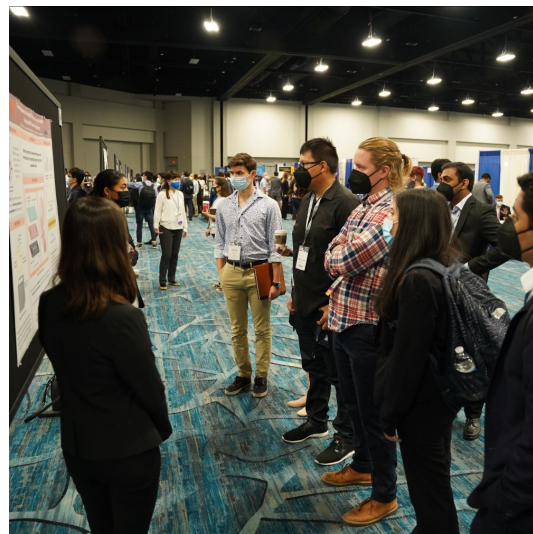
### **Plenary Session: Diversity Award Lecture, Presentation of BMES Fellows, & Herbert Voigt Distinguished Service Award**
