# ACEC-SC Board of Directors Meeting Board Meeting Thursday, March 4, 2021 Webex

<u>Call to Order</u>: ACEC-SC Chair Jason Eppley, PE, called the board meeting to order at 10:00 AM. The following were in attendance: Jason Eppley, PE, Matt Gehman, Jeff Mulliken, Ph.D., PE, Keith Overstreet, PE, Chuck Black, PE, Petrina Butler PE, Theresa McClure, Bryan Shiver, PE, Ben Temple, PE, Ricky Ward, PE, Melvin Williams, David Montgomery, PE, Adam B. Jones, Allison J. King, and Sarah Waldrop.

A motion was made to approve the minutes as amended by Jones by Chair Jason Eppley and passed without objection.

<u>Membership Report</u>: Executive Director Adam B. Jones reported there were no new membership applications.

- AECOM's dues were received
- Heath Linebeck will be added
- Carlisle will be removed
- Question: TRC is in light green. Did they pay?
  - Answer: Yes. There will be a uniform color used next time.

A motion was made to approve the Membership Report by Ward with a second from Butler and passed unanimously.

**Financial Report:** Secretary/Treasurer Jeff Mulliken, PE, Ph.D., reported:

- Total Income: \$375,682.30Total Expenses: \$279,672.73
  - Aligned Learning (Winter Meeting) paid, MC for EEA paid, Management fee reflected
- Net: \$96,009.57

A motion was made to approve the financial report by Black, with a second by Gehman and passed unanimously.

<u>Chair's Report</u>: Chairman Jason Eppley, PE, said

- Membership: 98 members
  - Question: Goal of 100 members by 2023 Update?
    - Eppley noted we will discuss this at the Retreat. We should update the goal and benchmarks for diversity. The dates by the "due by" need to be addressed and updated.

Vice Chair's Report: Vice Chairman Matt Gehman

- Virtual Retreat April 14
- No more than half a day. Lunch will be supplied, along with a surprise.
- May have a homework assignment
- Theme: how to get the rubber to meet the road
  - Question: still have a board meeting on April 1?
    - Answer: Yes
  - Jones noted the Survey results and Chernoff-Newman Plan. Also, there will not be a board meeting during the Retreat.

#### **Executive Director's Report:** Executive Director Adam B. Jones reported:

- 1. Legislative Report
  - S.422 (Indemnity legislation)
    - Met with attorney 2/8/2021
    - Trying to schedule a meeting with Allen Hutto & Leland Colvin (SCDOT) to hear their issue
    - Meet with attorney again
    - Draft amendments if needed
    - Ask for subcommittee hearing / have introduced in House
  - S.2 (split up SCDHEC)
    - No movement yet, but Peeler wants this to move
    - H.3766 is the House version
      - House version is a much better bill.
      - Splits SCDHEC into Department of Health & Department of Environmental Control
      - Directors appointed by the Governor
      - ACEC-SC would be much more comfortable with the House version
  - S. 491 (Port Bond Bill)
    - Bill passed Senate
    - Will give \$550 in Bond Funds to update rail and barge routes for Port
    - o Amended so that \$1/container will go pay back the bond
  - S.147 COVID-19 Safe Harbor Legislation
    - Bill passed Senate
    - Bill was amended, but in a way, we can live with
    - Will be debated in the House
  - H.3243 (Licensure for individuals in our Country legally)
    - Subcommittee hearing 3/3/2021
    - Adjourn Debate
  - QBS Legislation (Opening the Practice Act)
    - Still in a holding pattern.
  - ACEC National continues to push for a fix in the PPP to take out the FAR Credits Clause
    - Question: is this affecting our members?
      - Jones noted that he had not heard anything from our firms. He is trying to raise awareness in case.

