



## FIREFIGHTERS ARE AT RISK.

The first ever Firefighter Skin Cancer Screening took place in Boston; a local dermatologist, Dr. Christine Kannler, lost her brother, a Firefighter, to workplace cancer. Research shows that firefighters in the United States are **9%** more likely to be diagnosed with cancer and **14%** more likely to die of cancer compared with age-matched cohorts. Furthermore, melanoma can occur in 30 to 49 year old male firefighters

Determined to create easy access to skin cancer screenings, Dr. Kannler began providing Free Skin Cancer Screenings to her local fire station. **One year later**, CalDerm is thrilled to support the work of Dr. Kannler in our fire-threatened state. Having hosted our first screening in August, we are preparing to firefighters across California in the coming months.

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### THE HOW

CalDerm recruits member dermatologists to screen at a firestation in their community.



### THE SCREEN

In less than five minutes, firefighters who choose to be screened, complete their screening.



### AFTER THE SCREEN

If needed, firefighters are provided a dermatologists in their community to receive further care.
