones/Matt Gehman
  - o Jones said there will be legislative sessions at the winter meeting, Earl Hunter to speak.
  - Legislators were invited to the ACEC-SC/SCDOT Annual Meeting on Tuesday.
- Engage and Energize Membership-Chair Adam Jones
  - o Jones working on a training program for new Board members.
  - There will be a social media training session at the Winter meeting.
  - Working on energizing the new generation with social media, ie: Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn.
  - Mulliken attended the Georgia conference where prizes were awarded for those participating in social media during the event. This got people engaged while attending the sessions.
  - Organize a social media committee. Fauteux suggested we reach out to Theresa McClure, who is handing the silent auction, about talking to the Board about social media.
  - Jones said there is a white paper from ACEC concerning social media.

- ACEC Leadership Orientation in Washington was informative and a wonderful opportunity to meet the ACEC staff.
  - President Nations thanked Jones for showing him around DC.
  - Nations said money is in the budget for the Board to attend, ACEC pays for the hotel room and meals.
  - Nations said meeting Linda Darr and learning of her new iniatives was informative.
  - o They attended a dinner with other MOs and ACEC leadership.
  - During orientation they spoke about the strategic plan and how the member states can revamp theirs.
  - Items that were discussed were Governmental Affairs, Publication links for the websites, contract documents, industry briefs, PAC, communications, finances, administration, association legal issues, the annual meeting and the Engineering Excellence Awards.
  - o They met the new Membership Director, Daphne Bryant.
  - He encouraged everyone to attend the orientation.

### **Executive Directors Report (Adam Jones):**

- Legislatively things are starting to pick up.
  - Representative Brian White will no longer be chair of the House Ways and Means
     Committee. The Republican Caucus didn't think he was towing the party line so he was
     relieved of his position. This is one of the highest positions in the House since it is
     basically the gatekeeper of the budget.
  - o Representative White will not be on the Ways and Means committee next year.
  - He was moved to the House LCI committee but will have no seniority on the committee.
  - ACEC-SC will be working with Representative White even more since most of our work is with LCI.
  - Representative Murrell Smith, Sumter, was elected Chair of Ways and Means
     Committee with Gilda Cobb Hunter, Orangeburg, elected as first Vice Chair and
     Representative Gary Simrill, Rock Hill elected as second Vice Chair.
  - There will be new committee members with newly elected Representatives.
  - Representative Russell Ott, Calhoun County, who has always been an ally is now on the LCI Committee, which could be either good or bad. He led the right against the Plastic Pipe Bill.
  - Most members of the LCI get in-line with Chairman Sandifer, or they end up on another committee.
  - Representative Ott has challenged Sandifer before on the House floor, so hopefully that does not change.
- Legislation that ACEC-SC will be working on this year.
  - A large Tort package passed in 2005, but the trial lawyers were able to slip in language to our joint and several liability law that was considered okay at the time. As the years have passed, it has been realized as quite awful. It was disputed and went all the way to the State Supreme Court, but they ruled that the language was ok.

