'TIS THE SEASON TO BE FALL-Y Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Sharpie
Small and medium round brushes
Liner brush

Glaze Colors

Orange, Yellow, Black Writer bottle in Black

Directions

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Water down Yellow and apply 1 coat to the pumpkin, leaving bisque showing through.
- 3. Water down Orange and paint 1–2 coats over the Yellow, filling in the pumpkin.
- 4. Paint the smile and the eyes with 2 coats of Black. Be sure to leave the teeth the pumpkin color.
- 5. Using a liner brush or writer bottle, loosely outline the pumpkin, add details to the eyes and stem, and create a shadow under the pumpkin.
- 6. Using watered-down colors, splatter all 3 colors sparingly across the plate.
- 7. Fill in the letters with a Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 8. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

CAMPFIRE BUDDIES Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Rim plate
Pattern
Tissue Paper
Sharpie
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Colors

Dark Brown, White, Tan, Orange, Yellow, Red, Light Brown, Light Gray, Black, Pink, Writer bottle in Brown, Orange

Directions


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Paint the chocolate buddy with 3 coats of Dark Brown. Paint the marshmallow buddy with 3 coats of White and the graham cracker with 3 coats of Tan.
- 3. For the fire, start with thick coat of Orange. Using the same brush, blend Yellow into the Orange. Using same brush, blend Red into the other colors. Add a few solid painted lines in Yellow and Red that overlap only at the tip of the fire.
- 4. Outline the chocolate and graham cracker with small liner brush using Light Brown. Outline the marshmallow with Light Gray. (You can also use writer bottles.)
- 5. Paint each rock with 1 coat of Black. Slightly water down Light Gray. Using a small brush, add messy, swirly details around the edge of each rock.
- 6. Add Black dots for eyes on each buddy. Add a Pink fingerprint dot to each cheek on the marshmallow.
- 7. Paint the lettering with an Orange writer bottle. Add dots along the inside rim of the plate.
- 8. Fill in the sticks with a Brown writer bottle. Let dry.
- 9. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

FALL IS CALLING Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern Tissue paper Sharpie Scissors

Paper plate Copy paper

Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Colors

Golden Yellow, Pumpkin, Cinnamon, Coral, Olive Green, Yellow, Grape Purple

Directions


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Cut 1" strips from the copy paper. Tear the strips into small pieces about ½" wide. Each ear of corn will use 40–50 pieces.
- 3. Pour each color (7 colors total) on the outer edge of a paper plate, leaving space between each one.
- 4. Dip a paper piece into a paint color and place along the top of the corn pattern line. Continue to dip papers into colors and place in horizontal lines, keeping within the pattern. Some papers should overlap, and others should be surrounded with space.
- 5. Once the ear of corn is filled with paper pieces, paint 1 heavy coat of Golden Yellow over the paper pieces, covering any exposed bisque within the corn shape.
- 6. Repeat step 5 on the other ear of corn. Paint 1 heavy coat of Olive Green over the paper pieces, covering any exposed bisque within the corn shape.
- 7. Once the Golden Yellow and Olive Green coats are dry, remove all the paper pieces.
- 8. Slightly water down some Golden Yellow, Pumpkin, and Olive Green. Alternating colors, paint the leaves with 1–2 coats of each color.
- 9. Fill in the lettering with a Cinnamon writer bottle. (If pattern isn't visible, use tissue paper to retrace the letters.) Let dry.
- 10. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

GOBBLE WOBBLE Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Sharpie marker Contact paper

Scissors

Fan brush

Small and medium round brushes

Toothbrush or speckling tool

Glaze Colors

Golden Yellow, Dark Brown, Teal, Pumpkin, Cinnamon, Taupe, White Writer bottle in Dark Brown

