ACEC-SC Board of Directors Meeting Thursday, April 4, 2019 Parrish & Partner Columbia, SC

<u>Call to order:</u> The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM by Chair Cameron Nations. He took roll with the following in attendance: Chair Cameron Nations, Vice Chair Keith Overstreet, Secretary/Treasurer Jason Eppley, Chuck Black, Petrina Butler, Rick Fauteux, Matt Gehman, Jeff Mulliken, Kylie Page, Kevin Shoemake, Ricky Ward, Melvin Williams, Executive Director Adam B. Jones and staff, Allison King. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the consent agenda previously distributed to attendees.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Secretary Treasurer Jason Eppley presented the financial statements to attendees.

- At the time of the meeting, ACEC-SC records an income of \$455,809.57 vs. Expenses of \$226,021.83 for a net income \$159, 787.64.
- Chuck Black said a discussion was had at the last meeting in regards to payment to ACEC
 national. Adam Jones said the check has not been issued at this time, but will be issued before
 the next meeting.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the financial report.

The next item covered was the 2019-2020 budget. The budget must be presented to the membership at the June meeting. The presentation at the meeting was the first draft and starting point. Adjustments to the budget will be made for the May meeting.

- Jones said he takes a more conservative approach to the budget and explained what each line item on the budget represents. He also said the budget needs to be as close to a "Zero" net as possible. Eppley said anything under \$10,000 is inconsequential.
- Many suggested changes addressed and will be reflected on the second draft of the budget at the next Board of Directors Meeting.

Next, Jones covered Low Risk Investments for ACEC-SC.

- A CD has more return than the money market.
- Rate are not guaranteed for nonprofits and churches.
- Last time it only covered money markets.
- The yield on short term CDs are better.
- Not something to be determined before budget. The budget takes precedence over investing right now.
- Nations would like to have council that has no gain from it to make a recommendation to ACEC-SC.
 - Adam Jones said he will reach out to CPA firm for nonpartisan party for advice on money market of investments.
- Chuck Black asked for the deadline for a decision. Jones said renewals are in August. Committee can meet and make some recommendations.

<u>Chair's Report:</u> Nations chose to forgo the strategic plan because of the retreat and the amount of time spent on the budget.

<u>Vice Chair's Board Retreat Recap:</u> Vice Chair Keith Overstreet, PE provided a brief recap of the retreat.

- All of the tasks have names and dates associated with each item for accountability.
- Adam Jones and Allison King to give notes from the retreat to Overstreet.

Executive Directors Report: Executive Director Adam B. Jones stated he would try to be brief.

- Elaine Mikell is no longer with Jones, McAden & Associates and ACEC-SC.
- JMA will be hiring someone else, but will take our time in selecting the right candidate. Allison King and Michelle McLaurin will be filling in.
- Jones said you should not see a lapse in service.
- The personnel change needed to happen.

Legislative Report

- Jones advised the crossover deadline is next week.
- S.7 Liability Limitations was given third reading. This is a tort bill ACEC-SC is following and
 assisting the South Carolina Coalition for Law suit Reform. It raises the caps to \$1,000,000 for a
 single occurrence and \$2,000,000 total for claims brought against political subdivisions. It also
 indexes it each year. This will lead to more lawsuits, and taxpayers will end up footing the bill
 and this could bankrupt some political subdivisions.
- S.107 the Dams bill, received second reading. It will get a perfunctory third reading April 4, which is good. This bill should move across to the house now.
- S.180 is a bill being monitored as it deals with drones near military installations was given third reading and will now move over to the house.
- Another Tort bill ACEC-SC is opposed to is S. 386, the tort claims act, was recommitted to the Judiciary Committee as it saw some fierce kick back on the Senate floor. This also raises caps for bringing suits against the state.
- S.401 is the water and sewer line relocation bill and has moved to the house and is supposed to be scheduled for a meeting in House Education & Public Works subcommittee on April 23,2019. After the ACEC-SC retreat the SCDOT & Water folks struck a deal and moved it out. Jones spoke to Earl Hunter about it. Hunter said there may be an alternative if this fails, but they were going to try and make S.401/H.3799 move this year, if possible. The bill was amended. Under the bill as amended, water and sewer utilities would be classified as large or small, and reimbursements of costs by SCDOT (or other entity undertaking the project) would be based on the respective classification. All costs would be covered for small utilities, and up to 4.5% of the costs associated with relocation would be covered for large utilities. The bill requires that the relocation must be placed under the general contractor for the project; however, large utilities can opt out but must abide by the construction schedule or forfeit funding. The bill was also amended to include language to grandfather in projects underway, require SCDOT to report on relocation metrics annually, and to sunset the legislation in 2026.
- S.530 the bill dealing with the Procurement Code passed over to the House and was committed to Ways and Means. This bill came from the Office of the State Engineer. Jones read the bill and thinks it is OK for the A/E community.
- S.689 was added to the list after the last ACEC-SC meeting. It has to do with criminal backgrounds in licensure so board have to review what the crime was before denying the license and take in to account if it is pertinent to what they would do with the license. It also allows for

apprenticeship programs in SC for licensure if the feds have an apprentice program. Jones didn't see any apprenticeship programs that would allow licensure for engineers or surveyors, but is watching it to make sure nothing is slipped in. There was some intense debate at the subcommittee and full committee, and two Senators (the Subcommittee Chair and LCI Chair) have contested it until the questions/problems are ironed out.