- 2. Virtual Consulting Congress Day Appointments
  - Consulting Congress Day will be virtual like it was last year.
  - We will start scheduling these soon as ACEC is ready.
    - ACEC provides "leave-behinds" we send in advance.
    - These serve as our talking points.
- 3. Engineers' Day on the Hill / Legislative Reception
  - Legislative Reception Canceled
  - Engineers' Day on the Hill is still on (as far as we know)
  - I had to wait until March to confirm with Statehouse.
  - Submitted Application
  - House & Senate Resolutions. Also, Governor Proclamation
  - Will be held on Statehouse Steps (northern side)
  - Presidents of organizations will have the opportunity to speak
  - Roger Nutt, PE, will speak
    - Asking other legislators to speak as well

#### 4. Engineering Excellence Awards

- April 21, 2021, Postpone?
  - Jones said he is feeling more confident about the date. He wants Board opinions, though.
    - Eppley noted we should wait another week or two. Or would that be too late to push?
    - Jones said he would reach out to the Alumni Center to see when our Drop Date is.
    - Jones noted President Biden said everyone would be vaccinated by May.
    - Discussion ensued.
    - Allison King suggested mid-June.
    - No opposition to pushing the date
    - Jones said we would postpone the date, by majority decision by the Board.
- Surveyed entrants, nine said they would come.
- We have now scheduled it for June 16, 2021.

#### 5. Winter Meeting

- 69 registrants (last year we had 78)
- Good reviews thus far
- Low overhead
  - Jones noted we are considering keeping this virtual permanently.

#### 6. ACEC-SC Retreat

Allison King was able to negotiate with Grove Park to move it to next year

- Had to agree to a \$10+/room night
  - Jones noted it would be the same weekend but in 2022.

#### 7. Golf Tournament

- April 19, 2021
- Country Club of Lexington
  - o Jones noted the Platinum Sponsor has already been sold.

#### 8. SC Engineering Conference & Trade Show

- Allison King is negotiating with the hotel for fewer room nights, less space, and fewer F&B (food and beverage) minimums so that we can still make money.
  - Jones said we lost leverage with moving the date since the Governor's COVID restrictions change

#### 9. Pre-written Social Media Posts for Board Members to Post

- To encourage our Board members to make ACEC-SC more visible on Social Media, we propose ACEC-SC writing material for Board members to post and tag ACEC-SC.
  - Jones asked the Board members to please be more active on social media. He also noted the Future Leader Friday is doing well.
- Eppley agreed the Winter Meeting would be the best virtual permanently.
- Petrina Butler asked which platform gets the most attention.
  - Jones said Twitter
  - Director Theresa McClure suggested we hold off on social media until Chernoff-Newman talks to the Board.

<u>ACEC National Director's Report:</u> National Director Kylie Page, PE, was absent. Affiliate National Director Melvin Williams and Executive Director Adam B. Jones spoke in her stead.

- PPP clause awareness
- National Conference going virtual
  - Jones noted DE&I Amendment to the Strategic Plan is going to be voted on
- PAC: Final Four, Winning College Team's colors will be the golf tournament shirt color.

#### **Committee Reports:**

- 1. Transportation Committee Transportation Chair David Montgomery, PE, reported:
  - Partnering Committee Meeting: February 25, 2021
    - Montgomery mentioned the new SCDOT DD 28 and noted a pre-partneringcommittee meeting to add more substance to the agendas to make the Partnering Committee meetings more beneficial.
      - Question: Was Two-Tier discussed?
        - Answer: No. It will be discussed at the next Partnering Committee meeting.

- Eppley noted that the one-year anniversary of Two-Tier is coming up.
- Jones said the SCDOT is moving forward with it.
- Ward noted the Professional Services Subcommittee is trying to schedule a time for SCDOT meeting about Two-Tier.
- Montgomery noted Boylston is looking to add SCDOT staff to the Partnering Committee Meeting. Boylston also wants more input from the Committee members .
- O Question: has the annual meeting in December been planned?
  - Answer: Emily has started planning.
- Montgomery noted that the SCDOT is moving its engineering conference to the fall.
  - Question: Did they set a date?
    - Answer: No. We have no information so far.
  - Jones noted there are conflicts with the SCDOT's meeting schedule and ACEC-SC's meeting schedule.
- Director Benjamin Temple, PE, noted combining our conference with SCDOT's may not be a good move in the right direction because we are trying to get away from being known primarily for transportation.

