OAK CREEK, WI (January 11, 2016) - The Art Libraries Society of North America is pleased to announce *Multimedia & Technology Reviews* (*M&T Reviews*) has been awarded the 2016 Louis Shores Award for excellence in reviewing for libraries by the Reference and User Services Association (RUSA) of the American Library Association. The award was announced at the RUSA Book and Media Awards Ceremony and Reception at the American Library Association Midwinter meeting on January 10, 2016 in Boston and will be presented at the annual conference of the American Library Association in Orlando, Florida, in June 2016.

Multimedia & Technology Reviews was founded in 2014 and is published bi-monthly, targeting projects, products, events, and issues within the broad realm of multimedia and technology as they pertain to arts scholarship, research, and librarianship. While assessing current products and projects, these reviews are also designed to engage readers in a conversation about how technologies and multimedia are being or can be deployed within the art librarianship profession.
