Each applicant must have a principal sponsor within their firm, who commits to providing support for the applicant to attend and fully engage in each session. The sponsor will review goals and expectations with the applicant before the program begins and again near its conclusion.

Leadership Institute's class size is limited. Applications will be reviewed by a panel based on the information provided in the application form, using the evaluation criteria outlined on the official Leadership Institute Class of 2025 Application Form.
