#### JSAMTCC Overview



- Program established through MOU with the FAA in 2001 and complies with FAA Airman Certification Standards (ACS)
- Provides AMTs with the COE (equivalent to the FAA form 8610-2 signed by the FSDO) for both the Airframe and Powerplant ratings
- 652 personnel completed the program in CY2023
- Program is Co-Chaired by HAF AF/A4LM and CCAF/WDPB



#### JSAMTCC Overview



- Program consists of three online Canvas courses (knowledge and risk management levels): General, Airframe, and Powerplant
- Completing the three courses the student completes a Qualifying Training Package (QTP) to meet the skill portion of the ACS
- Completing the online courses and QTP allows for the issuance of a Certificate of Eligibility and two copies of the Form 8610-2
- Now the AMT can start taking the FAA written exams and then the Oral and Practical exam



## JSAMTCC Improvements



- Attained full ACS compliance, January 2023
- Customized USCG process
- Digital Certificate of Eligibility



#### Digital COEs



- Developed by USCG, proven by DoN
- Increases security and authenticity
- Decreases processing time
- Saves money
- Increases AMT persistence towards their A&P





\*27 APPLICATIONS PER MONTH AVG


