Program Description

Drexel University's Military Transition Program (MTP) exemplifies excellence in supporting military veterans through a tailored, innovative approach to higher education. Launched through Goodwin College, MTP addresses the needs of veterans who do not initially meet the admission requirements for their desired degree programs. This two-term program is designed to provide a structured pathway to success, enabling veterans to transition seamlessly into Drexel's rigorous academic environment and ultimately matriculate into their chosen degree programs. The MTP offers a comprehensive support structure, integrating academic advising, career services, and emotional support to foster veteran success. Veterans enrolled in the program benefit from a personalized plan of study, intrusive advising, and collaboration with academic advising teams in their intended majors. This tailored approach helps veterans overcome academic barriers and prepares them for success in their degree programs. A major innovation of the MTP is its ability to grant full-time student status to participants. This development, introduced in the 2016-2017 academic year, allows veterans to qualify for additional financial aid beyond their GI Bill benefits. This enhancement ensures that veterans can fully utilize their educational resources and complete their degrees in a timely manner.

Dyslexia Teacher Training

Program Description

With an emphasis on neurodiversity, mindfulness, and accessibility, the Dyslexia Teacher Training Program focuses on teaching advanced methods of reading intervention to educators. This program is currently in its fifth year and runs through the semester-based traditional school year. It is designed for K-12 teachers, literacy specialists, and educational therapists who serve students with dyslexia and other reading disabilities. Both the content and principles of delivering instruction are consistent with Structured Literacy and based on the Orton-Gillingham approach for teaching basic oral and written language skills. This program provides graduate-level knowledge of language development, dyslexia, and an explicit structured multisensory approach to reading. The program and its curriculum was created in partnership with experts at Fairleigh-Dickinson University, a longstanding, IMSLEC-accredited dyslexia program. The program has two tracks: a one-year track and a three-year track. Participants in the Teacher Level begin the program with an intense two-day in-person orientation at the start of each term and attend weekly online synchronous seminars.
