


Our Mission

APBA practice guidelines, position statements

- Assessing clients with autism spectrum disorders for ABA treatment planning and progress reporting
 - Secured agreement to collaborate with Council of Autism Service Providers (CASP)
 - Using APBA protocol for developing evidence-based practice guidelines (adapted from Institute of Medicine)
 - Will recruit Guidelines Development Group this spring
- Medical necessity of ABA interventions for people with autism spectrum disorders
 - Being polished for Board review
- Using social media

Fulfilling the mission: Public policy advocacy

- APBA collaborates with behavior analysts, consumers, and policymakers; BACB (where applicable); advocacy organizations
- Provides

 - Analyses of proposed legislation and rules/regs

Health insurance coverage of ABA services

Medicaid

- Disseminated model language for State Plan Amendments (SPAs) or rules re: EPSDT coverage of ABA services for beneficiaries with autism to multiple states
- Provided input on proposed Medicaid SPAs or rules in 12 states (AK, AR, MN, NV, NC, NY, OH, SC, TN, TX, VA, WV)
- Coverage by private or public health plans
 - Provided input on bills or proposed rules in AL, SD, Ontario, Saskatchewan

Health insurance coverage of ABA services

- TRICARE Autism Care Demonstration
 - Participated in provider conference calls
 - Collaborated with Behavior Analysis Advocacy Network on various documents and webinar for providers on use of standardized assessments
 - Provided comments on reports and policies to military family advocate
 - Arranged for Defense Health Agency personnel to give workshop on billing and documentation requirements at this convention

CPT Codes Project

- ABA Services Work Group formed in 2015 to develop proposal to modify the Category III codes for adaptive behavior services, convert them to Category I

- CPT consultants:

For American Medical Association CPT Editorial Panel to approve codes as Category I, *all* of the following criteria must be met:

- Procedure or service
 - performed by many physicians or other qualified health care professionals
 - performed with frequency consistent with intended clinical use
 - consistent with current medical practice
 - clinical efficacy documented in literature that meets requirements in CPT code change application

ABA Services Work Group

- Compiled informal input on Category III codes from hundreds of providers and payers
- Conducted survey of providers on usage of Category III CPT and other codes for ABA services
- Sought input from CPT Editorial Panel staff, professional societies identified by AMA as "stakeholders"

ABA Services Work Group

- Submitted Code Change Proposal to CPT Editorial Panel October 2016. Some Steering Committee members defended it at Panel's February 2017 meeting. Contents:
 - Revised code set
 - Rationale for proposed revisions
 - Vignettes and descriptions of work
 - Evidence review
 - Policy statements, guidelines from professional societies and payers
 - Descriptions of providers

CPT Editorial Panel decision

- 8 modified codes approved as Category I (97X51 – 97X58)
 - Signifies that the services have proved efficacious and are widely accepted in the medical community
- 2 modified codes to remain Category III (0362T, 0373T) for now
- All other Category III codes go away
- Effective January 1, 2019



CPT Codes Project

- New codes will probably be published August 2018
- Until then, AMA rules strictly prohibit our Steering Committee from disclosing specifics and any lobbying of the Steering Committee or other entities involved.

CPT Codes Project: Other Steering Committee activities

- Responded to medically unlikely edits (MUEs) issued by Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) that limited daily units for some Category III CPT codes for adaptive behavior services
 - Surveyed sample of providers on typical hours of service per client per day
 - Successfully advocated with CMS for increases in the MUEs
 - Provided that information to our members via email
- Wrote Defense Health Agency to request that TRICARE authorize providers to use Category III CPT codes for severe problem behavior services ("exposure behavior assessment and treatment")
 - Request was denied