Directions

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Trace the pattern for the head and eyes onto contact paper and cut out.
- 3. Stick the contact paper eyes onto the design first, then the turkey head cutout over them.
- 4. Plan the feather color choices so that no two like colors are touching. There should be 2 Golden Yellow feathers, 2 Dark Brown, 3 Teal, and 2 feathers that are a 2:1 mix of Pumpkin and Cinnamon. Paint each feather with 3 coats.
- 5. Using a toothbrush or speckling tool, splatter White paint on the feathers.
- 6. Peel off the head sticker.
- 7. Paint the beak with 2 coats of Golden Yellow. Add a few highlights of Pumpkin along the edge for shading and definition.
- 8. Paint the wattle with 3 coats of Pumpkin. Slightly shade the left side with Cinnamon.
- 9. Paint the face with 3 coats of Taupe.
- 10. Remove the eye stickers and paint with 2–3 coats of White. When dry, add pupils with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 11. Outline all the facial features and feather shapes and add details to the Teal feathers with a Dark Brown writer bottle. Let dry.
- 12. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Directions

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Sponge paint the grass area with 2–3 coats of Green.
- 3. Paint the goal post with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 4. Paint the football with 3 coats of Brown.
- 5. Dip the end of a pencil, a paintbrush, or a fingertip into Red, Orange, Yellow, Blue, and Purple for to make the dots in the background.
- 6. Paint the stripes and on the football with 3 coats of White and Black (or use writer bottles). Paint the stitches Black.
- 7. Add tall grass lines near the goal post with a Dark Green writer bottle.
- 8. Add field lines on the grass and "Go Team" with a White writer bottle.
- 9. Outline the football, grass edge, and goal post with a Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 10. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

HELLO FALL Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Pencil

Sharpie marker

Contact paper

Copy paper

Scissors

Fan brush

Chippy craft brush

Small and medium round brushes



Glaze Colors

Cream, Taupe, Pumpkin, Golden Yellow, Olive Green, Pea Green, Cinnamon, Bright Red Writer bottle in Dark Brown, Cream, Taupe

Directions

- 1. Three copies of the leaf pattern are needed. First, trace 3 leaves on the plate using the tissue paper technique by placing tissue paper over the pattern and tracing the design with a pencil. Then position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace three with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Second, trace 3 leaves onto contact paper the same way and cut out. Finally, trace 3 leaves on copy paper and cut out.
- 3. Adhere the contact paper leaves to the plate on top of the traced design. Place the middle leaf down first with the stem end at the bottom of the plate. The other 2 leaves will overlap the middle leaf and the stems will point toward the top of the plate.
- 4. Using a fan brush, paint horizontal brush strokes over the leaf cutouts with 1 coat of Cream.
- 5. Dip a chippy craft brush in Taupe, dab off slightly, and paint random horizontal paint strokes across the background. Do not make this solid coverage.
- 6. Peel off the contact paper on the left leaf. Paint the leaf with 1 coat of slightly watered-down Pumpkin. To create dimension, paint one copy paper cutout heavily with Golden Yellow. Align the edge of the cut out to the painted leaf and place on top. Smooth the paper with a finger and then peel off.
- 7. Repeat step 6 with on the leaf on the right using slightly watered-down Olive Green, and then Pea Green on the copy paper.
- 8. Repeat step 6 on the middle leaf using slightly watered-down Cinnamon, and then Bright Red on the copy paper.
- 9. Once all the paint is dry, use the tissue paper tracing to transfer the lettering.
- 10. Paint HELLO with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 11. Paint FALL with a Cream writer bottle. Once dry, outline the letters with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 12. Using a Taupe writer bottle, paint stems on each leaf. Let dry.
- 13. Glaze and fire to cone 06.



Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern

Tissue paper

Contact paper

Sharpie markers

Scissors

Sponge dotters (extra small and small)

Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Colors

Yellow, Dark Blue, White, Coral, Cream, Dark Brown, Golden Yellow, Taupe, Teal, Lime Green Writer bottle in Dark Brown

