



### **Factors Impacting Tons**






## **US Asphalt Pavement Market**






# Tons of HMA Produced (excludes RAP, RAS)

## Policy Issues Impacting Market

- SAFETEA-LU Extension
- Continuing Resolution
- Debt Limit Increase
- 2012 Congressional Budget
- 2012 Transportation Appropriations
- Multi-Year Transportation Bill
- FAA Reauthorization



#### 2010

- Hire Act
  - Stabilized Market
    - Secured General Fund Transfer to Highway Trust Fund
    - Provided Full Year Contract Authority
- Stimulus Program
  - \$5.5 billion spent in 2009
  - \$11.5 billion spent in 2010
  - \$10 billion remaining



#### **Election Results**

- More Conservative Congress
  - Transportation Champion Oberstar Ousted
  - 100 New Members of Congress
- New Mission
  - Cut Government Spending to Grow Economy
    - Includes Highway Program
    - No More Bailouts
    - Gas Tax Increase Non Starter



#### Lame Duck Session

- Highway Bill Extension Thru March 4
- Highway Funding Thru March 4
- For Fiscal 2011, States received 155 days federal <u>highway contract authority</u> and highway <u>funding</u> to commence construction season
- New Congress Determines 2011 Market



#### House

- Republican Controlled
- Earmark Ban
- House Rules Change on Highway Funding
  - Appropriation Bill determines annual Highway funding level
  - Much easier to cut highway spending
  - Highway funding aligned with tax receipts



#### **T&I** Committee

- Committee Size & Clout Reduced
  - 20 Freshman GOP Members
- Chairman Mica's "More With Less" Proposal
  - No Gas Tax Increase
  - Draft Bill at Current Revenue Baseline (\$35 billion)
  - Leverage
  - End Diversions
- Ranking Member Rahall
  - Pro-Highway



#### Senate EPW Committee

- Chairman Boxer
  - Bill thru Committee by Memorial Day
  - Need to Compromise
  - Stretch Existing Resources
  - Diversion Issue Seen as Divisive
  - Wants Signal from House on Funding
- Ranking Member Inhofe
  - Wants to Address Diversions



## President Obama's Proposal

- Supports Infrastructure Investment
- Supports Six-Year Bill
- Focus on Existing Highway System
- Opposes Gas Tax Increase
- Expands Highway Trust Fund Programs
- Punts How to Pay for Bill



## Surface Transportation Trust Fund 4 Sub-Accounts


- Highways (\$69.7b)
- Transit (\$22b)
  - All transit funded out of account
- Rail (\$8b)
  - Includes Amtrak, High-Speed Rail
- Nation Infrastructure Bank (\$5b)
  - All multi-modal projects eligible


- National Highway Program (32.4b)
  - Highway Infrastructure Performance Program
  - Flexible Investment Program
- Livable Communities (4.1b)
- Federal Allocation (1.4b)
- R, T & E (661m)
- Leadership Awards (1.3b)

## Highway Trust Fund 2008-2016




#### NAPA Position

- Reauthorize Asphalt Research Consortium