- The problem is it allows the plaintiff to choose who they want to bring a lawsuit against when there is more than one party involved. The plaintiff can settle out of court with the person who has the least insurance and then go after whoever has the better insurance. The jury will never hear that they settled with the other party due to this language and the "empty seat" defense.
- The effects engineers because if one of you or your employees is driving a company vehicle, that means you could end up being responsible for 100% of the damages even if you are only partially at fault.
- The South Carolina Civil Justice Coalition, which ACEC-SC are members, will be leading
  the fight but we will be lobbying for passage of new Joint & Several Liability language as
  well. SCCJC is working with the one former justice that voted against the decision the
  SC Supreme Court issued.
- According to the SC Home Builders Lobbyist, they will be re-introducing the Building Code Adoption Bill.
- o Jones is certain the Plastic Pipe Bill will be back in January.
- Monday, December 10-12, Jones will be attending the SC Business Lobbyist Round table to hear what other legislation will be coming this year. This is a group made up of probusiness lobbyist. No contract lobbyist will be there. He will report on this in January.
- Jones attended the National Association of Engineering Council Executive Meeting last week,
   November 28-December 2.
  - There were over 30 ACEC Executive Directors that met to hear more about the ACEC
     Trust
  - They talked more to new CEO Linda Darr, and VP Daphne Bryant to discuss ACEC National.
  - After meeting the ACEC national staff, Jones feels ACEC-SC is on the right track.
  - ACEC wants to get all 500 of the ENR 500 as members. There are 59 that are not members. They asked each MO to recommend one person from each state to help recruit these firms in each state. Without volunteers, Jones will approach Peter Strub about it since he knows the value proposition.
  - ACEC is working on a new Strategic Plan. Once it comes out in April, we may want to relook at our Strategic plan and make tweaks to mirror national.
  - We also discussed a commission plan for MOs for bringing in new members. There was
    A LOT of discussion on this, but nothing finalized. NAECE will continue to work with
    ACEC and hopefully have something deliverable by the meeting in May.
  - Jones heard from other MOs around the country and what they are facing in the legislature.
    - Several states said they have heard that bills are going to be introduced in their states to get rid of licensure.
    - Some for all licensees and some for PEs.
    - This is being led by Tea Party folks in their states.
    - A couple states have had QBS battles. In Utah, they've got a bill that will charge sales tax on all services. Jones said this concerns him because there is an ad hoc tax committee in SC that is looking into this idea now.

- Jones will monitor these states to see if any of these bills gain traction.
- ACEC-SC /SCDOT Annual Meeting
  - On Tuesday, December 4, we had our largest ACEC-SC/SCDOT Annual meeting to date with 587 attendees, speakers, exhibitors, and sponsors in attendance.
  - We had 43 sponsors, 42 of them exhibited also.
  - We also received close to 200 toys for Toys for Tots, so that is pretty good.
  - He cannot tell how the expenses and income will line up yet. We did spend a good bit more money this year, but hopefully we'll still make a large profit.
- While at the meeting, three-member firms approached Jones about getting SCDOT work.
  - Two firms feel like the size of their firm was a disadvantage.
  - Two firms said they feel like the same firms are getting the work.
  - o Jones said told them he would put this topic on the agenda for the Board to discuss.
  - O Board said this was a QBS issue. The key for these firms is to differentiate themselves from each other. Right now, if a firm does not have recent evaluations, they only go by references. The SCDOT is looking at scoring. What percentage should be on proposal as this is the most subjective part of the proposals. Everyone should be open and honest. Maybe another opportunity is through the Transportation Committee. The SCDOT is feeling pressure about spreading the work out, their mandate is to QBS. Everything goes strictly by proposal. CE&I is similar and the same. They are calling references.
  - The SCDOT's new motto is making selections analytically, not politically.
- The ACEC-SC Environmental Committee is working on the track for the ACEC-SC/SCSPE Winter Meeting. We're trying to have a call on December 14<sup>th</sup> with ACEC's Environmental head Lynn Schlosser. Possible topics are how engineers deal with the extreme weather and a social media topic.
- The SCSPE Business track has the following topics lined up.
  - Licensing Issues in the Design Build Construction Management Era Jay Mathews, JD
  - o Ethics for Design Professionals Dr. Dennis Fallon
  - o Joint & Several Liability & Legislative Update With Earl Hunter SCCJC and Adam B. Jones
  - Marketing for Design Professionals Pecan Marketing
- Reg Christopher will present the Keynote address on leadership.

### **ACEC National Director's Report (Rick Fauteux):**

- Fauteux told the Board Linda Darr has a new cabinet in place.
- Engineering Excellence Awards projects are due to national by January 4.
- PAC is over 1.8 million.
- The slate of ACEC officers for national is in the Board packet.
- Motion was made to select those names on the ballot, seconded and passed.