    - Jones noted there are no student scholarship applications. Please spread the word
      - Temple and Black offered to help review applications.
- 3. Communications Committee: Ricky Ward
  - Chernoff-Newman
    - Ward noted the plan we received was good.
    - Jones noted he got a third version of the Chernoff-Newman plan after the packet went out. The updated version will go out later.
- 4. Membership Committee: Brian Shiver
  - Survey results
    - Shiver reminded people to keep in mind there were few responses when reviewing the results. Discussions will be more in-depth at the virtual Retreat
    - Butler noted the 100-firm goal for ACEC-SC should also include member retention.
- 5. Nominating Committee
  - Call for nominees has gone out in First Word.
- 6. Budget Committee: Jeff Mulliken

  - Mulliken noted we went through a line-by-line revision during the meeting. We should have a draft by the next Board meeting. Good progress was made.

Looking at municipal bonds. 10% can be withdrawn with some penalty. A letter of intent has to be signed. Make \$100,000 deposit. First CD can be cashed this April.



#### Executive Director's Report 3/30/2021

- Legislative Report
  - H. 4060 (Building Codes)
    - The original bill did not reflect the deal that was made in Senate last year that kept commercial adoption at three years and allowed residential to be adopted every six years.
    - A coalition, lead by ACEC-SC, made up of CarolinasAGC, Mechanical Contractors, SC Forestry Association, SC Firefighters Association, AIA-SC, and the SC Insurance Association, held a zoom meeting.
    - A letter authored by Adam B. Jones was sent to Chairman Sandifer on behalf of the Coalition
    - ACEC-SC and Carolinas AGC testified (Jones testified on behalf of the engineering community and the Coalition).
    - Bill was amended to read: Residential "The effective date shall be no earlier than five years but no later than six years from date of previously adopted SC Building Codes"; Commercial: "the effective date shall be no earlier than two years but no later than three from date of the previously adopted SC building Codes."
  - S. 627 (State and Local Tax, SALT, Parity Bill)
    - ACEC-SC was asked to sign on to a letter of support to this bill.
      - Due to time issues, the Executive Committee signed off
    - Provides S-Corps, LLC, & Partnerships the option to pay their SALT at the entity level
- The Tax Cuts & Jobs Act of 2017 limited the deductibility of state and local taxes for individuals taxpayers to \$10,000 per year.
  - This was done to limit federal subsidy of high-tax states
  - C-Corps could continue to deduct their SALT taxes fully
  - This created a disparity for passthrough businesses (S Corps, Partnerships, & LLCs) because passthrough owners pay their business taxes on their individual tax returns and are affected by the \$10,000 Limit
  - This bill closes that loophole, so there will not be a \$10,000 limit on these passthrough entities.
  - H. 3243 (Licensure for Documented people)
    - Passed out of subcommittee
  - S.147 COVID-19 Safe Harbor Legislation
    - In House Judiciary
    - It was amended and passed out of Special Laws Subcommittee
    - The full committee is dragging their feet on passage
      - Call to action likely

Chairman Sandifer,

For the past few years, a coalition has existed made up of the American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina, the American Institute of Architects of South Carolina, the Building Officials Association of South Carolina, CarolinasAGC, the Forestry Association of South Carolina, the Mechanical Contractors of South Carolina, State Firefighters Association, the South Carolina Society of Professional Engineers, and several different insurance groups which have been working through building code legislation that has been introduced. In April 2019, all of our groups reached a compromise with the South Carolina Home Builders Association (SC-HBA), but crossover and then the pandemic impacted the passage of that legislation

We expected the SC Homebuilders to file the bill again but assumed it would reflect the compromise our groups agreed to. Unfortunately, H. 4060 does not reflect that compromise.

