### **"The Future Role of Learned Societies in Higher Education Policy"**

Stanley N. Katz, President, American Council of Learned Societies

In his keynote address, Stanley Katz will provide perspectives on educational policy in higher education, its existence (or lack thereof) in and impact on the postsecondary academic environment of the future.

His comments will encourage us to recognize distinctions between educational policy and that which often passes for it, reflect on our roles as policy researchers and framers, and acknowledge the bases upon which postsecondary policy reform must be built.

Kathryn Moore, Michigan State University, will respond to Katz's comments from an institutional policy perspective, and Edward Hines, Illinois State University, will reflect on the message from a state and federal policy viewpoint.

### **"Some Thoughts on the Future of Higher Education Research"**

In his presidential address, Patrick T. Terenzini will offer his views on some needed directions—modest and major—in higher education as a field of study as we move towards the 21st Century. The audience will be asked to participate, as well, and to offer their own perspectives on the role ASHE should play in studying, understanding, and participating in the globalization of higher education.

Don Westerheijden, University of Twente, and Ken Kempner, University of Oregon, will respond to the panel's remarks based on their own research on international issues and their efforts with the International Conference over the last several years.