- Fauteux will submit the Board's vote for the four individuals shown on the ballot.
- The Annual Convention will be May 5-8, Washington, DC. Fauteux reminded everyone to bring someone new.
- Fauteux is finishing up the term as National Director, but will not run for re-election, but will continue to participate. The position will be open.

### **Committee Reports:**

- Transportation Committee (Chair Emily Swearingen)
  - o Emily Swearingen was not in attendance so Adam Jones reported on her behalf
  - Design Build recommendations will be presented to Chris Gaskins, they are changing how they handle IMR as there are items of concern.
  - Partnering Committee meeting minutes are being sent to John Boylston for approval before being sent to everyone.
  - New members have been selected to the Transportation Subcommittees and will be notified this week.
  - Transition meeting scheduled for December 12, for the transition from Swearingen to Melvin Williams.
  - Working on a calendar of all possible meetings for the whole year to avoid conflicts with other events/meetings.
- Environmental Committee (Chair Overstreet)
  - Working on the Environmental Track of the ACEC-SC/SCSPE Winter meeting in February.
- BRE Committee (Chair Black)
  - Will begin working on scholarships and the Future Leaders program after the first of the year.
- Communications Committee (Ricky Ward)
  - Not in attendance, nothing to report.
- Membership Committee (Shoemake)
  - Nothing new to report that was not touched on earlier.
- Advocacy/PAC (Gehman/Williams)
  - o Gehman told everyone about the oyster roast/silent auction.
  - o In the packets is a save the date card and a solicitation letter for donations.
  - Working on pricing for the event.
  - Discussed having a bowling tournament as another way to make money regionally.
  - o Jones reminded the Board about the Legislative Reception, January 29, 2019.
  - o Jones will have talking points with the legislators for the event.
- Engineering Excellence Awards Gala (Caleb Pozsik)
  - Everything except emcee is set, still working on emcee.
  - o Judging will be Friday, December 14 at the ACEC-SC office.

- National PAC Report (Jerry Carter)
  - o Carter gave the report over the phone.
  - o Made the goal 21.5% over the goal amount.
  - o ACEC is 85% of the goal for this year, \$161,000.00 from goal.
  - o This is the final report from Carter.
  - With Board approval, Kylie Page will be the new PAC chair.
  - o Page was nominated, a motion was made, seconded and passed as the new PAC chair.

Respectfully submitted by, Elaine Mikell Associate Good morning. I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and a Happy New Year. With the New Year, ACEC-SC kicks in to overdrive.

The minutes from our last Board of Directors Meeting are attached. I've also attached the Financial Statement that was generated 1/2/19. ACEC-SC is tracking well. We have an income of \$379.664.44 vs. Expenses of \$206,421.46 for a net income of \$173,242.98. We are still getting some income from the ACEC-SC /SCDOT meeting as well as waiting for the final bill from the IT Company. We will be getting income from the Winter Meeting starting this week. We will also start seeing some in come from the upcoming ACEC-SC PAC Silent Auction, but that will be passed through to the PAC account. ACEC-SC Current assets are \$497,695.88 vs Liabilities and Equity of the same amount. ACEC-SC is strong financially. One thing to note, we did get a commission check from the ACEC-SC Business Insurance Trust. Though the check was for \$1,000.00 we allocated the price of an affiliate membership from that money as that is how the BIT asked to pay their dues.

The legislature returns next Tuesday. As bills have been prefilled I have started reading. There are bills dealing with dams introduced (which I was expecting due to lack of passage in the last session,) a bill dealing with the Secretary of Transportation appointed by the Governor and devolving the duties of the commission, as well as a couple other bills I've started tracking. Click here to see a list of the prefiled legislation I've already started tracking.

We know we will see the PVC Pipe Preference Bill in some form again this year. This bill will get harder and harder to defend as they see how we, the engineers work against it, they will try to craft language that takes away our argument. The lobbyist for the rural water association and the water quality association and SC Water Works Association retired at the end of last year's session. They have hired a familiar face though. Earl Hunter, former head of DHEC and Executive Director of the South Carolina Coalition for Lawsuit Reform (formerly SCCJC), who works out of JMA's office and is a friend. Hunter and I have already met several times on how we have worked against the PVC pipe preference legislation the past 5 years.

