ARLIS/NA HONORS UCLA STUDENTS WITH SOTHEBY'S INSTITUTE OF ART RESEARCH AWARD

Oak Creek, WI (April 13, 2016) -- The Art Libraries Society of North America (ARLIS/NA) is pleased to announce the winners of the 2015 Sotheby's Institute of Art Research Award.

The Sotheby's Institute of Art Research Award recognizes excellence in a student paper or digital art history project on a topic relevant to collecting or the art market.

The winners for 2015 are a team of eight UCLA students for their project "Experiments with the Getty's Provenance Data," a digital project the students completed in the spring of 2015.

The team includes Digital Humanities minors and graduate students Roderic Crooks, Haley DiPressi, Megan Driscoll, Stephanie Gorman, Sally Márquez, Tiffany Naiman, Raphael Sasayama, and Tori Schmitt.
