

## Commitment to Supporting LGBTQIA2S+ Individuals

## July 20, 2023

The Association of Professional Behavior Analysts (APBA) stands firmly in support of LGBTQIA2S+ behavior analysts, students, technicians, trainees, and consumers of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) services. APBA is committed to diversity, equity, and social justice and "condemns all acts of discrimination, violence, hate, and oppression based on race, ethnicity, place of origin, language, gender identity, sex, sexual orientation, religion, political persuasion, culture, age, disability, or socioeconomic status." We acknowledge past, current, and potential future harm caused by anti-LGBTQIA2S+ legislation, specifically bills and laws targeting transgender people. The recent unprecedented wave of proposed and passed legislation targeting this community, specifically trans individuals (American Civil Liberties Union, Human Rights Campaign), causes harm by limiting or preventing access to identity-affirming health care, denying rights to free speech and expression, and denying full access to public education and activities. Collectively, these actions function to restrict the civil rights of LGBTQIA2S+ individuals.

It is the position of APBA that all individuals have the right to evidence-based care and environments that are welcoming, affirming, and safe. This is true for all LGBTQIA2S+ individuals and is especially important for those most at risk of discrimination and harm, specifically transgender and gender-nonconforming (TGNC) people who are Black, Indigenous, and People of Color; TGNC children and youth; senior TGNC people, TGNC people with disabilities; and intersex people (who may not identify as trans). APBA is committed to upholding the principles and standards within the <u>Code of Ethics for Behavior Analysts</u> and the <u>RBT Ethics Code</u>, requiring behavior analysts to 1) treat individuals equitably; 2) not discriminate against others

based on individual factors such as gender expression or identity; 3) be aware of one's own biases; and 4) continuously expand their knowledge and skills related to serving and supervising diverse individuals.

APBA commits to actively seeing, listening to, collaborating with, and supporting all our LGBTQIA2S+ members and LGBTQIA2S+ individuals with whom they collaborate to provide ABA services. To that end, APBA reconfirms its <u>Commitment to Diversity</u>, <u>Equity</u>, and <u>Social Justice</u>, the statements of inclusion of LGBTQIA2S+ individuals, and the actions listed therein.
