**Course Overview: This course is designed to help doctors and staff manage emergencies that may arise in the OMS office.**

#### **Hands-On Experience for the OMS Emergency Team**

This course emphasizes the TEAM approach for managing medical and anesthetic emergencies in the office setting. An effective team approach is essential for preventing morbidity and mortality. This course will focus on an organized treatment approach for scenarios included in the State of California's - General Anesthesia exam. A brief morning lecture will cover updated material in the diagnosis and management of the 13 scenarios tested by the State.

The larger portion of the day will be spent in breakout session. Instructors, consisting of experienced medical emergency lecturers and ACLS instructors, will share their expertise and help prepare your office and staff for emergency preparedness planning.

#### **Topics Covered:**

- Airway management of respiratory depression, reactive disease (laryngospasm, bronchospasm), and portions of the OBEAM as it applies to the team approach to supporting the airway.
- Treatment of emesis and aspiration, allergic reactions, hypoglycemia, hyper/hypotension, syncope and seizure patients.
- Team approach to quick recognition and treatment of cardiac dysrhythmias.

#### **Breakout Sessions:**

- Realistic manikin training for placement of oral/nasal pharyngeal airway, LMA, endotracheal tube, and performing a cricothyrotomy.
- Simulated medical emergency scenarios with doctor and staff utilizing the team approach to establish a diagnosis and simulate treatment.
- Hands-on drug identification with practice in drug dilution.
- Hands-on use of the glucometer and other equipment from the emergency kit.