These same water groups also hired Hunter to work with SCDOT on the utility relocation bill that stalled last year. This is another bill we will follow and if and when SCDOT and the water groups need our help we will lobby for it.

ACEC-SC will be working with Hunter and the SC Coalition for Lawsuit Reform (SCCLR) on legislation dealing with Joint & Several Liability laws. SCCLR will take the lead on this bill, but we will lobby for it as well. We are currently working on a 90 second explainer video on why this bill is needed. Once finished we will send it to all of the members of SCCLR (which ACEC-SC is) as well as the legislature, media, etc.

We are expecting to see the adoption of building codes bill come back this year. I've spoken to members of the lobbying coalition that worked against this last year and we are all ready to figh this bill again this year.

I will update the list of bills we are tracking weekly and send it out with my weekly newsletters.

Our legislative reception is January 28, 2019 at the Palmetto Club from 5 – 7:00 PM. Please take the time to personally invite your Representative and Senator. We have mailed invitations, will start emailing them, and put them on the legislator's desk the week after next, but a personal invite from a constituent goes a long way.

EEA judging happened in mid-December. All of the ACEC National Finalist have been informed, and we are in the process of letting the other winners know now. The Gala is February 6, 2019 at the USC Alumni Center. Former Carolina Gamecock Quarterback, and current announcer, Todd Ellis, JD, will be our emcee for the gala. Please mark your calendars and plan on attending.

We have finalized the agenda for the ACEC-SC / SCSPE Winter Meeting on February 12, 2019 at Seawells in Columbia, SC except for one spot. We have a great Business & Environmental track set up. We will be having a special guest from ACEC-NY who will be speaking on how climate change will impact design in the future. This will not be dealing with who's causing it, the politics, or anything like that but specifically how engineers will adapt their designs. Click here to see the agenda.

We're finalizing the ACEC-SC PAC Silent Auction and Oyster Roast on February 28, 2019 in Charleston. To keep the price for admission low, Elaine is targeting Board Members and members in the Charleston area to see if they want to sponsor the event. If you are interested please contact Elaine.

We're gearing up for the Retreat in mid March. The retreat will kick off with a Membership Meeting at the Westin Poinsett. I've invited the trust to come and give a presentation at the Membership meeting. We will also carve out a portion of the Board meeting that day so the Board Members can hear a little more about the trusts. ACEC sees this as a major ROI to its members, and I think it is important for all of our Board Members to know about the trust even if their firms do not use them. Everyone may learn something that can help their bottom line. I will be contacting Keith soon to see what else he would like to focus on at the retreat.

The ACEC-SC Nominating Committee was officially activated in December. I will put a solicitation for nomination to the Board of Directors in my next Friday newsletter.

The SC Engineering Conference & Trade Show has not received many speaker nominations this year. We will need ACEC-SC's help in getting the tracks together for the meeting. The SC Engineering Conference & Trade Show is asking ACEC-SC to help fill the Transportation track and general business tracks.

Our next Board of Directors Meeting is Thursday February 7, 2019. Feel free to come up for the EEA Gala and spend the evening.

## 2019 Design Construction Partnership Legislative Issues















### 2019 Design Construction Partnership Legislative Issues

The architectural, contracting, engineering and surveying communities are interested in numerous issues relating to business as well as the health, safety and welfare of our citizens. The following issues are important during this legislative session.

