Previous Legislative Victories

- 2018 FAA Reauthorization Bill
 - Joined industry stakeholders to craft and advocate for legislation to fund aviation technical workforce development (what is today the FAA workforce grant)
 - Incorporated a directive putting a timeline on part 147 promulgation
- When the deadline passed, successfully advocated for language ultimately included in COVID relief legislation directing promulgation of the industry-crafted regulation (what is now the new part 147)





2024 FAA Reauthorization

- Passed once very five-years (or so) to provide funding for the FAA
- The bill is the vehicle for big aviation policy provisions, the current text is the result of years-long collaboration with Congress and industry stakeholders
- Current FAA authorization extended through May 10 (third extension)
- Despite current differences between House and Senate versions, there is a bipartisan effort to pass a long-term bill





Workforce Provisions

(with some differences between the House and Senate)

- Directs the FAA to ensure it maintains and updates the ACS in collaboration with industry stakeholders.
- Allocates funding for the FAA workforce grant programs.
- Directs the FAA to create a military competency ACS (and associated test) to aid service member transition.
- Directs research and "evaluation" of opportunities to allow a high school student to take the general knowledge exam.





Current (and Potential) Legislative Priorities

- Ensure FAA carries out FAA reauthorization directives
- Include aviation technical programs as STEM fields across all federal agency classification systems.
- Direct certification efficiency through systematic reforms
 - Expand access to testing (written, oral, and practical)
 - Including the mechanic certificate process in a web-based system (i.e., IACRA)
