ARLIS/NA Announces Winners of Six 2018 Conference Travel Awards

The Conference Attendance Award supports participation in ARLIS/NA by assisting with conference attendance for committee members, chapter officers, and moderators of divisions, sections, and special interest groups. The 2018 winner is Lucy Campbell, a librarian at NewSchool of Architecture & Design and co-coordinator of the ARLIS/NA Solo Art Information Professionals Special Interest Group.

The Student Conference Attendance Award facilitates participation in ARLIS/NA by assisting students considering a career in art librarianship or visual resources with funds to attend the annual ARLIS/NA conference. The 2018 winner is Allison Comrie, a University of British Columbia student.

The Student Diversity Award for Conference Attendance was created to encourage multicultural students considering a career in art librarianship or visual resources to participate in the activities of ARLIS/NA. The 2018 winner is Rosa Celestino, a University of California, Los Angeles student.

The Howard Karno Award encourages professional development of art librarians who work to advance the study of Latin American art through interaction with ARLIS/NA colleagues and conference participation. The 2018 winner is Sarah Lorenzon Ferreira, a librarian at Universidade de São Paulo.

The Judith A. Hoffberg Student Award for Conference Attendance was created to encourage students considering a career in art librarianship or visual resources to participate in the activities of ARLIS/NA. The 2018 winner is Karly Wildenhaus, a University of California, Los Angeles student.

The ArLiSNAP New Professional Travel Award, a new award created this year by the Art Library Students & New ARLIS Professionals (ArLiSNAP) group, enables new professionals to participate in the field of art librarianship. The 2018 winner is Anders Lyon, stacks coordinator at University of San Francisco.
