Scholar presentations: A paper presentation provides one presenter the opportunity to discuss one or more of their own scholarly works that have been published, currently submitted, currently under review, or in progress. These reviews are not blind.

5	• Presenter is the author of 2+ published, under review, submitted, or in progress works (citations must be included). • Abstract provides a clear explanation of how the individual works presented are related. • Data demonstrate baseline and completed intervention for at least one participant.
4	• Presenter is the author of 1 published, under review, submitted, or in progress work (citations must be included). • Abstract clearly describe how the project will be presented (e.g., discuss the procedures, results, and applied implications). • Data demonstrate baseline and completed intervention for at least one participant.
3	• Presenter is the author of 1 under review, submitted, or in progress work (citations must be included); Abstract references foundational works by others that will be reviewed. • Abstract articulates the connection between the presenter's work and existing published research. • Data demonstrate baseline and at least 1 data point in intervention for at least one participant.
2	• Presenter is the author of at least 1 in-progress work • Abstract clearly describe how the project will be presented (e.g., discuss the procedures, results, and applied implications). • Data demonstrate baseline and at least 1 data point in intervention for at least one participant.
1	• Presenter does not have independent work in this topical area. • Abstract references works by others and likely makes up the majority of the presentation • No data are included in the submission.
