The Aspire: The Academy for Next Generation Association Leadership is designed to train the next generation of association leaders. It does this by focusing on current and effective practices that will build your knowledge, challenge your thinking, while expanding your network of peers.

You can expect to:

- Walk away with a deeper understanding of what makes an association "remarkable", and how your association compares
- Access leaders in the association space; build your network and community your tribe
- Have a safe space to air challenges and concerns on your leadership journey
- Build your skills to lead change and develop buy-in
- Develop new opportunities when viewing associations as social movements and community-centered organizations
- Explore modern best practice strategies such as "belongingness" and "emotional intelligence" to engage staff and members throughout the organization

The Academy will also use industry benchmarks of success, particularly the learning domains of the Certified Association Executive and ASAE's "The Seven Measures of Success".

The Academy Framework & CAE Credits

The Academy is a 3-month course of study (February through April) that begins with an in-person kick-off learning day and followed by three online topical roundtables, each two hours in length. Having the benefit of a diverse volunteer faculty of outstanding Association leaders and previous graduates of the programs, the Academy will include lecture, individual and group exercises, small group discussion, and roundtables that will lead to a Certificate of Completion.

The entire program offers 12 hours of instruction and is eligible for 12 hours of education towards earning or maintaining the CAE designation.

The Academy Experience

The Aspire: The Academy for Next Generation Association Leadership has been constructed using a generative learning model that presents a series of concepts, allows space for reaction and contemplation, group dialogue, and then decision-making about application of the shared learning to individual circumstances. Each session will include:

- A Framing of the agenda based on a set of questions to be address and considered
- Delivery of specific content modules related to the subject based on readings and cited sources
- Informed Expert Opinion or Cameo Speaker from Academy faculty members about their personal experiences and professional points of view
- Peer-Led Small-Group Discussion
- Facilitated Large-Group Discussion
- Consensus and Recording of Agreements, Conclusions and Commitments

The following are examples of generative learning questions that will be addressed during the Academy:

- What is the research telling us about the future of association?
- What are the "truths" about leading successful associations in the future?
- What will be the attributes and core competencies needed by next generation leaders of successful member-based organization?
- Are the traditional Seven Measures of Remarkable Association still relevant?
- What happens when concepts of social movements and community-centered management are applied to professional and trade associations?
- What is the relevance of Emotional Intelligence in remarkable association leadership today?
- How is belongingness in an association differ from belonging to an association?
- What has the past three years taught us about movements, advocacy, and activism?

Throughout the Academy, scholars will be encouraged to reach out to one another to share their association and Academy experiences while building an alumni community that will continue. Scholars will also have the opportunity to reach out to faculty members as thought partners to further discuss their Academy experience, ask questions and seek advice about their associations and careers.
