

## **Report of the Fifty-Second General Meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America**

The fifty-second meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America was held August 14-17, 1989, at Le Moyne College, Syracuse, New York. Kevin G. O'Connell, S.J., president of the college, welcomed the members of the association. James M. Reese, O.S.F.S., vice president of the association, then introduced Joseph Blenkinsopp, who delivered the presidential address, "A Jewish Sect of the Persian Period."

*Sessions of Wednesday, August 16*

The task forces and continuing seminars resumed their work during the first part of the morning. Two simultaneous sessions then heard presentations by Frederick J. Murphy, "The Theology and Purpose of Pseudo-Philo," and by Benedict T. Viviano, O.P., "The Genres of Matthew 1-2, Light from 1 Tim 1:4." Mary Margaret Pazdan, O.P., was the presider and homilist at the midday Service of the Word.

The general session in the afternoon listened to a panel discussion on "The Humanity of Jesus." The moderator was Don C. Benjamin, and the panelists were Adela Yarbrow Collins, John P. Galvin of the CTSA, and Bernard B. Scott.

CBA President Joseph Blenkinsopp called the annual business meeting to order at 4:00 P.M. Myles M. Bourke gave the report of the chair of the Board of Trustees. Aloysius Fitzgerald, F.S.C., then presented the treasurer's report, the substance of which had been previously distributed to the members present.

Joseph Jensen, O.S.B., gave the report of the executive secretary. He thanked Kevin G. O'Connell, S.J., and the Committee on Local Arrangements for their tireless and very successful efforts to provide a well-organized and smooth meeting. He reported on some of last year's activities and described the association's history of grants. Since 1966 the association has distributed more than \$320,000 in grants. For this year the Executive Board has approved the following grants: (a) an increase in the number of Memorial Stipends from five to ten and an increase in the amount from \$2,000 to \$3,000 each, retroactive for this year; (b) an increase in the stipend for the CBA Visiting Professorships at the Ecole Biblique and the Pontifical Biblical Institute from \$6,000 to \$8,000 plus travel expenses (however, upon the recommendation of the Committee on Visiting Professors, the President and the Executive Secretary may adjust this amount to meet the applicant's needs); (c) an increase in the stipend for the Young Scholars Fellowships from \$8,000 to \$10,000; (d) \$5,000 for the *Elenchus of Biblica*; (e) three Research Stipends in Archaeology, a new category of grant, in the amount of \$2,000 each (fulltime students in biblical doctoral or S.S.L. programs or those who have received the doctorate or the S.S.L. in the last five years and who have received provisional acceptance to a dig of high quality may apply for these grants); (f) \$1,000 for the translation project of the *Studium Biblicum Franciscanum*; (g) a tithe of membership dues (\$2,484) for famine relief; (h) \$10,000 for the archaeological dig at Tell Nimrin. The Executive Board has voted to give \$1,000 to the Ecole Biblique's centennial celebration and to send a representative to the celebration. It voted to obtain the *RSR* for members for the coming year and named Richard Sklba to the Board of Trustees. Jensen reminded the membership that the 1990 meeting will be held August 13-16, 1990, at the University of Notre Dame; and he announced that the 1991 meeting will be held at Loyola Marymount College, Los Angeles, August 12-15, 1991. Finally, he reminded the members that they should seek invitations from their academic institutions for future meetings. A discussion regarding the timing of future meetings of the association showed that a majority prefer a Saturday through Tuesday arrangement. The discussion concluded with a recommendation that the Executive Board should bring a proposal before the membership at the next meeting of the association.

John S. Kselman, S.S., gave the report of the editor of the *CBQ* on the number of articles published, accepted, rejected, or in process, and book reviews.

Thomas P. McCreesh, O.P., gave the report of the editor of *OTA*. The decennial index is being prepared. McCreesh noted the steady progress of the publication, the need for an abstractor who reads Russian, and the increase in the number of book abstracts. He concluded by thanking his abstractors and indexers for their labors.

Robert J. Karris, O.F.M., gave the report of the editor of the *CBQMS*. As of August 16, 1989, seven MSS have been received; of these, two have been published: John J. Clabeaux, *A Lost Edition of the Letters of Paul: A Reassessment of the Text of the Pauline Corpus Attested by Marcion* (*CBQMS* 21) and Craig R. Koester, *The Dwelling of God: The Tabernacle in the Old Testament, Intertestamental Jewish Literature, and the New Testament* (*CBQMS* 22); one is being evaluated, two were not recommended, and two were not considered for evaluation because they were unrevised dissertations, which *CBQMS* does not publish. Karris thanked his associate editors for their work and urged the membership's support by "word, work, and wallet."

Joseph Jensen, O.S.B., gave a report on the NAB Psalter Revision. The editorial board of Richard J. Clifford, S.J., Aloysius Fitzgerald, F.S.C., Joseph Jensen, O.S.B. (chair), Roland E. Murphy, O.Carm., Irene Nowell, O.S.B., and Judith E. Sanderson, has met monthly to review the submissions of the revisors. The revision will result in improvements in three areas: the scientific accuracy of the translation, the use of inclusive language, and its suitability for liturgical use in singing and reading.

Joseph A. Fitzmyer, S.J., gave a report on the *New Jerome Biblical Commentary*.

The list of candidates for membership in the association was not read, since it had been available to the members throughout the meeting. In the name of the committee on credentials, Alexander A. Di Lella, O.F.M., recommended the following candidates:

### **Executive Secretary Honored**

Rev. Joseph Jensen, O.S.B., the Executive Secretary of the Catholic Biblical Association, was recently honored by the Papal Benemerenti medal, presented by Cardinal James A. Hickey, Chancellor of the Catholic University of America, for his service to the University and to the Church.

### **CBA Research Stipends in Archaeology**

As announced more briefly elsewhere in this issue (see report on the business session of the annual CBA meeting) the CBA is inaugurating a new type of grant, the purpose of which is to subsidize participation in summer archaeological excavations by young biblical scholars. The following conditions are provisional and subject to revision. The amount of each grant is \$2,000, renewable for a second year. Candidates must be either full-time students working toward the doctorate (or the S.S.L.) in biblical studies or a related area with a biblical dimension or have received the doctorate (or S.S.L.) in these areas within the last five years. They must have been already accepted, at least provisionally, for a specific, high quality dig and be without means to finance their participation. They will be required to submit a description of an area of inquiry they personally intend to pursue in conjunction with the dig or at



least a description of what they expect to learn from participation in the dig. Two letters of recommendation in support of their application will be required. Candidates who receive awards will be expected to report on their participation in the dig within two months of the end of the field experience.
