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WELCOME

Dear Colleagues,

We are delighted to welcome you to the 37th annual meeting of the Association for the Study of Higher Education, the leading scholarly society for research on higher education. This year we received a total of **1280 proposals for conference sessions**, a 23% increase over last year. As the program goes to press, conference registration is over 1000, putting us on track to break our previous attendance high's. This year's conference includes 293 research papers, 49 scholarly papers, 36 symposia, 87 roundtable presentations, and 45 poster presentations in the general ASHE conference, along with four pre-conferences, graduate student sessions, presidential sessions, and keynotes. We hope you will take the time to survey the expansive "conference landscape" summarized in this program even as you choose mindfully the sessions you will actually attend. As members of this community, we all should be aware of **ASHE's** overall content and form – viewing the "big picture" of what we, as a community, are studying in November 2012. This program offers a glimpse of that. Given the research topics, perspectives, designs, and methods we work with today, what can and should the landscape of higher education research look like in future years? More to the point: What knowledge should we be striving to generate in future years? What will you contribute, and why?

This year's conference theme is **Freedom to Learn**. We suspect that each of you will interpret this phrase in light of your own interests. Here is our own starting point:

We view democracy as a social ideal. It promises us many freedoms, and along with them, the responsibility to restate those freedoms - to hammer them out again and again - as the unique challenges and possibilities of any historical era unfold, and thus as conceptions of learning also change historically, socially, culturally, aesthetically. Colleges, universities, and many other postsecondary education groups, organizations, and communities stand uniquely at the center of the historic challenge to identify, define, analyze, and thus create the conditions of and freedoms for learning that any era can offer to its inhabitants. The ability of higher education to enact this role is centered in its own freedoms as a social institution and especially in the freedoms of its core agents, its faculties and students: their freedoms to learn, to critique what they and others claim to know, and to share their understandings with still others.

What comes to our minds as we – Anna and KerryAnn – contemplate this phrase, **Freedom to Learn**? Two sets of questions:

From the perspective of learning: "Freedom to learn" in higher education broaches a number of critical questions, among them: **What exactly is learning?** What, if anything, is being learned at any moment in time? Who learns? Where, when, and how? And who does not? Whose learning - and experiences of learning - are valued and addressed, and whose are not? Who gets to engage in valued learning - or in learning that is socially prized - and, again, who does not?

From the perspective of freedom: "What exactly is freedom when applied to the many different kinds of learning that go on in higher education today?" What kinds of freedom, to learn in ways that lead to ever greater learning, inspire our own research as itself an opportunity (for us) to learn? How do our colleges and universities, and our educators, create - and sometimes neglect to create -- opportunities for students to learn? How may learners -- be they students, faculty members, leaders, or policymakers -- create such opportunities for themselves?

Regardless of which word – learning or freedom – anchors your thought, we hope you will ask what happens, in your own thinking, when you push ideas in your own work from one toward the other. We also hope that the sessions you attend, and the conversations you have, lead you to further deepen your thoughts.

We have two very special keynote addresses. **Mike Rose, Professor of Education in the Social Research Methodology** division at the University of California, Los Angeles, has spent his career as a scholar and educator sharing his insights into diverse individuals' intellectual and emotional experiences of learning. As Rose details in his highly acclaimed, award-winning books, this belief has led him to seek out "unexamined places of learning," from adult literacy courses to community college occupational programs to hair salons and lunch counters. In such spaces he finds people who are deeply and meaningfully engaged – emotionally immersed – in intellectual endeavor even as they work at jobs that historically, researchers and leaders have separated from what, to them, is "intellect." He finds that typically these people – deeply and cognitively engaged – struggle to survive outside circles of American prosperity and well-being. Rose's work raises questions of "Whose learning do we recognize, understand, and address, and whose do we miss in the study of higher education? Whose learning matters to us as researchers and educators – and why?"