Our groups believe a three-year adoption cycle best protects South Carolina's citizens' health, safety, and welfare. With many of our companies working in and hiring from other states, playing from the same sheet of music gives our industries some continuity. Adopting the most current ICC code keeps our industries on the same page.

Beyond the continuity of our industries, extending the adoption cycle past three years can create other headaches from insurance mods to FEMA assistance after emergencies. As we see more frequent and more significant emergencies happening across the country and in South Carolina, from hurricanes to flooding, we think adopting the most current code series is imperative to keep South Carolina citizens safe.

We understand there will be South Carolina specific amendments, but these adoptions are few compared to the many of the standard code series. Adopting the most current codes effectively and efficiently creates the safest environment for our state.

Last year, the coalition and HBA-SC agreed in good faith to allow the residential codes to change to a six-year adoption cycle but leaving the commercial adoption cycle at three years. We also agreed to call the codes the SC Building Codes and not the National Model Codes. We realize that politics is the art of compromise and stand by this good faith agreement. Seeing as it took us many, many months to reach this compromise, we cannot support H. 4060 as it is drafted and hope that vou will consider amending the bill to reflect the changes that all of our groups agreed to.

Dear Senator Cromer and Members of the Subcommittee:

The undersigned organizations strongly support the passage of S 627 / H 3978 that allows S-corporations, partnerships, and LLC's to deduct state income taxes on their federal tax return, while remaining revenue neutral to our state. This legislation is a meaningful win-win for South Carolina's economic recovery and its small business owners.

The 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) imposed a \$10,000 cap on the amount of state and local taxes (SALT) South Carolina taxpayers can deduct on their federal returns. This cap hurts employers organized as "pass through" entities that pay taxes on business profits at the individual (owner/partner) level. This puts our main street employers at a disadvantage compared to C corporations who can deduct their full SALT payments and compared to businesses operating in other states that are passing the reforms included in S 627 or have existing tax laws in place that protect pass-through small businesses from the SALT cap.

Currently South Carolina's partnerships and S corporations are essentially subject to higher tax rates than if they were allowed to fully deduct those taxes. In November 2020, the Internal Revenue Service announced that state taxes on business income imposed at the entity level on pass-through entities are permitted as a deduction and "is consistent with the longstanding position" of the agency. Alabama, Louisiana, Maryland, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Connecticut, Rhode Island, and Wisconsin, have all passed similar SALT Parity reforms, and 15 other states including GA and NC are actively considering it.

To address this disparity, we support legislation to restore the full SALT deduction to South Carolina's pass-through businesses. S 627:

- Is revenue neutral to South Carolina as the deduction reduces federal taxes owed;
- Provides these businesses the option to pay their SALT at the entity level;
- Includes an income exemption, so that owners of businesses making the election are not subject to double taxation; and eliminates the burdensome withholding requirements for non-resident shareholders and LLC members
- Provides South Carolina business owners with a credit for business taxes paid to other states that have adopted similar SALT Parity reforms.

Pass-through businesses are the backbone of our state's economy and many have been hit hard by the COVID-19 pandemic. SALT Parity will help these businesses recover by reducing their



federal tax burden without reducing tax collections for the state. It keeps South Carolina business revenues in our state to help grow the economy.

We ask that you support this legislation and encourage you to pass it this year so our small businesses can begin taking advantage of this tax relief.

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

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# American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC) Industry Survey Executive Summary

## **Purpose and Methodology**

ETC Institute, of Olathe, Kansas, conducted a survey on the behalf of the American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC) in the fall of 2020. The purpose of the survey was to retrieve data from engineering firms in the state of South Carolina. Information compiled will be used by ACEC-SC to better implement their Strategic Plan and enhance their practices in how they serve the consulting engineering community of South Carolina.

The American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC) provided ETC Institute with a list of engineering firms in the state of South Carolina. Each firm was contacted via direct mail, e-mail, and followed up with a phone call. Results of ACEC-SC members and non-member results are statistically valid.