### ACTIVE ISSUES

- S. 217 helps ebb floodwaters in South Carolina by allowing a local sales tax to be used for floodwater mitigation. This bill was given a favorable report from the Senate Finance Committee and is headed to the Senate floor for a vote. AIA-SC supports this legislation.
- S. 259, the SC Resilience Revolving Fund Act, helps homeowners take advantage of FEMA buy-out programs of their flood-prone property by establishing a state fund that offers low-interest loans to meet a 25% required match of federal money. This bill currently resides in the Senate Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources. AIA-SC supports this legislation.
- S. 266 helps our architects, engineers, and surveyors who volunteer in the SC State Guard relating to deductions from individual taxable income for State Guard members who complete a minimum of 192 hours of training or drill each year. This service would qualify for the deduction. It also gives legal assistance service for guard members and immediate family members to authorize SC State Guard Judge Advocates to provide these services and include them within the personal liability exemption. This bill relates to the Governor's authority to call the State Guard into duty and clarifies the circumstances under which the governor can call the State Guard into service. It also changes a section relating to pay of State Guard members on active duty to provide that State Guard members may receive a daily stipend or per diem pay for reasonable expenses or both if approved by the Adjutant General. Engineers, Surveyors and Architects all support this legislation.
- S. 401 is a bill dealing with relocating water and sewer utility lines relating to the state highway system. It provides help to utilities moving water and sewer lines due to a transportation improvement project. The bill provides that an entity undertaking a transportation improvement project shall bear the cost related to the relocation of the water and sewer lines provided that requirements for utilities are eligible for relocation and meet necessary terms. CAGC and the Engineers support this legislation.
- H. 3758 Tort Reform. This legislation which is called the "Fair Share Bill" is spearheaded by the SC Coalition for Lawsuit Reform. The Design Construction Partnership and SCCLR see the need for reform of South Carolina's current Joint & Several Liability Law, which H. 3758 accomplishes. Architects, Contractors, Engineers and Surveyors will be working with the Coalition to pass this bill and other tort related legislation.

CAGC is primarily focused on workforce related issues this year, from creating ways to offer more CDL training at our Technical Colleges to obtaining funding for a mobile workshop similar to the "Be Pro Be Proud" initiative in Arkansas. We will also be closely monitoring and will weigh in as needed on legislation related to dams/flooding, legal reform such as joint and several liability, education overhauls, and reforms to the state tax system.

Work Force Funding is included in the Governor's proposed 2019 state budget. If incorporated in the state budget, funds would go to a Skilled-Trade Workforce Development Initiative which would be used to build and deploy a mobile skilled jobs workshop to promote careers in skilled trades. The mobile workshop (which would be a "tricked-out" 18-wheeler) would be bolstered by an interactive website and social media marketing. Emphasis would be placed on careers such as: construction; agriculture/natural resources/forestry; technology services; and transportation and heavy equipment. Carolinas AGC is actively working to get this in the state budget.

Last year a bill surfaced that made changes to the S.C. Building Code dealing with the Building Code Council's procedures, committee seating, and extends the time the Code may be updated and adopted by the State. The design and construction community oppose this legislation. These organizations believe the bill is not good for the industry or the citizens of our state. The bill was filed at the request of the Home Builders Association of South Carolina. We understand this bill may be introduced again this year. The Design Construction Partnership opposes this Legislation.

An issue that has come to our state for the past three legislative sessions is commonly known as the "PVC Plastic Pipe Preference Bill" and we expect to see it again this year. This bill will impose unnecessary obligations and/or will thwart engineers for public utilities from exercising their best judgment about piping material for public projects out of concern they will run afoul of the preference the bill establishes for plastic pipes. The Engineering community opposes this legislation along with the SC Water Quality Council, the SC Rural Water Association, the SC Water Quality Association and the SC Association of Counties.

### OTHER IMPORTANT LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

School Safety & Security — AIA-SC supports the SC Department of Education in developing school design policies that make schools safer while building positive, nurturing learning environments for South Carolina's children.

State Resilience Plan - As South Carolina faces increased impacts from extreme weather events such as flooding and high-wind damage, a comprehensive plan to strengthen the resilience of communities and of statewide systems and infrastructure is more important than ever. AIA-SC and the engineers support the development of a State Resilience Plan that convenes local and private interests and pools the resources and expertise of our state agencies in natural resources, commerce, emergency management, housing and urban development, agriculture, and transportation.

