Florida Scholars Academy Mission

The mission of the Florida Scholars Academy is to provide a free and appropriate high-quality education to eligible students within the juvenile justice system and to prepare students for gainful employment as productive citizens upon their reentry into the community.

Project Anchor

- The Florida Department of Juvenile Justice in collaboration with Tallahassee Community College have established a partnership to deliver workforce education and career readiness services
- Project Anchor is a Pilot Program that will provide;
 - Career readiness skills
 - Industry recognized training and certifications
 - Career pathways for youth to continue education at a Florida college or postsecondary institution
 - Opportunities to pursue work-based learning activities
 - Team includes Project Director, Career Navigators and Regional Workforce Coordinators, North, Central, South
 - Probation Services continuum of services

- K-12 academic education program to complete diploma or equivalency
- Powered by Florida Virtual School ٠
- Taught by Florida Certified educators ٠
- Youth work with Guidance Counselors to determine academic pathway
- Career and Technical Education through career exploration, rapid credentialing, credit course enrollment and pre-apprenticeship opportunities •
- Services will begin July 1, 2024 •

Project Anchor

- Postsecondary enrollment after graduation or equivalency achieved
- Partnership with Tallahassee State College
- Taught by Industry Certified and credentialed instructors
- Youth work with Career Navigators to determine career pathway
- Career preparation through exploration, enrollment in state or technical college courses, pre-apprenticeships that lead to apprenticeship opportunities

- Approximately 306 graduates reported between June 2023 April 2024
