

## **Report of the Fifty-ninth General Meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America**

The Fifty-ninth General Meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America was held August 10–13, 1996, at the University of St. Thomas, St. Paul, Minnesota. The opening general session was held on Saturday evening, August 10. Daniel J. Harrington, S.J., introduced Lawrence E. Boadt, C.S.P., president of the association, who delivered the presidential address, “The Poetry of Prophetic Persuasion.”

### *Sessions on Sunday, August 11*

The morning concluded with papers presented in two simultaneous sessions by Christopher Begg, "Two Rereadings of the Massacre of the Priests of Nob (1 Samuel 21-22): Josephus and Pseudo-Philo," and Ronald D. Witherup, S.S., "Acts 13:4-12 and the Lucan Portrait of Paul."

The Most Reverend Harry J. Flynn, Archbishop of Saint Paul and Minneapolis, was presider and homilist at the eucharistic liturgy at midday.

At the evening general session, Michael L. Barré, S.S., presented "Amos 5:26; 8:14 and the Redaction of the Book of Amos."

#### *Sessions on Monday, August 12*

The task forces and continuing seminars resumed their work during the first part of the morning. Two simultaneous sessions then heard presentations by Agustinus K. Gianto, S.J., "Historical Linguistics and the Hebrew Bible," and PHEME PERKINS,

"Disciplining the Tongue: Paraenesis on Speech in the New Testament." Carol Dempsey, O.P., presided at midday prayer.

The afternoon general session was devoted to a panel discussion on "Feminist Hermeneutics: The Maturing of a Field." The moderator was Anthony J. Saldarini, and the panelists were Amy-Jill Levine, Kathleen O'Connor and Marie-Eloise Rosenblatt, R.S.M.

Lawrence E. Boadt, C.S.P., president of the association, called the annual business meeting to order at 4:10 P.M. Emil Wcela, chair of the board of trustees, reported on the healthy financial situation of the association. The board of trustees has completed and approved a set of procedures, objectives, and ethical guidelines for the association's investments. Aloysius Fitzgerald, F.S.C., treasurer of the association, presented the treasurer's report, the substance of which was distributed to the members present at the business meeting.

Joseph Jensen, O.S.B., gave the report of the executive secretary, beginning with thanks to the local arrangements committee and all those who contributed to the success of this year's meeting. The executive board approved or reaffirmed the following grants: (a) \$10,000 plus travel expenses for the visiting professor at the Ecole Biblique; (b) \$33,000 for memorial stipends; (c) \$20,000 plus travel expenses for the Young Scholars' fellowship program; (d) \$6,000 for the continuation of the archaeological research stipends program; (e) \$2,000 for the Japanese translation project of the Studium Biblicum Franciscanum; (f) \$3,977 (a tithe of membership dues) for famine relief; (g) \$17,500 for the archaeological project at Tell Qarqur; (h) \$17,000 for the archaeological project at Tell Mozan (Urkesh); (i) \$10,000 to the Ecole Biblique in Jerusalem for the renovation of their library. The board voted to continue to supply the *Religious Studies Review* to members of the association who live in the United States and Canada.

Following up on last year's discussion of possible ways to increase the participation of biblical scholars from Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and Latin America in the annual meetings of the association, the executive board announced two initiatives:

1. The sum of \$3,000 has been set aside to assist CBA members from Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and Latin America who would otherwise find it difficult to attend the annual meeting. Preference will be given to those applicants who propose a research report according to the usual procedures and whose proposals are accepted by the program committee. A committee has been established to evaluate applications from such members and to allocate the funds.

2. Members are invited to offer names of established biblical scholars from Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and Latin America for presentation of major papers at the annual meeting of the association. The normal rules will apply for such things as deadlines, no more than one scholar will be asked to do this in a given year, and all invitations will be at the discretion of the program committee. Those nominated need not be members of the CBA, but preference will be given to members.

Both initiatives will be evaluated after four years.

The executive board received a request from the Canon Law Society of America for a response to that society's study *The Canonical Implications of Ordaining Women to the Permanent Diaconate*. Carol Stockhausen was appointed to form a committee

to formulate a response. The executive board reappointed Claude J. Peifer, O.S.B., to the board of trustees and appointed William J. Fulco, S.J., to the archaeology committee. Congratulations were extended in the name of the association to Robert F. O'Toole, S.J., on his appointment as rector of the Pontifical Biblical Institute.

Father Jensen reported on the status of the project to revise the NAB translation of the Old Testament: to date, thirty manuscript revisions have been received by the steering committee, and eight books have been completely reviewed by the editorial board. He also announced that the CBA now has a home page on the World Wide Web. Its URL is <http://www.cua.edu/www/org/cbib>. It contains a short history of the association, its constitution and bylaws, and a current listing of officers and committees, as well as information on publications, the annual meeting, membership, grants, and fellowships. The 1997 meeting of the CBA will be held at Seattle University from August 9–12, and the 1998 meeting will take place from August 8–11 at the University of Scranton.

Christopher T. Begg gave the report of the editor of *OTA*. The February and June issues of *OTA* 19 (1996) have appeared. The February issue contains a total of 644 abstracts; of these, 574 are abstracts of articles from journals, festschrifts, or collected essays, while 70 are book abstracts. The June issue contains 661 abstracts, of which 536 are of articles and 125 of books. During 1996 *OTA* has begun abstracting 11 additional journals for a total of approximately 345. The material of *OTA* from February 1992 to June 1995 is now available on CD-ROM. Information about ordering the CD-ROM can be found in the Editor's Notes of the February 1996 issue.

Michael L. Barré, S.S., gave the report of the editor of *CBQMS*. In the last year, one manuscript has appeared in print, John Kaltner's book *The Use of Arabic in Biblical Hebrew Lexicography* (*CBQMS* 28). Another volume is in preparation and should appear sometime next year. One recently received manuscript has been sent out for review. Several other manuscripts are under consideration.

Aelred Cody, O.S.B., gave the report of the editor of the *CBQ*. By the end of the current year, 22 articles will have been published. Of the 80 manuscripts received in the past year, one has been published (the presidential address), 12 have been accepted, and 51 have been rejected, 14 are in process, and 2 were withdrawn.

Lawrence E. Boadt then announced that at the meeting of the *CBQ* editorial board, Aelred Cody had been reelected to a four-year term as general editor of the *CBQ*.

Fischer, C.M., proposed a resolution thanking the University of St. Thomas for their hospitality and the local arrangements committee and all who contributed to the success of this year's meeting. The resolution was approved by the unanimous voice vote of the members present.

Under new business, the members present unanimously approved the executive board's proposed amendment of the association's Bylaws, as follows: Bylaw 5 to read: "A contribution of \$1,000 will qualify a person for life membership"; Bylaw 6 to read: "A contribution of \$5,000 or more will entitle a person to be honored as a Patron."

The meeting was adjourned at 5:10 P.M.