This report contains the following:

- An executive summary of the methodology for administering the survey and major findings,
- charts depicting results of ACEC-SC members and non-members,
- crosstabulation data by ACEC-SC member and non-member results for each question on the survey, and
- a copy of the survey instrument.

Findings of the results are below and on the following pages.

# <u>Findings: Members of the American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC)</u>

**Length of Membership.** Half (50.4%) of the respondents indicated their firm is a member of the American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC). Respondent members were asked how long their organization has been a member with the ACEC-SC.

- Thirty-two percent (32%) indicated they have been a member for 5 years or less,
- 22% have been a member for 6 to 10 years,
- 15% have been a member for 11 to 15 years,
- 15% have been a member for 16 to 20 years.
- 13% have been a member for 21 to 30 years, and
- 3% have been a member for 31 years or longer.

**Contributions.** Of the respondents whose organization is a member of the ACEC-SC, 41% indicated they do regularly contribute to the ACEC National PAC, 48% do not contribute, and 12% did not provide a response.

**Membership Awareness.** Nine out of ten (93%) respondents, whose firm is a member of the ACEC-SC, are familiar with/aware of ACEC-SC benefits, events, and activities and 7% are not familiar with or are not aware.

**ACEC-SC Mission**. The mission of the ACEC-SC "is to advocate, advance, and protect the business interests of engineering firms and standards of the engineering profession in South Carolina. Members were asked how they think the ACEC-SC delivers on this mission and over three-quarters (77%) think the ACEC-SC delivers on this mission very or somewhat well. Fourteen percent (14%) of members indicated they thought the ACEC-SC delivered on their mission either not well or not well at all and 9% indicated they were neutral.

**Membership Benefits.** Members were asked how they feel the ACEC-SC delivers on its' membership benefits. The benefits, with the highest ratings from respondents, who indicated they feel ACEC-SC delivers well, based on the sum of very well and somewhat well responses among *members who had an opinion*, were: program and educational opportunities (85%), networking and teaming (80%), and legislative representation (77%). Seventeen percent (17%) of members, *who had an opinion*, indicated that they feel the ACEC-SC does not deliver client interaction well and 15% feel that the ACEC-SC does not deliver legislative representation well.

**Strategic Plan.** Almost half (46%) of respondents, whose firm is a member of the ACEC-SC, indicated they are aware of the ACEC-SC strategic plan and 54% are not aware of the plan.

**ACEC-SC Goals.** Members were asked to indicate how well they thought the ACEC-SC delivers on various organization goals. Based on the sum of very well and somewhat well responses, by members who had an opinion,

- 67% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "increase ACEC-SC legislative influence" well,
- 64% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "grow the ACEC-SC brand to include transparency and effective communication" well,
- 56% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "energize and engage ACEC-membership" well, and
- 42% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "grow and diversify ACEC-membership and support growth in the engineering industry" well.

Twenty-four percent (24%) of members, who had an opinion, and based on the sum of not well and not well at all responses, does not think the ACEC-SC delivers well the goal to "grow and diversify ACEC-SC membership and support growth in the engineering industry" and 22% does not think the ACEC-SC delivers well the goal to "energize and engage ACEC-SC membership."

Members were asked how well they feel the ACEC-SC represents the industries they serve with ACEC-SC benefits, the benefits with the highest ratings of very well and somewhat well responses were: Highways and Roads (86%), Geotechnical (69%), Construction Engineering and Inspection (68%), and Structures (61%).

**Events.** Respondents whose organization is a member of ACEC-SC were asked which event(s) they typically attend;

- 70% of respondents attend the South Carolina Engineering Conference,
- 61% attend the ACEC-SC/SCDOT Annual Meeting, and
- 45% attend the SC Legislative Reception.

