Journey to Accreditation A how-to guide

FAMILIARIZE YOURSELF WITH **STANDARDS & CRITERIA**.

Not sure where to start? We recommend doing some reading on <u>our website</u> or chatting with the <u>Director of Accreditation</u> at AEE to get initial questions answered. Organizations that provide experiential education services and adventure activities are eligible to apply for accreditation.



When you're ready to start the process, submit the electronic application on our website. AEE will determine whether your organization qualifies as an Adventure Program (AP) or an Outdoor Behavioral Healthcare (OBH) Program. Some organizations offer both types of programs and are eligible to apply for dual accreditation.

SELF-ASSESMENT STUDY

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Next, your organization is sent a letter of acceptance, an invoice for the application fee, and the materials necessary to complete the Self-Assessment Study (SAS). The SAS is an internal review process that helps your organization to know itself better, evaluate its operations, and make necessary improvements to meet accreditation standards. You'll also be assigned a Liaison from the Accreditation Council to work with.







The Accreditation review team conducts the site visit and writes a Site Visit Report noting compliance with standards, a list of review activities completed, strengths of your organization, and other observations of note. If some of the standards are found to be unmet, your program is allowed 60 days to design and communicate corrective actions to meet them.

The Accreditation Council meets, deliberates and votes on whether or not your program will be granted Initial Accreditation. If Accredited, congratulations! The AEE Director sends the Certificate of Accreditation and invoice for the Accredited Membership.

MAINTENANCE

Maintaining accreditation is contingent on continuing to meet the accreditation standards, the submission of Annual Reports and payment of annual fees. Your organization will notify AEE of serious incidents, new activities, major organizational changes as they occur.
