Welcome

Dear Colleagues,

We are very pleased to welcome you to the 35th annual meeting of the Association for the Study of Higher Education, the leading scholarly society composed of professors, policy makers, administrators, and others who study and research higher education. At the time of this writing, it appeared that we were headed for a record conference attendance, so thanks for helping to accomplish this milestone. Our conference this year includes over 140 sessions including those devoted to research and scholarly papers, symposia, roundtables, and posters, as well as four pre-conferences, sessions specifically designed for graduate students, and much, much more!

Our conference theme this year is: Higher Education and Public Policy: What is the Optimal Alignment? Through this focus, we seek to engage the ASHE community in reflecting on how their research can inform the crucial policy debates now swirling in our field, from those relating to the fiscal challenges and demographic changes higher education confronts to the ambitious degree attainment goals that President Obama and other prominent policy players have set for our enterprise.

Toward this end, we have organized a series of Presidential Sessions featuring topics including: the changing contemporary role of philanthropy in influencing public policy directions in higher education; public policy challenges in regulating the for-profit collegiate sector; the story of Indiana's 21st Century Scholars program and its implications for other states' efforts to increase higher education participation and attainment; the future of higher education "report cards" focused on state policy performance; strategies for increasing educational equity and success in our increasingly diverse student body; and recent developments in methodology and data sources for sophisticated empirical policy research. Finally, a special Presidential Session on Thursday, November 18 at 2:45 PM will feature an interview and discussion with new NCAA President Mark Emmert – just the second NCAA head to come from the ranks of university presidents – focusing on the challenges of melding academic missions with competitive athletics. Dr. Emmert will be interviewed by President Robert Kustra of Boise State University.

We have two very distinguished keynote speakers this year. On Friday, November 19 at 5:15 PM we will hear from Lumina Foundation for Education President, Jamie Merisotis. The Lumina Foundation is the largest philanthropy focused exclusively on higher education and is an important player in current national policy initiatives. On Saturday, November 20 at 10 AM, Dr. Eduardo Ochoa, Assistant Secretary for Postsecondary Education at the U.S. Department of Education, will address us. Dr. Ochoa is a former professor and dean in the California State University system and part of the top leadership team in a federal department and administration that has taken far more than the usual interest in higher education. Finally, we hope that many of you will be able to attend the presidential address on Thursday, November 18, at 4:30 PM. Bill will present some reflections on the public accountability of higher education – how and why expectations around accountability have changed in recent years and what the implications of these changes may be.

Finally, we would like to profoundly thank all those who worked so hard to put the conference together, no small task since we shattered previous records with 1,000+ proposal submissions this year. More than 500 reviewers were enlisted in the task of putting together the program. Our deepest thanks go to the 2010 Program Committee, ASHE Executive Director Kimberly Nehls, ASHE webmaster Dana Keith, the co-chairs of the four pre-conferences, the ASHE Awards Committee, the ASHE Dissertation of the Year Committee, the ASHE Conference Evaluation coordinators, and the hundreds of individuals who volunteered to review proposals, chair a session, or serve as a discussant.





Do you need a simple statistic from the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for the background section of your next manuscript? Would you like to do complex analyses of NCES data without getting a restricted license? This workshop will introduce attendees to the major postsecondary studies conducted by NCES, and then provide hands-on training on the use of PowerStats, a new online analysis tool that makes it easier to access nationally-representative data on postsecondary students and faculty. With a human-friendly interface, PowerStats provides functionality for both basic users and serious researchers, producing complex tables and running both linear and logistic regressions.