- H.3079 the bill that says you can use purple paint as the universal sign for no trespass was given second reading. It will get third reading and move to the Senate next week.
- H. 3263 the bill dealing with spouses being licensed has moved to the Senate and was committed to Senate LCI yesterday.
- H.3404 is a bill that Jones recently started following as it deals with licensure. The bill "allows
 people who have a lawful presence in this state and are no precluded from establishing
 residency under federal immigration law may establish a residency in SC and be eligible for
 professional licensure. It also allows the same people to get in-state tuition. "Though the bill
 hasn't moved, it is getting a lot of bi-partisan support and is getting sponsors added to it daily.
- Though it hasn't actually move, Jones met with the Speaker of the House this week on the H.3758, the fair share bill. The speaker said he's twisting some arms, but assured Jones he will get a subcommittee hearing this year. We will not meet crossover as it is next week, but we still hope to see it move this year. If we can get it to the Senate this year that will be a big victory.
- Another bill that hasn't seen actual movement, and isn't even a bill yet, but the Building Codes adoption bill we've been talking about has had some action. Jones met last week in chambers with Senator Alexander, AGC, and the Building Code Officials. We talked to Alexander about splitting the adoption cycles. Three years for commercial and six years for residential. Alexander seemed to understand our reasoning. We also showed him emails where HBA was in agreeance with other changes we suggested to the proposed language. LCI staff was working on drawing up language with what we discussed. I heard through the grapevine that Mark Nix and HBA are having someone else draft the bill they want. We'll just have to continue to fight this. We may have to take the fight to the House of Representatives, but we'll still try to stop it.

Highway Transportation Engineers Conference

- Jones saw a large ACEC-SC presence at the conference.
- Jones had a very busy day at the Statehouse Wednesday and Thursday so he was only able to go to the networking in the morning and the opening session.

State House Visit

- April 3, Jones had an ACEC-SC Member visit the state house.
- Carlos Gittens, PE with KCI spoke with his legislators as well as two other legislators in the Greenville area.

Consulting Congress Day

- ACEC-SC is working on our Consulting Congress Day appointments.
- Jones would like to know who is planning on going to DC.
 - o Rick Fauteux, Kylie Page, Cameron Nations and Kevin Shoemake are planning to attend.
- Jones will be setting up the ACEC-SC dinner soon, so it's good to have an idea of who is coming.

ACEC National/National Directors Report

- Fauteux reported April 4 is the last day for early registration and the hotel block.
- Dates for Consulting Congress is May 5 8, 2019 Washington Marriott Wardman Park.
- Fall Conference will be October 13-16, 2019 in Chicago, IL, at the Sheraton Grande, Chicago, IL.

 ACEC Annual Convention and Legislative Summit 2020 will be at Washington Marriott Wardman Park, April 26-29, 2020.

Committee Reports

- Transportation Williams had leave the meeting. Adam Jones said he sent the draft Partnering Committee Minutes to John Boylston. Until he approves, the minutes are marked as DRAFT.
- Environmental No Report
- Business, Resource and Education (BRE)- Black reported the packages were sent to colleges by Elaine Mikell except USC she was unsure where to send it. Mulliken said he would pass it along to the correct person.
 - Future Leaders Mulliken confirmed almost all speakers waiting on confirmation from one. Adam Jones said the Palmetto Club will provide free room rental as long as the meals are held at the facility. Currently, Jones said he would like to give attendees a choice at each meal. He is working with the Palmetto Club to set the menu.
- Communications –Ward is working with Robin Bennet of Grits Design to clean up the current ACEC-SC website. Bennet is working on a test sight and expects to have something soon. Ward said he is looking at national for content. Each chair will be responsible for the content for their committee. QC policies will need to be made and monitored.
- Membership –Shoemake said the committee had a call last week and established a goal and list. The committee will have a time line set at the next meeting.
- Advocacy and PAC Gehman will send to the board as he had to leave the meeting prior to his report.
- Nominating Committee –Page said there is no report at this time.

ACEC PAC

- Kylie Page reported the current amount is just over \$12,000.
- Last year was over \$15,000.
- Page advised you can set up a reoccurring draft.
- The form can be obtained online or Page can email it to you. Page mentioned ACEC made an error when setting up the initial draft from her account, but it was quickly rectified.
