Audience Control





Who is your audience?

Make sure that you know who is going to be in your audience. E.g., other behavior analysts, other professionals, caregivers, students



Match content level to audience.

Make sure that the content level is well matched to, or just slightly above, the audience skill level.



Attend to your audience.

Pay attention to your audience and make adjustments as needed (e.g., pacing, volume).



Match language to audience.

Do you need to be very precise?

Do you need to drop jargon?

Make sure that you adjust your lanaguge for the audience.



Relate to audience.

Use examples and stories that are relatable and valuable to your audience.
