- ARIZONA MULTIHOUSING CHARITABLE FOUNDATION COMMITTEE (AMCF) / BIG HEARTS COMMITTEE** - (Meets monthly) Raises money for and determines the direction of the association's charitable causes. Big Hearts includes the Julie Hurst and Steve Peters Scholarship fund which is available to AMA members and their dependents for higher education. Check one or both: ___ Phoenix ___ Tucson
- COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE** - (Meets Qtly) Reviews AMA communication including social media, *Apartment News* and email communications to members. Focus areas include the AMA Website, *Apartment News* magazine, and AMA public relations, social media and marketing efforts.
- EDUCATION COMMITTEE** - (Meets 7 times annually) Sets the direction of association education calendar including dinner meeting programing, working with direction from the trade show committee on the education conference.
- GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE** - (Meets monthly except July and August) Determines the direction of the association's lobbying and government relations activities, sets the policy direction for state and local advocacy efforts and works to educate members on legislation and regulations impact operations. Check one or both: ___ Phoenix ___ Tucson
 - DEVELOPER SUBCOMMITTEE** - (Meets monthly except July and August) This Government Affairs subcommittee works with AMA lobbying team to provide direction pertaining to multifamily planning, development, construction and affordable housing related issues.
- MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE** - (Meets monthly, except June, July and Dec.) Provides energy, support and creativity that drives the recruitment and retention of membership. Mentors new members providing immediate connections and effective integration into the AMA. Makes recommendations and determination of member benefit programs.
- SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY COMMITTEE** - (meets monthly) Partners with local, private, and public organizations to provide member communities with resources to create a better environment for staff, residents and neighbors. The Social Responsibility Committee includes the AMA Project SAFE and Smoke Free / Healthy Arizona Worksites Program. Check one or both: ___ Phoenix ___ Tucson
- TRADE SHOW COMMITTEE** - Plans and executes the annual trade show in Phoenix and Tucson. The committee determines the theme, plans special events, builds attendance and helps to market the event to the industry. Check one or both: ___ Phoenix (Meets monthly, Feb – Oct) ___ Tucson (Meets monthly, Nov – June)
- TRIBUTE AWARDS COMMITTEE** - (Meets monthly, Nov. – May) coordinates the nomination and judging process. Assists in the planning of an elegant awards gala through careful selection of theme, décor and program content.
- PHOENIX EVENTS COMMITTEE** - (Meets monthly) Plans and executes AMA signature events – Reverse Trade Show (April), AMA Golf Tournament (October) and Maintenance Mania (November).
- TUCSON EVENT COMMITTEES** - (varies) Each committee plans and executes AMA Tucson events. Please check one or more committee that you have an interest in serving on ___ Tucson Golf Tournament (Dec.-Apr.), ___ Tucson Reverse Trade Show (Feb.-July), ___ Maintenance Mania (July-Nov.) and / or ___ Tucson Networking and Dinner Meeting (monthly).