Directions


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Trace the eyes onto contact paper and cut out. Adhere them to the bisque on the traced pattern.
- 3. Paint the moon in the background with 2–3 coats of Yellow.
- 4. Paint the dark sky background with 2-3 coats of Dark Blue.
- 5. Paint the fence 2-3 coats of White.
- 6. Paint the owl with 2-3 coats of Coral.
- 7. Paint the top of the tree with 2–3 coats of Cream.
- 8. Paint the tree trunk with 3 coats of Dark Brown.
- 9. Remove the stickers and paint the eyes with 2 coats of White.
- 10. Paint the triangle beak with 2 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 11. Using sponge dotters, make dots in the center of the tree in Taupe, Golden Yellow, Teal, Lime Green, and Coral. You may need to do 2 coats to achieve fuller coverage.
- 12. Paint the pupils, the outline around the eyes, the wavy feather lines on the body, and the feet with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 13. Outline the owl, the tree, and some of the dots in the tree with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 14. Outline the fence in a wavy line a few times to give a worn, weathered look to the fence top. Let dry.
- 15. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Glaze Colors

Medium Purple, Coral, Medium Green, Olive Green, Black, Writer bottle in Orange, Black, White, Dark Purple, Medium Purple, Light Purple, Gray

Directions

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Paint the hat with 1 coat of Medium Purple.
- 3. Paint the hair with 1 coat of Coral.
- 4. Paint the face with 1 coat of Medium Green. Stipple 1 coat of Olive Green over the Medium Green. Paint the warts on the nose with 2 coats of Olive Green.
- 5. Using a liner brush, outline the entire hat in Black and paint the spider web with 1 coat of Black. Add Black stripes along the hat brim.
- 6. Paint the spider with 2 coats of Black.
- 7. Paint wavy lines on the hair with an Orange writer bottle. Add Orange dots for spider eyes.
- 8. Outline the witch's face, facial features (smile, eye, tooth, and warts) with Black.
- 9. Using writer bottles, add dots along the edge of the plate, starting with the darkest Purple. Fill in the next row of dots using Medium Purple, and finish the border by adding in smaller dots in the lightest Purple. The inside edge of the dots should create a "wave" pattern around the plate.
- 10. Fill in the first and last word of the quote with a Black writer bottle. Fill in the middle word with Dark Purple.
- 11. Add dots along the letters and black pupils in the spider eyes.
- 12. Add 2 dots in the witch's eyes with a Gray writer bottle. Let dry.
- 13. Glaze and fire to cone 06.





Directions


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Trace the turkey head and the eyes separately on contact paper and cut out.
- 3. Adhere the turkey head over the traced design.
- 4. Paint 3 coats on the 2 Teal feathers.
- 5. Pain the other feathers with 2-3 coats of Dark Brown.
- 6. Peel off the head sticker and place the eye stickers down.
- 7. Paint the turkey head with 3 coats of Taupe.
- 8. Peel off the eye stickers and paint with 2 coats of White.
- 9. Paint the beak with a Pumpkin writer bottle.
- 10. With a Dark Brown writer bottle, paint a squiggle pattern on the end of each Teal feather and a feather sprig on the top of the head.
- 11. Outline the eyes, head, and feathers with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 12. With a White writer bottle, make stitching lines on the Dark Brown feathers to resemble a football. Let dry.
- 13. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

Orange, Teal, Cinnamon, Yellow, Olive Green, Brown, Gold Yellow, Gray, Pumpkin, Black Writer bottle in Dark Brown

Directions


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Trace the turkey and the hat on contact paper, cut out, and apply to the plate, covering the traced design.
- 3. Paint the feathers with 1–2 coats of Orange, Teal, Cinnamon, Yellow, and Olive Green.
- 4. Peel off the contact paper.
- 5. Paint the turkey body with 3 coats of Brown.
- 6. Paint the beak and the buckle with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 7. Paint the hat band 3 coats of Gray.
- 8. Paint the wattle with 3 coats of Pumpkin.
- 9. Paint the hat with 2 coats of Black.
- 10. Use a Dark Brown writer bottle to outline the feathers, make the lines within the feathers, and create the jigjag feather outlines along the edge of the plate. Let dry.
- 11. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

UNICORN-KIN Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Colors

Orange. Grape Purple, Dark Purple, Kelly Green, Bright Green, Black, White Black Shimmer (optional)
Writer bottle in Black

