

<u>Symposium</u>

Symposium: A Symposium provides a group of presenters an opportunity to share a collection of in-progress or completed research on a theme that is coordinated and led by a chair and includes a discussant. The symposium abstract must provide a clear description of how the students/projects relate in a cohesive theme

- Chair (may also be the discussant OR a presenter, not all three)
- Discussant (may also be the chair, may not be a presenter in the same symposium)
- 2 papers + discussant: 50 min / 1 CEU (≈15 min per presenter; 10–15 min discussant; 5–10 min intro/transitions)
- 3 papers + discussant: 75 min / 1.5 CEU (≈15 min per presenter; 20–25 min discussant; 5–10 min intro/transitions)

Score	Criteria
5	 Abstract describes a clear and cohesive theme of the symposium and how each project uniquely supports the theme. Data for each study are complete.
4	 Abstract describes the overall theme of the talk and how each talk supports the theme. Data for each study include baseline and at least one intervention data point for one participant or some preliminary group or survey data.
3	 Abstract describes the overall theme of the talk and mentions that the individual talks relate to the theme without describing how. Data for at least one of the projects include baseline and at least one intervention data point for one participant or some preliminary group or survey data.
2	 Abstract only describes the overall theme of the talk and does not mention how the individual talks relate to the theme. There is a statement related to data completion, but no data are submitted.
1	 Abstract is insufficient for review (not enough content, too short) No data are provided.
