Honoring a Pioneer in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

Dr. A. Thomas Indresano is a true pioneer whose remarkable contributions to oral and maxillofacial surgery have spanned over 50 years. From leading and enhancing residency training programs to advocating for patient safety and the highest standards of care, Dr. Indresano has shaped the future of our specialty. His career has touched countless lives through his dedication to education, mentorship, and advocacy.

Born in Massachusetts, Dr. Indresano's academic journey began at Boston University, followed by Harvard School of Dental Medicine, and culminated in his oral and maxillofacial surgery residency at Vanderbilt University in 1974. His long-standing commitment to education and training has seen him serve as a faculty member and program director at renowned institutions across the country, including the University of Chicago, Case Western Reserve, Medical College of Wisconsin, and University of the Pacific.

A Legacy of Education and Advocacy

Dr. Indresano has left an indelible mark on oral and maxillofacial surgery, particularly through his roles as an educator and advocate. He has trained nearly 80 residents and authored over 100 publications, including textbooks, chapters, and journal articles. His advocacy for board certification and his participation in the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and American College of Surgeons set new standards for professional excellence.

In addition to his academic achievements, Dr. Indresano has held leadership positions at the national and local levels, including:

- Chairman of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency Program at Highland Hospital (Oakland, CA) for 16 years.
- President of CALAOMS in 2010.
- District VI Trustee for the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) for 6 years.
- President of AAOMS in 2019.

His leadership has strengthened our profession and ensured that the voices of oral and maxillofacial surgeons continue to resonate across healthcare policy discussions.

Distinguished Service Awardee ~ Dr. Richard Robert

Dr. Richard Robert, who unfortunately passed away in November of 2023, is being honored with our Distinguished Service Award. His contribution to the profession of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery is immense and transcended beyond just surgical skills of a brilliant surgeon. His patients knew they could trust him not only for his surgical abilities, but for his kindness, empathy, and unwavering dedication to their health and comfort.

Dr. Robert was also a trailblazer in the fields of anesthesia and emergency preparedness. During his residency in Michigan, he was instrumental in obtaining and utilizing Brevitol in an outpatient setting for the first time. His quest for improving approach to safety, efficiency, and patient experience in Anesthesia led to the first ever "HANDS-ON" emergency course with staff in the early 1980s. His contributions to improving protocols and practices in these areas were a testament to his foresight and his unyielding pursuit of excellence not only in his local practice, but on a state level with CALAOMS and a national level with AAOMS. This led to numerous awards including Educator of the Year from AAOMS, the Distinguished Service Award (two times now), and Committee Member of the Year (three times) from CALAOMS. Dr. Robert also had a profound impact as an

educator at the University of California, San Francisco, where he was given the Distinguished Colleague Award. Beyond the clinical work, he was deeply committed to passing on his knowledge, wisdom, and passion for the profession and safety of OMFS to the next generation of doctors. He lectured with Art Curley on many M and M/anesthesia conferences and Risk Management courses.

Today, we can imagine Dr. Robert is in heaven-still NOT sleeping but always fresh as a "Daisy," PowerPoint with Sharknado video in hand, organizing emergency drills with his characteristic precision, humor, and "John Denver glasses."

The world may have lost a great man, but his influence will live on in the countless surgeons, colleagues, and patients he touched throughout his remarkable career. He's likely already inspired a team of angels, ensuring that even paradise is prepared for anything.

OBEAM is part of the AAOMS National Simulation Program designed to nationally standardize OMFS airway management & safety. <u>By 2026, this will be a MANDATORY requirement for all AAOMS members.</u>

To register for the OBEAM Course, you must be a Fellow or Member of AAOMS, and register through CALAOMS in conjunction with our 25th Annual Meeting.


Come master your skills on special mannequins that simulate a human being and evaluate your strengths and identify areas you need to improve.

Synopsis of Presentation:

Provision of anxiolysis and anesthesia to our patients remains a cornerstone of our practices. Our training is geared towards learning and maintaining those skills in open-airway general anesthesia for the entire OMS team. Despite a proven record of safety, the OMS anesthesia model is constantly challenged. What are our strengths and weaknesses, opportunities and threats and how can we continue to preserve our anesthesia model? The second lecture will discuss the importance of in-situ mock drills practicing emergencies in the office with your team using your own equipment and the power of eliminating "near misses".



Bio: Deepak Krishnan is the Chief of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Cincinnati and at the Cincinnati Children's Hospital. He is a Professor of Surgery at the College of Medicine there, where he teaches and practices. Dr. Krishnan obtained his dental degree from Bangalore University, India, and trained in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Emory University's College of Medicine in Atlanta, Georgia. Upon completion of the residency, Dr. Krishnan pursued further fellowship training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, focusing on orthognathic surgery at Dalhousie University, Halifax, Canada.

He is director of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (ABOMS). He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons (ACS). He currently serves on the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (AAOMS) Committee on Anesthesia (CAN) as a consultant on Simulation.



Synopsis of Presentation, which will address:

Short History about simulation for application to highly dynamic and intrinsically risky activities - i.e. invasive procedures (including anesthesia / maxillofacial surgery and dentistry)

Fundamental Concepts of "Crisis Resource Management" - key goal of many simulations

<u>Bio:</u> David M. Gaba, MD has been a faculty member at Stanford School of Medicine for over 41 years in the Department of Anesthesiology (with tenure for the last 25 years). Since 2004 he has also been Associate Dean for Immersive and Simulationbased Learning. At VA Palo Alto Healthcare System, he is the Founder and Director for nearly four decades of its Simulation Center, and he has been a Staff Physician there for over 41 years. Over the last 38 years, Dr. Gaba, with various colleagues, fellows, and students, has worked extensively on human performance and patient safety issues. His laboratory invented the modern patient simulator and adapted Crew Resource Management training from aviation to healthcare. He authored 150 journal articles and 30 book chapters, and is lead author of the well-known book "Crisis Management in Anesthesiology" (3rd edition estimated fall 2025).



Synopsis of Presentation:

Implementing modern simulation equipment and teaching techniques in the dental setting is much more than simply purchasing a rubber doll and telling your team members to go save the patient because they are *dying*. Clinical simulation is a tool, or a method, that the skilled educator can use to uncover hidden deficiencies, and latent patient-safety threats, while also bringing introspection and revelation to each participant, in a safe setting. We will discuss how this tool for teaching and learning is being implemented at the Dugoni school for predoctoral education, as well as the clinical practice of the department of OMS.

1. Discuss training pathways to become a certified simulationist and educator

2. Describe the implementation of a medical simulation program in a dental school

3. Describe the use of medical simulation techniques to prepare a dental team

4. Discuss the importance of debriefing for live and simulation critical events

<u>Bio:</u> Dr. Jesse Manton is a graduate of UOP Dugoni in 2014, VA Palo Alto GPR in 2015, VASF Advanced Clinical Simulation Fellowship in 2016, and Ohio State University Dental Anesthesiology in 2019. He is currently the Chief of the Division of Anesthesiology & Perioperative Care in the Department of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of the Pacific Arthur A. Dugoni School of Dentistry in San Francisco, CA, where he serves as an innovator and passionate medical educator for students and residents, and provides general anesthesia and perioperative care services in the school's OMS SurgiCenter.