Directions


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Mix a small amount of water into the Orange, the Purples, and the Kelly Green. Dip a medium brush in watered-down mixture and tap brush on finger, splattering paint on the plate. Keep splattering on the top half of the plate.
- 3. Paint the pumpkin with 3 coats of Bright Green. Paint the pumpkin ridges with 1 coat of Kelly Green, slightly blending the colors along the outside edge of the ridge.
- 4. Paint the body of each bat with 3 coats of Grape Purple and each set of wings with 3 coats of Dark Purple.
- 5. Paint the flowers with 3 coats of Orange.
- 6. Paint the horn and the eyelashes with 3 coats of Black. (Or use Black Shimmer instead.)
- 7. Add White dots for eyes. Once dry, add Kelly Green dots and finish with Black dots. (Dots can be made with the back end of various sizes of paintbrushes.)
- 8. Outline the wings with a Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 9. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

WITCHES' BREW Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe plate

Pattern Pencil

Sharpie marker Contact paper

Scissors

Cup of water

Dish soap

Straw

Liner brush

Small and medium round brushes



Glaze Colors

Black, Lime Green, Medium Green, White, Purple, Blue, Orange, Light Gray, Tan, Yellow, Brown Writer bottles in Gray, White

Directions

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and use a marker to retrace the top edge of the cauldron across the middle section of the plate.
- 2. Paint the cauldron with 2–3 coats of Black. Once dry, use a Gray writer bottle to add cauldron details for the handle and the rim.
- 3. Trace the circles, toe, and bone onto contact paper and cut out. Stick the cutouts to the plate in the area where the bubbles will be.
- 4. For the bubbles, mix 2 parts water to 1 part dish soap. Add Lime Green and mix with a straw. Blow into the straw and let bubbles overflow onto the top portion of the plate, working in small sections. (Don't blow too many bubbles at one time or they will pool in the center of the plate. Also, avoid tipping the cup or the water mixture will spill onto the plate.) Let some of the bubbles run over onto the middle section of the black cauldron area.
- 5. Add Medium Green paint to the same soap mix and stir well. Once the first layer of bubbles is popped and somewhat dry, repeat bubble blowing on top of the Lime Green area. Let some of the bubbles run over onto the black cauldron area.
- 6. Once bubbles are semi-dry, pull off the stickers.
- 7. Paint the eyeballs and the bone with 1–2 coats of White. Add Purple, Blue, and Orange for the irises. Outline the bone with Light Gray.
- 8. Paint the toe with 2 coats of Tan (or other flesh tone) and the toenail with 3 coats of Yellow.
- 9. Trace the lettering onto the cauldron using the tissue paper technique (the black Sharpie will be visible on top of the Black painted area.) Fill in the letters with a White writer bottle.
- 10. Add Black dots for the pupils.
- 11. Paint the creases in the toe Brown. Let dry.
- 12. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

ZOMBIE MASK PLAQUE Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Pattern
Wooden skewer
Toothbrush for scoring
Assorted round brushes
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Your choice

Directions

- 1. Roll out a 10"x10" clay slab. Place the pattern on the clay and trace the outline of the face shape with the skewer and cut out.
- 2. Using a skewer, draw a line across the bottom half of the cutout for the mouth line. Be sure you don't press all the way through the clay base.
- 3. For the eyes, roll 2 small clay balls and flatten into ovals of different sizes, about 1.5" and 1". Attach the eyes using clay glue.
- 4. For the brain matter, roll a 6" piece of clay into a long snake. Form the snake into a wavy shape with edges touching. Squeeze the shape slightly to give a squished look. Attach the shape using clay glue.
- 5. Roll out a 1–2" piece of clay into a long, skinny snake. Break off ½" or smaller pieces of the snake and place over the mouth line to suggest stitches. Break off 2 slightly longer pieces for the stitches on the chin.
- 6. Use the skewer to add to holes at the top of the plaque for hanging.
- 7. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 8. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.