Members, that typically attend ACEC-SC events, were asked which event they like the best; 29% of members like the ACEC-SC/SDOT Annual Meeting the best, 26% like the South Carolina Engineering Conference the best, 9% like the Annual Golf Tournament the best, 5% like the SC Legislative Reception the best, 3% like the PAC Fundraisers the best, 3% like the Engineering Excellence Awards Ceremony the best, and 25% of members did not choose an event.

**Committee Participation.** Respondent members were asked if they or other members of their firm participate in any ACEC-SC committees; 61% indicated that they do participate in ACEC-SC committees, 30% do not participate, and 9% did not provide a response. Members were asked if there are any barriers to their firm participating; over half (57%) of members said there are not any barriers to participation, 29% indicated that there are some barriers to their firm participating, and 14% did not provide a response.

**Communication.** Members were asked how well they thought the ACEC-SC communicates with its member firms; 29% think the ACEC-SC communicates very well, 35% think the ACEC-SC communications somewhat well, and 9% think the ACEC-SC communications not well, 3% think the ACEC-SC communications not well at all. Nineteen percent (19%) of members gave a response of neutral and 6% indicated that they do not know.

Members were asked how they would prefer to get information from the ACEC-SC;

- 83% would prefer to get information through e-mail,
- 7% would prefer to get information through the website (acecsc.org),
- 3% would prefer to get information through an "other" method, and
- 6% did not provide their opinion.
- Members do not prefer to get information from ACEC-SC through direct mailing or phone calls.

**Value of Membership.** Members were asked to rate the overall value their firm receives from having an ACEC-SC membership. Thirteen percent (13%) gave a rating of excellent, 42% gave a rating of good, 15% gave a rating of average, 12% gave a rating of below average, 10% gave a rating of poor, and 9% did not know.

**Recommendation.** Seven out of ten (71%) of respondent members would likely recommend ACEC-SC to non-member firms. 9% would not likely, and 6% would not be likely at all to recommend ACEC-SC to non-member firms. Seven percent (7%) gave a response of neutral and 7% gave a response of do not know.

# <u>Findings: Non-Members of the American Council of Engineering</u> <u>Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC)</u>

**Membership.** About half (49.6%) of respondents indicated their organization is not a member of the American Council of Engineering Companies of South Carolina (ACEC-SC).

**ACEC-SC Mission**. The mission of the ACEC-SC "is to advocate, advance, and protect the business interests of engineering firms and standards of the engineering profession in South Carolina. Non-members were asked how they think the ACEC-SC delivers on this mission and 66% think the ACEC-SC delivers on their mission very or somewhat well and nine percent think the ACEC-SC delivers on their mission not well or not well at all. Twenty-four percent (24%) of non-members gave a response of neutral.

**Membership Benefits.** Non-members were asked how they feel the ACEC-SC delivers on its' membership benefits. The benefits, with the highest ratings from respondents, who indicated they feel ACEC-SC delivers well, based on the sum of very well and somewhat well responses among non-members who had an opinion, were: program and educational opportunities (72%), networking and teaming (69%), and legislative representation (67%). Twenty percent (20%) of non-members feel the ACEC-SC does not deliver on their client interaction well.

**Strategic Plan.** Almost all (95.5%) of non-member respondents are not aware of the ACEC-SC strategic plan and 5.5% of non-members are aware of the ACEC-SC strategic plan.

**ACEC-SC Goals.** Non-members were asked to indicate how well they thought the ACEC-SC delivers on various organization goals. Based on the sum of very well and somewhat well responses, by non-members who had an opinion,

- 41% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal of "grow the ACEC-SC brand to include transparency and effective communication" well,
- 41% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "increase the ACEC-SC legislative influence" well,
- 37% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "grow and diversify ACEC-SC membership and support growth in the engineering industry" well, and
- 29% think the ACEC-SC delivers the goal to "energize and engage ACEC-SC membership" well.