Engineer and Surveyor Regulations — After the Engineers' and Surveyors' Practice Act was updated in 2016, these professions' state regulations must be updated to conform with the changes in the Practice Act. These regulations may be submitted this legislative session. Engineers and Surveyors are working with the Registration Board on these changes and expect to be able to support them when they are presented to the legislature.

Design-Build and Public-Private Partnerships (P3) Construction Contracts - The design-build integrated approach to project delivery can improve collaboration among design professionals, builders, and owners and result in quality, cost-effective buildings. Partnerships with private developers may offer an effective financial mechanism for governmental entities to secure public buildings to satisfy critical public needs that cannot otherwise be met. The Design Construction Partnership supports legislation that allows for the utilization of the design-build method or P3 construction contracts on certain state construction projects, provided that these contracts are based on selection criteria that include qualifications and experience.

Procurement of Public Work through Direct Negotiations - Professional Engineers and Surveyors continue to support the adoption of procurement of public work through direct negotiations. This process has been the law for federal and state procurement of professional services for decades. Professional Engineers and Surveyors believe this procurement method should be used by all political subdivisions.

Brokering Professional Services - Professional Engineers and Surveyors believe they should work for the owners of projects. However, there are companies and individuals who are not registered by the state who are brokering engineering and surveying services for owners where the engineer or surveyor has no contact with the actual owner. This practice should not be allowed and needs legislation to address the issue.

Voluntary Adoption of the International Green Construction Code - AIA-SC supports the SC Building Codes Council in promulgating a change in the regulations that would allow local governments the option to adopt the IGCC as an overlay to the other I-Codes. This legislation will provide municipalities with a useable and enforceable framework for sustainable design, and development of safer and more energy-efficient buildings that are less expensive to operate and maintain.

Stock School Plans – The use of standard or "stock" school plans is sometimes seen as a way for communities to save on the cost of building new schools. However, stock plans often don't provide any savings in construction costs since they must be adapted to fit a specific site and to meet local building codes. AIASC strongly opposes the use of state-owned stock school plans and believes in the value of working with architects to ensure school districts are constructing cost-effective, high-performing buildings that enhance the learning environment for public school students in South Carolina.

The following document outlines the procedure for nominating and electing new Board members.

In accordance with the ACEC-SC bylaws, the Board shall consist of at least nine members, three of whom shall be elected each year for three-year terms. It is the intent that continuity of service on the Board be established through staggered terms of service. Board members must be employed by a member firm and no member firm will have more than one representative serving on the board at any one time.

By January 7 of each year, the Chair will appoint three past chairs to serve as the Nominating Committee. This has historically been the immediate past three chairs. The Nominating Committee is responsible for presenting a slate of candidates for Board Membership and Officer Positions to be voted upon at the Annual Membership Meeting.

By February of each year, the executive director will post the open board positions on the ACEC-SC website and the open positions will also be announced at the February Board Meeting. The Nominating Committee will begin accepting recommendations. Employees of member firms should provide names of recommended Board member candidates directly to the email designated in the February announcement. Along with the candidate name and member firm name, the Nominating Committee would also appreciate a brief statement of their current role in their firm and their past involvement with ACEC or other professional organizations. In the absence of provided recommendations, the Nominating Committee may reach out directly to member firms for possible candidates. Recommendations will be accepted up to sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Membership Meeting.

At least thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Membership Meeting, the Nominating Committee shall confirm all nominees' willingness to serve and provide a slate of nominees for the Board to the Chair. The Chair will see that the list of nominees is sent to all members at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Annual Membership Meeting. Publication of the list of nominees will be issued via email, website posting and/or announcement at a Board meeting.

Election of Board members takes place at the Annual Membership Meeting and additional nominees may be brought forward from the floor during the Annual Membership Meeting.
