
Bystander Effect





The **bystander effect** is a social phenomenon in which individuals are less likely to speak up regarding a questionable situation/behavior when other people are present. The more people present, the less likely for anyone to speak up.



While each member of the group may recognize there is an inappropriate situation or behavior, there is a tendency for people to think "someone else will do something," or "if nobody else is doing anything, maybe this isn't really a problem?"
