- If you have home or renter's insurance first file a claim with the insurance company, then register with FEMA.
- You can register with FEMA even if you do not have home or renter's insurance.

- Watch Duty Wildfires App It alerts the user of wildfires and firefighting efforts in real-time.
- **Genasys Protect**: Recommended by the L.A. Fire Captain for up-to-date evacuation data and tracking.
