

Report of the Sixty-fourth International Meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America

The sixty-fourth international meeting of the Catholic Biblical Association of America was held August 4–7, 2001, at Seton Hall University, South Orange, New Jersey. The opening general session was held on Saturday evening, August 4. Francis J. Moloney, S.D.B., vice-president of the association, introduced Msgr. Robert T. Sheeran, president of Seton Hall University, who warmly welcomed the members of the association. Dianne Bergant, C.S.A., president of the association, then delivered the presidential address, “The Challenge of Hermeneutics: Lamentations 1: A Case Study.”

Sessions on Sunday, August 5

Sessions on Monday, August 6

The task forces and continuing seminars resumed their work in the morning. Two simultaneous sessions then heard presentations by Leslie J. Hoppe, O.F.M., "The Afterlife of a Text: The Case of Solomon's Prayer in 1 Kings 8," and Bonnie B. Thurston, "Paul on the Damascus Road: Study of the New Testament and of Christian Spirituality."

Mary Margaret Pazdan, O.P., presided and preached at our midday prayer.

The general session in the afternoon listened to a panel discussion on "Translating the Bible Today." The moderator was Richard J. Sklba, and the panelists were Richard J. Clifford, S.J.; Barclay Newman; and James P. M. Walsh, S.J. CBA president Dianne Bergant, C.S.A., called the annual business meeting to order at 4:10 P.M. Richard J. Sklba gave the report of the chair of the Board of Trustees on the healthy financial situation of the association. He reminded the membership that the guidelines used for investing the association's assets include the production of an income stream to support the ongoing work of the association, especially the numerous grants that the association makes annually to scholarly projects. In accord with a policy announced in the past, the association places up to ten percent of its investments in special projects that promote economic justice and positive social change. Lawrence E. Boadt, C.S.P., treasurer of the association, then presented the treasurer's report, the substance of which had been previously distributed to the members present.

Joseph Jensen, O.S.B., gave the report of the executive secretary. He thanked all who contributed to the success of this year's meeting, in particular the Local Arrangements Committee, the Program Committee, and the Liturgy Committee. He urged the members of the association to submit their email addresses to the executive secretary, so that the members can be informed promptly of any association business. The Executive Board approved or reaffirmed the following grants: (a) three CBA scholarships, as previously

established; (b) \$30,000 for ten Memorial Stipends; (c) \$40,000 for two Young Scholars' Fellowships; (d) \$18,000 for the dig at Tell Mozan/Urkesh; (e) \$40,000 plus travel expenses for the Visiting Professorships at the Pontifical Biblical Institute and the Ecole Biblique; (f) \$9,000 for three archaeological research stipends; (g) \$2,000 for the Japanese translation project of the Studium Biblicum Franciscanum; (h) a tithe of membership dues for famine relief; (i) \$22,000 for the archaeological project at Tell Qarqur; (j) \$10,000 to the Ecole Biblique in Jerusalem toward the renovation of their library; (k) \$5,000 to the Dead Sea Scrolls Foundation. The Board also voted to continue three other commitments: to subsidize travel to the CBA meeting for a scholar from the developing world to present a major paper at the annual meeting, to provide a travel grant fund for CBA members from some other countries, and to subscribe to the *Religious Studies Review* for members of the association. Jensen also announced that the Executive Board voted to open what has been a Young Scholars Fellowships program more broadly, to make it available to experienced scholars as well. Henceforth it will be known as the "CBA Fellowship" program. The Committee on Scholarships will be asked to review other institutions to see if they too might qualify for scholarships, and to review the guidelines for the selection of recipients of the awards. The Committee on Visiting Professors will be asked to consider the feasibility of developing a CBA Visiting Scholars Program to subsidize lectures, workshops, and the like for colleges and seminaries that would make the benefits of our professional training more widely available to such institutions. The board also decided to raise the subscription price of *CBQ* to twenty nine dollars. An increase in membership dues is contemplated as well, to be presented to the membership at next year's meeting. The Board elected Mary Rose D'Angelo to the Board of Trustees, and appointed Steven L. McKenzie to the Archaeology Committee, Gale Yee to the Committee on Stipends and Fellowships, and named Frederick J. Murphy to chair that committee. Jensen informed the members that the Executive Board had discussed issues that arise as a result of the recent Roman document *Liturgiam authenticam*, and announced that several articles are forthcoming by members in a variety of journals (Richard J. Clifford, S.J., in *CBQ* and Joseph Jensen, O.S.B. in *America*, as well as articles by Bishops Trautman and Skiba). He urged all members of the association to read the document, and to give it careful consideration. The CBA addressed a letter and an article to the USCCB in regard to the document's implications. Jensen reminded the members that the 2002 meeting will be at John Carroll University, Cleveland, Ohio; the dates will be August 3–6. The meeting in the year 2003 will be at the University of San Francisco, San Francisco, California, from August 2 to 5. Finally, Jensen informed the members that work on the revision of the NAB Old Testament is nearly completed.

Richard J. Dillon gave the report of the editor of the *CBQ*. By the end of the current volume, *CBQ* will have published approximately 28 articles. Sixty-five articles were received in twelve months. Of these, 10 have been accepted, 37 rejected, and 18 are in process. By the July, 2001 issue, *CBQ* will have published approximately 179 book reviews.

In the absence of Christopher T. Begg, Joseph Jensen, O.S.B., gave the report of the editor of *OTA*. Both the February and July, 2001, issues have appeared and the October issue is at the printer's. The first two issues of the year have published 1,352 article abstracts, 214 book abstracts, and 2 computer software abstracts.

Mark S. Smith gave the report of the editor of CBQMS. Volume 32 in the series is on display at this meeting, and will appear in the Fall; four more volumes are in process of publication. In the last year, one manuscript was received and rejected. Smith urged the members to submit manuscripts, particularly in New Testament studies, for consideration.

Frizzell, the Program Committee, the Liturgy Committee, and all whose efforts made this year's meeting such a success. The membership approved the resolution by unanimous voice vote.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:15 P.M.