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MAPLE LEAF FOX Clay Project

Supplies

Low-fire white clay with light grog
Pattern
Wooden skewer
Toothbrush for scoring
Plastic fork
Assorted round brushes
Picture of finished project as sculpting and painting guide

Glaze Colors or Acrylic Paint Colors

Reddish Brown, White, Black

Directions

- 1. Roll out a 10"x10" clay slab. Place the pattern on the slab and trace the leaf outline with the skewer and cut out.
- 2. For the nose, roll a medium-size ball of clay and flatten to about the size of a small egg. Attach the nose using clay glue.
- 3. Use the tines of a plastic fork to create the fur/whisker area by placing the tines at the edge of the nose and sweeping to the edge. Repeat on the other side.
- 4. For the eyes, roll 2 small balls of clay and flatten to about the size of a nickel. Attach the eyes using clay glue.
- 5. Bend the top two pointy edges in toward the center to create the bend in the fox's ear. Overexaggerate the bend because the clay will open a little when drying.
- 6. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 7. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.



BOO BUDDY Canvas Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to pottery painting.

Supplies

11"x14" canvas
Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Large and medium square brushes
Small liner brush
2–3 sponge dotters

Acrylic Paint Colors

White, Black, Orange, Brown, Green, Purple

Directions


- 1. Trace ghost pattern onto the canvas with graphite paper.
- 2. Paint the ghost White.
- 3. Mix White paint with a dab of Black to create Gray. Dip a sponge dotter in the Gray and paint dots all over the ghost. Some of the dots can overlap the edge of the ghost.
- 4. Paint the pumpkin Orange and the stem Brown.
- 5. Paint the legs Green. Paint the shoes Gray. Once the Green is dry, add Purple stripes on the legs.
- 6. Paint the background Black. Trim around the ghost with smooth, even brushstrokes.
- 7. Using a small brush, outline the eyes, paint the hand holding the pumpkin, and add pupils to the eyes.
- 8. Mix a little White with the Purple. Using sponge dotters, alternate Green and Purple dots around the edge of the canvas. (The touch of White helps the Purple show up on the Black background.)

Kaleidoscope Fox Canvas Painting Project

This project can easily be adapted to pottery painting using painted paper technique for the tail.

Pencil

Pattern

Graphite paper

Assorted colors of tissue paper cut into 2"" squares

Assorted square (large and medium) brushes and small liner brush

Clear school glue

Acrylic Paint Colors

Orange, Red, Dark Brown, Tan, Light Blue, White

Directions


- 1. Trace the pattern onto the canvas using graphite paper.
- 2. Mix Orange, Red, and a dab of Dark Brown to create the fox fur color. Paint the body and face with this mixture. Paint the chest and lower face Tan. Paint the eyes and nose Dark Brown. Outline the fox with Dark Brown
- 3. Paint the background Light Blue.
- 4. Paint the tree Dark Brown.
- 5. Tear the tissue paper squares into smaller pieces. Paint the tail area with a light coat of school glue. Press the tissue paper shapes into the glue until the entire tail is covered. The torn tissue pieces should touch, and some will overlap.
- 6. Use a small brush to outline the edge of the canvas with White.

AUTUMN NIGHT SKY Board Art Painting Project

Supplies

14"x14" wood plank board Pattern Tissue paper Sharpie marker Assorted brushes

Acrylic Colors

Coral, Yellow, White, Dark Blue, Black

Directions

- 1. Paint the second plank from the bottom Coral. Add Yellow to the same brush and blend this into the Coral on the top half of the plank.
- 2. With the same brush, paint the next plank Yellow with a little bit of Coral on the brush, blending toward the top of the plank.
- 3. Add White to the same brush and blend paint onto the top plank, finishing with mostly White to the middle of the top plank.
- 4. Starting with a clean brush, paint the top of the last plank Dark Blue. Add White to the brush and blend.
- 5. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the pallet and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 6. Paint the bottom plank solid Black.
- 7. Paint the barn, fence. and tree Black.
- 8. Paint the moon White.

BACK TO SCHOOL WELCOME SIGN Board Art Painting Project

This project would be a great teacher project, customized with the teacher's name.

