Synopsis of Presentation:

Osteonecrosis of the jaws (MRONJ) is a devastating complication of antiresorptive medications utilized for benign and malignant disorders of bone metabolism. MRONJ is defined as exposed, necrotic bone in the maxillofacial region that has persisted for more than eight weeks in a patient with current or previous bisphosphonate treatment, without a history of radiation therapy to the jaws. ONJ was first identified in 2003 and 2004, and its prevalence is reported between 0.8-12%. Difficulties with diagnosis, prevention and treatment exist, often making OMSs uncomfortable recognizing and treating patients on these medications. This lecture will discuss current controversies in the management of MRONJ, including review of the 2022 AAOMS Position Paper. Do the experts agree? Does your clinical management align with current recommendations? How do I treat patients who need dentoalveolar and implant surgery, when they are taking antiresorptive medications? Find out in this interesting discussion of pathogenesis, diagnosis, prevention, and treatment options with new insights and protocols that can be taken back to your office or university the next morning. *Learning Objectives:*

- updates on prevalence and etiology of medication-related osteonecrosis of the jaws
- strategies to prevent MRONJ development in patients with cancer and osteoporosis
- discuss treatment and management in patients with MRONJ

Bio: Dr. Tara Aghaloo is a Professor in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the UCLA School of Dentistry. She completed her dental training at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, and Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery residency, M.D., and PhD in Oral Biology at UCLA. She is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, and her practice focuses on bone and soft tissue regeneration, dental implant surgery, and medication-related osteonecrosis of the jaws (MRONJ). She is also active in professional organizations where she is the Associate Editor for the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, author on the 2014 and 2022 AAOMS Position Paper on MRONJ, and Past-President of the Academy of Osseointegration (AO).

Bio: Dr. Joel Epstein is currently Professor of Surgery, Department of Surgery, Cedars-Sinai Health System, Los Angeles, CA and Medical Director, Dental Oncology Service, Division of Surgery, City of Hope National Medical Center, Duarte, CA. He is a Fellow of the College of Dental Surgeons of Canada in Oral Medicine/Oral Pathology and a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral Medicine and was an examiner and President of the Board of Oral Medicine. He conducts a private referral practice in Oral Medicine and Oral Oncology (Oralmedicinepacific.com). Dr. Epstein is highly published in oral oncology, infectious disease, facial pain and general areas of Oral Medicine, with more than nine hundred contributions to the literature including in osteonecrosis including osteoradionecrosis and medication-related ONJ.


Faculty Positions:


