# Fall Project Guide Board Art



### Give Thanks Board Art Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Wooden board, 10" square, stained or painted Brown Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Assorted brushes
Leaf stencil
Sponge
Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Green, Yellow Gold, Orange, Purple, Off White, Red, White, Cinnamon

#### **Directions**

- 1. Transfer the lettering pattern to the board.
- 2. Paint the first line of words Green.
- 3. Paint the second line Yellow Gold.
- 4. Paint the third line Orange.
- 5. Paint the fourth line Purple.
- 6. Paint the fifth line Off White.
- 7. Paint the sixth line Red.
- 8. Paint the seventh line Orange. Outline the letters with White, then add Yellow Gold dots inside each letter.
- 9. Paint the last line of words Cinnamon. Allow to dry.
- 10. Lay the leaf stencil along the top and side of the board. Use a sponge dipped in a combination of Yellow Gold, Orange, and Red to paint individual leaves. Allow to dry.
- 11. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

#### Pumpkins and Mums Board Art Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Wooden board, 10" square, stained Brown Pattern Graphite paper Pencil Assorted brushes Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Orange, Yellow Gold, Paprika, Burnt Umber, Deep Red, Leaf Green, White

#### **Directions**

- 1. Transfer the pattern to the board.
- 2. Paint the top pumpkin Orange. Allow to dry.
- 3. Paint the bottom pumpkin in a combination of Orange and Yellow Gold. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the outline of each pumpkin section of both pumpkins in Paprika. These are elongated C-shaped strokes coming off of either side of the center of the pumpkins.
- 5. Paint the stem Burnt Umber. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the 4 mums with circular strokes in Yellow Gold. Allow to dry.
- 7. Paint the remaining mums in Deep Red. Allow to dry.
- 8. Paint the leaves in Leaf Green. Allow to dry.
- 9. Paint Burnt Umber accents on the pumpkins and leaves. Allow to dry.
- 10. Paint White swirly accents in the mums and on the stem.
- 11. Paint White dots scattered around the mums. Allow to dry.
- 12. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

### Thanksgiving Cross Wood Hanger Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Wooden cross with center plaque Pencil Swirly leaf rubber stamp Assorted brushes Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Off White, Burnt Orange, Green, Metallic Gold, Burnt Umber

#### **Directions**

- 1. With a pencil, mark off the borders of the center plaque.
- 2. Paint the plaque area Off White. Allow to dry.
- 3. Outline the plaque in Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the cross Green. Allow to dry.
- 5. Stamp the swirly leaf design in Off White on the cross. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint Metallic Gold accents on the swirls and on the inside edge of the plaque area. Allow to dry.
- 7. Use Burnt Umber to paint the word "grateful" inside the plaque. Allow to dry.
- 8. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

Bird on a Pumpkin Canvas Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Canvas: 9"x12"

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes Decoupage medium



Off White, Burnt Orange, Orange, Paprika, Brown, Green, Black, Yellow Gold, Burnt Umber, White

#### **Directions**

- 1. Paint the whole canvas Off White. Allow to dry.
- 2. Transfer the pattern to the canvas.
- 3. Paint the outline of the pumpkin sections in Burnt Orange.
- 4. Paint in the individual sections of the pumpkin with long vertical strokes in Orange, and then add strokes in Paprika closer to the Burnt Orange outline. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the pumpkin stem Brown. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the leaves Green. Allow to dry.
- 7. Paint the bird Black.
- 8. Paint the birds' beak and feet Yellow Gold. Allow to dry.
- 9. Dry-brush the background with some Yellow Gold.
- 10. Paint the lines stem, vines, leaf veins, and bird outline in Burnt Umber.
- 11. Paint White highlights on the lower half of the pumpkin.
- 12. Mix 1 part Black and 1 part White to make gray for the bird's wing. Allow to dry.
- 13. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

Cozy Fox Canvas Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Canvas: 9"x12"

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes Paisley rubber stamp

Sponge

3"x14" strip of felt or fleece with both ends fringed

Glue

Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Yellow Gold, Paprika, White Black, Off White

#### **Directions**

- 1. Transfer the pattern onto the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background Yellow Gold. Allow to dry.
- 3. Paint the fox body, the top half of the face, and the lower part of the tail Paprika. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the lower part of the face, the tip of the tail, and the inside of the ears White. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the nose and eyes Black. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint a White dot in the center of each eye.
- 7. Sponge some Off White on the stamp and stamp the paisley design all around the fox, being careful to keep it off the fox. Allow to dry.
- 8. Knot the strip of fabric to suggest a scarf. Glue the scarf on the fox's neck.
- 9. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

#### **Supplies**

Canvas: 9"x12"
Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Assorted brushes
Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

White, Deep Red, Orange, Yellow, Saffron, Paprika, Black

#### **Directions**

- 1. Paint the whole canvas White. Allow to dry.
- 2. Paint long, uneven-length vertical swaths of Deep Red, Orange, Yellow, Saffron, and Paprika. Allow to dry.
- 3. Transfer the pattern to the canvas.
- 4. Paint the lettering and outline the leaves design in Black. Allow to dry.
- 5. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

Harvest Moon Canvas Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Canvas: 9"x12"
Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Assorted brushes
Sponge
Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

White, Off White, Black, Cobalt Blue, Ultramarine Blue

#### **Directions**

- 1. Transfer the pattern of the moon to the canvas.
- 2. Paint the moon with of mix of 1 part White and 1 part Off White.
- 3. Mix 1 part White and 1 part Black. Lightly sponge this color inside the moon. Allow to dry.
- 4. Transfer the bat pattern onto the canvas inside the moon.
- 5. Paint the bats Black.
- 6. Using big circular strokes, paint the background in a combination of Cobalt Blue and Ultramarine Blue.
- 7. Paint a White halo around the whole moon. Allow to dry.
- 8. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.



#### Hay There, Scarecrow Mixed Media Canvas Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Canvas: 9"x12"

Pattern

Graphite paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes Woodgrain stamp

Decoupage medium

4" square of fall fabric

X-acto knife

Tape

Raffia or straw

Silk sunflower

Glue

Tape



#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Weathered Wood, Burnt Umber, Off White, Yellow Gold, Green, Black, Paprika

#### **Directions**

- 1. Transfer the pattern to the canvas.
- 2. Paint the area around the scarecrow in Weathered Wood. Allow to dry.
- 3. Cut out the scarecrow shape from the paper pattern. Use this cutout to block off the scarecrow area. Stamp the woodgrain design in Burnt Umber on the painted area. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the face Off White.
- 5. Paint the hat Yellow Gold.
- 6. Paint the shirt Green.
- 7. Paint the eyes and mouth Black.
- 8. Paint the nose Paprika.
- 9. Paint a horizontal and vertical stripe pattern on the shirt in Off White.
- 10. Paint a Burnt Umber outline around the face and the hat.
- 11. Paint the lettering Black. Allow to dry.
- 12. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint. Allow to dry.
- 13. With the X-acto knife, make small slits in the canvas at the ends of each sleeve, along the lower brim of the hat, and at either side of the lower part of the face.
- 14. Tuck in lengths of raffia or straw to make it look like the straw is coming out of the scarecrow sleeves and from under the hat.
- 15. Fold the fabric square into a triangle and tuck the ends into the slits at either side of the face.
- 16. Glue the silk sunflower to the brim of the hat at the side of the face.
- 17. Turn the canvas over and tape down the ends of the raffia and fabric to secure these design elements.

Splatter Fall Tree Canvas Painting Project

#### **Supplies**

Canvas: 9"x12"
Drinking straw
Splatter brush
Decoupage medium

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

White, Burnt Umber, Orange, Yellow, Deep Red

#### **Directions**

- 1. Paint the whole canvas White. Allow to dry.
- 2. Mix 2 parts water and 1 part Burnt Umber.
- 3. Drop a dollop of the watered-down Burnt Umber at the center of the lower edge of the canvas.
- 4. With the straw, blow the paint up the canvas to form the tree trunk. Drop several small dollops of watered-down paint on the top sides of the trunk so you can continue to blow the paint to create branches. Continue this process until you are satisfied with the height and shape and fullness of the tree. Allow to dry.
- 5. Splatter Orange, Yellow, and Deep Red all around the branches of the tree to create the appearance of leaves. Allow to dry.
- 6. Apply a coat of decoupage medium to seal the paint.

Apple Feeder Clay Project

This project is shaped in 3 parts that are then scored and pressed together.

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Clay tools Round brushes in assorted sizes

#### **Glaze Colors**

Red, White, Brown, Green

#### **Directions**

- 1. Roll a short fat coil. Tap both ends of the coil on the work mat to flatten and slightly flare the ends.
- 2. Form 2 small shallow dish shapes, 1 slightly larger than the other.
- 3. Score one end of the fat coil, stand it up, then press the larger of the 2 dish shapes on it.
- 4. With a clay tool, smooth the seam between the coil and the dish shape. This is now the top of the apple.
- 5. Score the bottom end of the fat coil and press it into the center of the remaining dish.
- 6. With a clay tool, smooth the seam between the coil and the dish shape. This is now the bottom of the apple.
- 7. From pinches of clay, sculpt an apple stem and a leaf. Score the backs of each of these and attach them to the top of the apple.
- 8. With a clay, tool add texture to the coil that forms the apple core.
- 9. With dampened fingertips, smooth out all seams.
- 10. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 11. Paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.

Autumn Garden Chime Clay Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Rolling pin Texture stamp Patterns cut out of cardboard Wooden skewer Fishing line or Fun Wire

#### **Glaze Colors**

Color(s) of your choice

#### **Directions**

- 1. Roll out a 12"x12" slab of clay, ¼" thick.
- 2. Press the texture stamp onto the clay.
- 3. Lay out the templates on the clay slab. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out.
- 4. With wet fingertips, smooth out the edges of each shape.
- 5. Score the sides of each of the wedge shapes. One at a time, bring the edges toward each other and press them together, allowing one end to overlap the other to form a cone shape. Make sure that a small opening remains at the tip of the cone.
- 6. With wet fingertips, smooth out the seams of the cone shapes.
- 7. Use the pointy end of the skewer to draw some vein lines on the leaf shape and to poke a hole near one end.
- 8. Allow all the clay to dry for about 15–30 minutes.
- 9. Paint the cones and the leaf in the colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 10. Fire to cone 06.
- 11. After firing, string the pieces together by bringing the line or wire through the holes to create a hanging chime.



### Fall Gnome Home Clay Mixed Media Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Foam work mat
Rolling pin
Pattern templates cut from cardboard
Wooden skewer
Texture stamp
Newspaper
Assorted brushes
10"-12" terracotta saucer
Dirt
Artificial plants or mini trees
Moss
Pebbles



#### **Glaze Colors**

Colors of your choice

#### **Directions for Gnome Home**

- 1. Roll out a 12"x12" slab of clay, ¼" thick.
- 2. Lay out the templates on the clay slab. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out. Gather the remaining clay and set it aside to use to sculpt other elements in later steps.
- 3. With wet fingertips, smooth out the edges of each shape.
- 4. Bring the short sides of the rectangle toward each other. Score the upper edge of one short end and the lower edge of the other short end and press them together to form a tube. Stand the tube up. Place some wadded up newspaper inside the clay tube to help maintain its shape.
- 5 Texture the triangle shape with the stamp.
- 6. Bring the 2 sides of the triangle shape toward each other. Score the upper edge of one side and the lower edge of the other and press it together to form a short cone.
- 7. Score the top of the tube and the inside lower edge of the cone. Press the cone on top of the tube to attach.
- 8. From the leftover clay, sculpt windows, a door, and any other feature you'd like to add to the home. Be sure to score the backs of each piece before pressing them on the clay house.
- 9. Allow the clay to dry for about 15–30 minutes, and then paint with glaze colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 10. Remove newspaper.
- 11. Fire to cone 06.

#### **Directions for Gnome**

- 1. Roll a small smooth ball.
- 2. Roll out a small slab and cut out a small triangle with 2 long sides. Bring the long sides together to form a long cone shape. Smooth and mold this shape into a gnome hat.
- 3. Score the inside of the hat and press it onto the clay ball.
- 4. Roll a flat semicircle for the gnome's beard. Score the back of it and press it on the lower part of the gnome body.
- 5. Use the wooden skewer to scratch wavy lines into the beard.
- 6. Roll a very small ball for the gnome's nose. Score the back of it and press it just under the hat, at the top edge of the beard.
- 7. Allow the clay to dry for about 15–30 minutes, and then paint with glaze colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 8. Fire to cone 06.

#### **Directions for Mushrooms**

- 1. From pinches of clay, sculpt a mushroom cap and stem.
- 2. Score the top of the stem and the inside of the cap, and press them together.



- 3. Allow the clay to dry for about 15–30 minutes, and then paint with glaze colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 4. Fire to cone 06.

#### **Creating the Gnome Home Garden**


- 1. When all pieces are fired, it's time to assemble the garden. First, place about 2 inches of dirt in the saucer.
- 2. Arrange the house, gnome, mushrooms, mini trees, and plants in the saucer.
- 3. Add some pebbles and moss to fill in the open areas.

Fall Leaf Candle Holder
Clay Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Rolling pin Pattern or leaf-shaped cookie cutters Wooden skewer Tea light or votive candles

#### **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Metallic Gold, Metallic Copper or Bronze

#### **Directions**

- 1. Roll out a square slab of clay, 1/4" thick.
- 2. Lay out the templates on the clay slab. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out. Or if using cookie cutters, press the cookie cutters into the clay to cut out the shapes.
- 3. With wet fingertips, smooth out the edges of each shape.
- 4. Press the bottom end of the candle into the center of each leaf shape to make an indentation in the clay.
- 5. Allow all the clay to dry to leather-hard stage.
- 6. Fire to cone 06.
- 7. Paint each leaf in a metallic color. Allow to dry.



Fall Leaves Wind Chime Clay Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Rolling pin Woodgrain texture stamp Pattern or leaf-shaped cookie cutters Wooden skewer Assorted brushes Branch Fun Wire



Yellow, Orange, Brown, Dark Brown **Directions** 

- 1. Roll out a square slab of clay, ¼" thick.
- 2. Lay out the templates on the clay slab. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out. Or if using cookie cutters for the leaves, press the cookie cutters into the clay to cut out the shapes..
- 3. Press the texture stamp onto the rectangular pieces.
- 4. With the wooden skewer, poke a hole at the top of each shape.
- 5. With wet fingertips, smooth out the edges of each shape.
- 6. Allow all the clay to dry to leather-hard stage.
- 7. Fire to cone 04.
- 8. Paint each leaf in a combination of Yellow and Orange with Brown veins.
- 9. Paint the rectangular shapes in Brown, then dry brush with Dark Brown. Allow to dry.
- 10. Fire to cone 06.
- 11. After glazing and firing, string the wind chime together by hanging the shapes onto the branch.



#### Fall Napkin Rings Clay Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Rolling pin Texture stamp Fall-themed mini cookie cutters Wooden skewer Scoring tool Assorted brushes

#### Glaze Colors

Colors of your choice

#### **Directions**

- 1. Roll out a square slab of clay, ¼" thick.
- 2. Using the cookie cutters, cut out a fall-themed shape for each napkin ring. Set aside.
- 3. Using the pointy end of a wooden skewer, cut out a rectangle measuring 1¾" x 6½" for each napkin ring.
- 4. Press the texture stamp on each rectangle.
- 5. Cut ½" from each rectangle.
- 6. Roll each rectangle into a ring shape. Score the ends and press them together. Lay the ring flat on the work mat.
- 7. Score the outside of the ring at the seam and press the small ½" rectangle piece onto the ring.
- 8. Score the back of a fall-themed shape and press it onto the top of the ring.
- 9. Allow all the clay to dry to leather-hard stage.
- 10. Fire to cone 04.
- 11. Paint each ring in a combination of the colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 12. Fire to cone 06.

Owl Feeder Clay Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Rolling pin Pattern Wooden skewer Twine Glue Short branch Hanging birdseed suet pack

#### Glaze

Colors of your choice

#### **Directions**

- 1. Roll out a square slab of clay, 1/4" thick.
- 2. Cut out an owl body shape from the clay. Cut out a circle from the center of the owl.
- 3. Lay out the patterns of the eyes, beak, wings, and talons on the clay slab. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out.
- 4. With wet fingertips, smooth out the edges of each shape.
- 5. Score the back of all the owl features and press them in place.
- 6. With the wooden skewer poke a hole just under the beak and below the circular opening.
- 7. Allow all the clay to dry to leather-hard stage.
- 8. Fire to cone 04.
- 9. Paint the front and the back of the owl in the colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 10. Fire to cone 06.
- 11. Glue a length of twine on the back of the owl to create a hanger. Also glue a short branch into the bottom hole and hang the bird seed suet pack from the hole under the beak.



Owl Flower Pot Clay Project

#### **Supplies**

Low-fire white clay with light grog Foam work mat Wooden skewer Scoring tool Round brushes in assorted sizes

#### **Glaze Colors**

Colors of your choice

#### **Directions**

- 1. Form a pinch pot. Tap the open side of it to flare out the sides a bit.
- 2. With the pointy end of a wooden skewer, poke a hole in the bottom of the pinch pot.
- 3. Roll 2 small balls of equal size for the eyes. Flatten one side of each ball, score the flattened side, and press it on the side of the pinch pot.
- 4. Roll 2 smaller balls of equal size for the pupils. Flatten one side of each ball, score the flattened side, and press it in the center of the larger eyeball.
- 5. Sculpt a beak and pair of talons. Score the back of each and press them into place.
- 6. Allow the clay to dry for 15–30 minutes then paint with glazes of your choice. Allow to dry thoroughly.
- 7. Fire to cone 06.

# Falling Leaves Plate Pottery Painting

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (fan brush, round brushes, long liner brush)

# **Glaze Colors**

White, Yellow Gold, Yellow, Orange, Brown, Green

# **Directions**

- 1. Paint 3 coats of White over the front of the plate. Allow to dry.
- 2. Transfer the pattern to the plate.
- 3. Paint 1–2 coats of color on each leaf in a mix of Green, Yellow Gold, Yellow, and Orange. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the acorns Brown and Tan. Allow to dry.
- 5. Outline each leaf and paint the veins of each leaf Brown. Allow to dry.
- 6. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Tall mug

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes Writer bottle

### **Glaze Colors**

Taupe, Brown, Orange, Yellow, Red

### **Directions**

- 1. Paint 1–2 coats of Taupe on the outside of the mug and handle. Allow to dry.
- 2. Transfer the pattern to the mug, placing the tree trunk close to the handle.
- 3. Paint 1 coat of Brown on the tree trunk.
- 4. Using a writer bottle filled with Brown, paint the lines in the tree trunk and branches and words. Allow to dry.
- 5. Use a small round brush to paint little leaves in Orange and Yellow scattered amongst the branches.
- 6. Paint the heart in the tree trunk Red. Allow to dry.
- 7. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Rectangular plaque

Washable marker

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (fan brush, round brushes, long liner brush)

Writer bottle Fun Wire

Football-themed buttons, charms, or beads (optional)

### Glaze Colors

Green, Bright Green, Brown, White

### **Directions**

- 1. With the washable marker, mark off 1½"-wide vertical stripes on the plaque.
- 2. Alternate 3 coats of Green and Bright Green on each vertical stripe. Allow to dry.
- 3. Transfer the pattern to the plaque.
- 4. Paint the football shape Brown. Allow to dry.
- 5. With a White writer bottle, paint the dashes, the football laces, and the lettering. Allow to dry.
- 6. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.
- 7. String the Fun Wire through the holes in the plaque to create a hanger. If desired, string buttons, beads, or charms on the wire.

Ghost Bowl Pottery Painting

**Supplies** 

Bisque: Rimmed bowl

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes

Writer bottle

### **Glaze Colors**

White, Orange, Black

### **Directions**

- 1. Paint 2–3 coats of White over the inside of the bowl. Allow to dry.
- 2. Transfer the ghost pattern scattered around the bowl.
- 3. Paint 1–2 coats of Orange over the inside of the bowl, being careful to go around the ghosts. Allow to dry.
- 4. Outline each ghost in Black. Paint the ghost eyes and mouth in Black as well. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the outside of the bowl below the rim in 3 coats of White. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the rim of the bowl in 3 coats of Black. Allow to dry.
- 7. Use the writer bottle filled in White to make dots all around the ghosts on the inside of the bowl and on the top edge of the rim. Allow to dry.
- 8. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Rectangular divided platter Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Penci

Assorted brushes (fan brush, round brushes, long liner brush)

Writer bottle

### **Glaze Colors**

White, Orange, Yellow, Bright Green, Purple, Black

### **Directions**

- 1. Paint 3 coats of White over the front of the platter. Allow to dry.
- 2. Paint 2 coats of Orange color on the horizontal band across the middle of the platter. Allow to dry.
- 3. Transfer the lettering pattern to the plate, centering each phrase in either the top or bottom section of the platter.
- 4. Transfer the pattern of the pair of candy corn in the center of the platter in the medallion and transfer loose candy pattern scattered around the lettering.
- 5. Paint the candy corn Orange and Yellow. Paint the individual candies Yellow and/or Green and add Purple and Orange dots on the long candy. Allow to dry.
- 6. With a writer bottle filled with Black, paint in the letters. Allow to dry.
- 7. Outline each candy in Black. Allow to dry.
- 8. Paint purple dots along the top and bottom edges of the horizontal band and around the circle medallion in the middle of the platter. Allow to dry.
- 9. Paint the front edge of the platter Orange. Allow to dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Beer mug Woodgrain stamp Assorted brushes

# **Glaze Colors**

Brown, Dark Brown

# **Directions**

- 1. Paint 3 coats of Brown all over the inside and outside of the mug including the handle. Allow to dry.
- 2. Stamp the woodgrain design in Dark Brown all around the outside of the mug. Make sure that the grain is running vertically.
- 3. Paint evenly spaced vertical lines in Dark Brown around the mug to simulate individual wood panels. Also paint a horizontal Dark Brown line approximately ½" from the top and bottom edge of the mug. Allow to dry.
- 4. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

# Pumpkin Plaque Pottery Painting

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Rectangular plaque with holes Pattern printed on clay carbon paper Pencil Assorted brushes Fun Wire Assorted beads

### **Glaze Colors**

Black, Orange, White, Yellow Gold, Brown, Green

### **Directions**

- 1. Paint 3 coats of Black over the front of the plaque. Allow to dry.
- 2. Transfer the pattern to the plaque.
- 3. Paint the center pumpkin Orange.
- 4. Paint the pumpkin on the left White.
- 5. Paint the pumpkin on the right Yellow Gold.
- 6. Paint the pumpkin stems Brown.
- 7. Paint the pumpkin leaves and vines Green.
- 8. Paint vertical curvy highlights of Orange and Yellow Gold on the White pumpkin.
- 9. Paint vertical curvy highlights Off White Orange on the Yellow Gold pumpkin.
- 10. Splatter Orange, Yellow Gold, and White lightly over the whole plaque. Allow to dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.
- 12. After firing, string beads on the Fun Wire. Put the wire through the holes in the plaque to create a hanger.

# Pumpkin Spice & Everything Nice Coffee Pod Holder Pottery Painting

# **Supplies**

Bisque: Coffee pod holder

Pattern printed on clay carbon paper

Pencil

Assorted brushes (fan brush, round brushes, long liner brush)

Writer bottle

### **Glaze Colors**

Butter Yellow, Orange, Leaf Green, Gold, Burnt Orange, White

### **Directions**

- 1. Paint 3 coats of Butter Yellow all over the outside of the coffee pod holder. Allow to dry.
- 2. Transfer a phrase pattern to each side and the coffee cup design to the front of the holder.
- 3. On the first side, paint the words *Pumpkin, &, nice* in Orange. Allow to dry.
- 4. Paint the word *spice* in Leaf Green. Allow to dry.
- 5. Paint the word everything in Gold. Allow to dry.
- 6. Paint the dots in Leaf Green. Allow to dry.
- 7. On the front edge, paint the mug with 1 coat of Burnt Orange. Outline it with 3 coats of Burnt Orange.
- 8. Paint the whip cream with 3 coats of White. Allow to dry.
- 9. Paint curved lines in the whip cream in Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 10. On the second side, paint the word *autumn* in Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 11. Paint the words that's, what, is, made, of in Leaf Green. Allow to dry.
- 12. Splatter the whole bisque piece lightly with Orange, Leaf Green, Gold, and Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 13. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.