Supplies

14"x14" wood pallet Pattern Graphite paper Pencil Assorted brushes Medium sponge dotter

Acrylic Colors

Aqua, White, Medium Green, Tan, Yellow, Gray, Coral, Brown, Hot Pink, Yellow Green, Black

Directions

- 1. Place board with planks running vertically. Trace the pattern onto the board using graphite paper.
- 2. Paint the crayon Aqua. Paint the stripes on the crayon White.
- 3. Paint the ruler Medium Green.
- 4. Paint the top of the pencil Tan. Paint the pencil body Yellow. Paint the ferrule Gray. Paint the eraser Coral. Paint the point of the pencil Brown. Add Brown accent lines on the tip of the pencil.
- 5. Paint the banner Hot Pink.
- 6. Dip a sponge dotter into Yellow Green paint and paint dots on the ruler.
- 7. Using a small brush with White, paint the lines of the pencil, lines on the ruler, and the word BLUE.
- 8. Using a liner brush, paint Black squiggles to accent all the shapes.
- 9. Paint the lettering on the banner with Black.
- 10. Paint the top of the board White above the crayon and pencil.

HAPPY HALLOWEEN SIGN Board Art Painting Project

Supplies

14"x16" wood staggered pallet

Pencil

Pattern

Tissue paper

Sharpie

Ruler

Assorted brushes

Small and medium sponge dotters

Acrylic Colors

Black, Orange, White, Gray

Directions

- 1. Place board with planks running vertically. Draw a horizontal line across the bottom of the board about 3 inches up from the bottom of the shortest plank.
- 2. Paint the bottom section below the horizontal line solid Black.
- 3. Paint the first and last plank with 2 coats of Orange.
- 4. Pain the second plank with a solid coat of White.
- 5. Paint the middle board with a wash composed of 3 parts Orange to 1 part Black.
- 6. Paint the fourth board with a wash of Gray.
- 7. Using 2 sizes of sponge dotters, add Orange and Gray dots to the White plank.
- 8. On the middle board, lightly sketch chevron lines about 1" apart. Starting on the full shape, paint every other shape solid White. With a small brush, outline the painted shapes with Black.
- 9. Lightly sketch two ½" stripes on the fourth plank about 1" apart. Paint the stripes solid White. Once dry, use a ruler and pencil to add lines for a plaid look. Paint the lines Orange.
- 10. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the pallet and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Paint the spiderweb in Gray.
- 11. Paint the word HAPPY in Black. Paint HALLOWEEN in White.

U-PICK PUMPKINS Board Art Painting Project

Supplies

14"x14" Wood pallet (4 planks)
Pattern
Tissue paper
Sharpie
Chippy craft brush
Assorted brushes
Small sponge dotter

Acrylic Colors

White, Taupe, Cream, Teal, Dark Blue, Olive Green, Dark Brown, Yellow, Orange

Directions

- 1. Paint the top 2 planks solid White. Let dry.
- 2. Paint the bottom 2 planks with a wash coat of Taupe. To add a distressed look to the planks, dip a chippy brush lightly in Taupe and Cream and brush this on the Taupe planks in horizontal brushstrokes.
- 3. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the pallet and retrace the pumpkins on the white planks with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 4. Blue Pumpkin: Paint in sections, alternating Teal and Dark Blue blended with White. Slightly blend the colors where the pumpkin sections meet. Paint the stem Dark Brown with a little White blended in for a highlight.
- 5. Green Pumpkin: Paint in sections, alternating Olive Green, Dark Brown, and Teal blended with White. Slightly blend the colors where the pumpkin sections meet. Paint the stem Taupe and the cut portion of the stem Dark Brown.
- 6. Orange Pumpkin: Paint in sections, alternating White, Yellow, Orange, and a mix of Dark Brown and White. Slightly blend the colors where the pumpkin sections meet. Paint the stem with a mix of Dark Brown and White.
- 7. Trace the lettering pattern on the bottom 2 planks. Paint with Olive Green
- 8. Add "rusty nails" on the planks with small sponge dotter dipped in Dark Brown.
- 9. Using a small brush, add White along the edges to give a worn look to the crate.