Twenty-eight percent (28%) of non-members, who had an opinion, and based on the sum of not well and not well at all responses, does not think the ACEC-SC delivers well the goal to "energize and engage ACEC-SC membership," 24% of non-members does not think the ACEC-SC delivers well the goal to "grow the ACEC-SC brand to include transparency and effective communication," and 24% of non-members does not think the ACEC-SC delivers well the goal to "increase ACEC-SC legislative influence."

Non-members were asked how well they feel the ACEC-SC represents the industries they serve with ACEC-SC benefits, the benefits with the highest ratings of very well and somewhat well responses were: Highways and Roads (81%), Drinking Water (64%), Water Resources (64%), and Structures (62%).

**Committee Participation.** Non-member respondents were asked if there are barriers to their firm participating in ACEC-SC committees; 23% indicated there are barriers for their firm, 73% indicated there are not any barriers for their firm, and 5% did not provide a response.

**Communication.** Non-members were asked how well they thought the ACEC-SC communicates with its member firms; 3% think the ACEC-SC communicates very well, 7% think the ACEC-SC communications somewhat well, and 1% think the ACEC-SC communications not well at all. Six percent (6%) of members gave a response of neutral and 82% indicated that they don't know/not a member.

Non-members were asked how they would prefer to get information from the ACEC-SC;


- 47% would prefer to get information through e-mail,
- 35% would prefer to get information through the website (acecsc.org),
- 4% would prefer to get information through LinkedIn,
- 3% would prefer to get information through direct mailing,
- 3% would prefer to get information through phone calls,
- 3% would prefer to get information through an "other" method, and
- 4% did not provide their opinion.


**Value of Membership.** Non-members were asked to rate the overall value their firm receives from having an ACEC-SC membership. One percent (1%) gave a rating of excellent, 1% gave a rating of good, 3% gave a rating of average, 1% gave a rating of below average, and 93% responded with they don't know/not a member. *Non-members did not give a poor rating to the overall value of having an ACEC-SC membership.* 

**Recommendation.** Non-members were asked how likely they would recommend ACEC-SC to non-member firms, 1% indicated they would be very likely to recommend ACEC-SC to non-member firms, 9% would be somewhat likely, and 6% would not likely at all recommend ACEC-SC to non-member firms. Nine percent (9%) of non-member respondents gave a response of neutral and 75% do not know/are not a member.




### Q1a. How long have you been a member?

### Q1b. Do you regularly contribute to ACEC National PAC?


by percentage of respondents whose organization is a member of ACEC-SC

## Q1c. Are you familiar with or aware of ACEC-SC benefits, events and activities?


by percentage of respondents whose organization is a member of ACEC-SC (without "not provided")





by percentage of respondents (without "don't know")




## Q3. How well do you feel ACEC-SC delivers on its' membership benefits? Members vs. Non-Members



## Q4. Are you aware of the ACEC-SC strategic plan? <u>Members vs. Non-Members</u>




### Q5. How well do you think ACEC-SC delivers on the following goals?

by percentage of respondents using a 5-point scale, where 5 means "very well" and 1 means "not well at all" (without "don't know")




## Q6. How well do you feel ACEC-SC represents the industries you serve on the following benefits?


## Q6. How well do you feel ACEC-SC represents the industries you serve on the following benefits?


## Q7. ACEC-SC holds several events each year. Which events do you typically attend?

### Q7a. Which of the events do you like best?




# Q9. Do you or other members of your firm participate in any of the ACEC-SC committees? Members vs. Non-Members

by percentage of respondents




## Q9-2. Are there barriers to your firm participating? <u>Members vs. Non-Members</u>

by percentage of respondents that do not or work with members of their firm that do not participate in any of the ACEC-SC committees




## Q10. How well do you think ACEC-SC communicates with its member firms? <u>Members vs. Non-Members</u>

by percentage of respondents




## Q11. How would you prefer to get information from ACEC-SC? <u>Members vs. Non-Members</u>




# Q12. How would you rate the overall value your firm receives from your ACEC-SC membership? <u>Members vs. Non-Members</u>