Robert P. Moses is a civil rights leader and the founder and president of the Algebra Project, a national nonprofit organization that uses mathematics as an organizing tool to ensure quality public school education for every child in America. Moses observes that his work is founded on the belief that “mathematics literacy in today’s information age is as important to educational access and citizenship for inner city and rural poor middle and high school students as the right to vote was to political access and citizenship for sharecroppers and day laborers in Mississippi in the 1960s.” In seeking to foster educational access through mathematics education, Moses and the Algebra Project staff collaborate with higher education and research institutions to develop effective teacher professional development, new teacher training, and teacher certification programs. His work is a very special example of the thinking and action that can emerge when teachers, leaders, and policy makers link well-honed ideas about freedom to cutting-edge ideas about subject-matter learning.

In addition, we hope that you will be able to attend this year’s presidential address entitled, **Staking a Claim on Learning: What You Should Know About Learning in Higher Education, and Why on Thursday, November 15th, 5:15– 6:15 pm in the Mont-Royale Ballroom**. A few words about my (Anna’s) address: Learning, as a much used word, means different things depending on whose learning is at issue, what’s being learned and why, who or what mediates the learning, and the time and place of learning. Without understanding these aspects of learning, including how they interact, it is hard to think about how to improve the opportunities to learn that teachers, colleges, universities, state programs, and policies afford. In this view, it is important to recall that learning, commonly viewed as a social good and political necessity, also is a personal aspiration and need.

Finally, we extend sincere gratitude to the many who worked truly hard to create this conference. Our proposal reviewers played a central role in the association’s work this year. We warmly thank the more than 748 people who completed proposal reviews. We have benefitted greatly from your efforts, and so have the individuals whose work you reviewed. Our deepest thanks go to the **2012 Program Committee, ASHE Executive Director Kim Nehls and her staff, Dana Keith of WVNET, co-chairs and other leaders of the four pre-conferences, ASHE Awards Committee, ASHE Dissertation of the Year Committee, and ASHE Conference Evaluation Committee**. We also thank the hundreds of individuals who are serving as session discussants and chairs at this conference. We offer a special and warm thank you to **Liza Bolitzer** and **Jolie Harris Woodson** for helping to organize and publicize keynote addresses and presidential sessions, and for supporting our work in many other ways. Not least, the **ASHE Board of Directors** has served consistently as a stabilizing but critical sounding board and source of support, ideas, and energy, steering **ASHE** forward as conference planning has progressed – we thank all Board members for their thoughtful guidance.

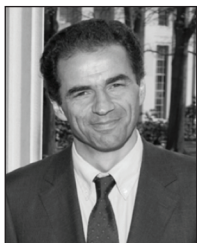

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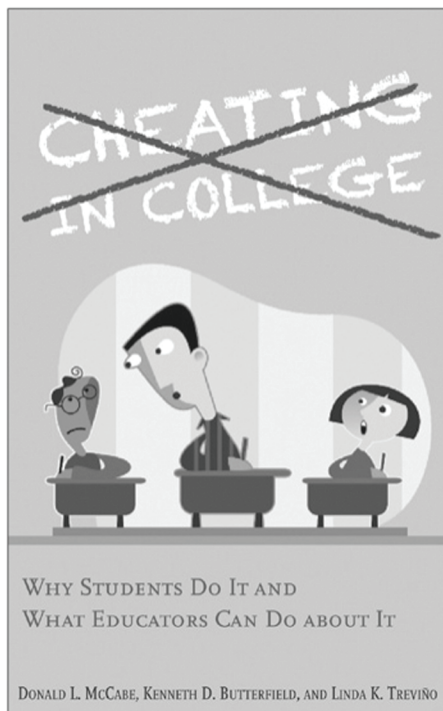

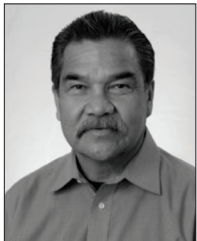

The pre-conference will review the Student Athlete Climate Study Project (SACS) which assesses the influence of campus, departmental, and team climate on three key outcomes of the intercollegiate student-athlete experience: (a) academic success, (b) athletic success, and (c) athletic identity. The workshop will involve participants in reviewing the methods, decisions regarding analyses, SEM modeling, and interpretation of results.
