BOO YA OR BOO Y'ALL PLATTER

Pottery Painting Project

Choose Boo Ya or Boo Y'all based on what works best for your geographical location.

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe charger

Pattern Tissue paper

Pencil Sharpie Water

Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Yellow, Orange, Teal, Lime Green, Purple, Lime Yellow, Gray, White, Black, Writer bottle in Black, Purple, Orange, Green

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Add a little water to each color before painting. Paint one of the candy wrappers with 2 watery coats of Yellow and Orange. Paint the others a combination of Teal and Lime Green and Purple and Lime Yellow using the same technique of 2 watery coats.
- 3. Paint the candy corn with 2 watery coats of each stripe in White, Orange, and Yellow.
- 4. Pain the Pumpkin with 2 watery coats of Teal and Gray for the stem. Add a little of White in the grooves of the pumpkin sections.
- 5. Paint the bat wings with 2 watery coats of Gray. Paint the bat head with 2 watery coats of Purple. Paint the eyes and teeth White.
- 6. With a Black writer bottle, outline the word BOO in Black, leaving the thicker part of letters blank. Once dry, use writer bottle in Purple to fill in the letters.
- 7. Outline the word YA or Y'ALL in Orange. Add shadowing of the letters with a line of Black.
- 8. Add the inside details of the candy wrappers with corresponding colors.
- 9. Add smile on bat and dots for the eyes with a Black writer bottle.
- 10. With a Black writer bottle, outline all of the shapes with sketchy, broken lines.
- 11. Lightly splatter the background with watered-down Black. Let dry.
- 12. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

DIBS PLATTER

Pumpkin, Cream, Navy Writer bottles in Navy, Pumpkin


Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Water down Pumpkin and paint a light wash coat over the entire plate.
- 3. Paint the D and the S with 3 coats of Cream.
- 4. Paint the Turkey leg with 3 coats of Pumpkin. Paint the bone at the bottom of the leg with 3 coats of Cream.
- 5. Paint the B with 3 coats of Navy.
- 6. Using a Navy writer bottle, make a sketchy outline on the D and the S.
- 7. Outline the turkey leg with a Pumpkin writer bottle.
- 8. With Cream writer bottle, add dots along the edge of the B. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

EYEBALL I-SCREAM PLATE

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe salad plate

Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie
Small and medium brushes
Liner brush

Glaze Colors

White, Purple, Orange, Green, Light Gray, Black, Lime Green

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Paint the eyes and ice cream "drips" with 2 coats of White.
- 3. Paint the pupil irises in the eyes with 3 coats each of Purple, Orange, and Green.
- 4. Using a liner brush, outline each eyeball with Light Gray.
- 5. Paint the cone with 3 coats of Black.
- 6. Using a liner brush, water down each eye color and detail the drips of the corresponding eye. Add small thinner lines for squiggle details in the drip.
- 7. Using a liner brush, add Light Gray lines for the spider web on the cone. Start with the vertical lines, then add the horizontal webbing lines.
- 8. Paint the background 1–2 coats of Lime Green.
- 9. Paint the pupils Black. Outline the eyeballs, the drips, and the irises with Black. Add a White "c" in the center of the Black pupil. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

FALL DECO DESIGNS CHARGER

Pottery Painting Project

This project uses leaf shapes in various sizes and shapes. Only the leaves with multiple branches are traced onto the squares and painted. The remaining leaves are stickers and paper cutouts. This project can easily be adapted to smaller or larger bisque by using less or more square shapes.

Bisque: Square coupe charger

Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil

Copy paper
Contact paper

Glaze Colors


Gray, Cream, Golden Yellow, Maroon, Black, Light Brown, White, Taupe, Pumpkin, Black, Writer bottle in Taupe, Black, White

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the squares with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. For this design, you will need to repeat some of the squares.
- 2. Trace 3 of the solid leaf patterns onto contact paper and copy paper and cut out. You will need 7 contact paper leaf cutouts and 7 copy paper leaf cutouts.
- 3. Place the sticker cut outs in the squares, leaving 2 squares with no sticker. These squares will have the multiple leaf designs traced on them in another step.
- 4. Paint each square 3 coats of one color: Gray, Cream, Gold Yellow, Maroon, Black, Light Brown, White, Taupe, and Pumpkin. Once the squares are dry, remove the stickers.
- 5. Using the tissue paper technique, trace the multiple leaf designs onto the two squares with no cutout.
- 6. Paint 1 coat of contrasting color onto the paper cutouts and place paint side down on the matching leaf shape. Press down on the cutout to transfer the color and remove the paper. The sample shows Pumpkin on the Gray square, White on the Golden Yellow and Maroon squares, Gray on the Black square, and Maroon on the Light Brown square. The Golden Yellow leaf is on the bare bisque with no square.
- 7. Trace the multiple leaf designs on the 2 remaining squares using the tissue paper technique. Fill in the leaves with Taupe and Black writer bottles.
- 8. Using White, Black, and Taupe writer bottles, add the designs in the centers of the solid leaves. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

GIVE THANKS PLATTER

Pottery Painting Project

Note: This project is painted in steps according to the colors, as explained in steps 2 through 13.

Supplies

Bisque: Square Coupe Charger

Pattern Tissue paper Pencil

Sharpie

Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Orange, Yellow, Golden Yellow, Pumpkin, Dark Brown, Medium Brown, Cream, Tan, Olive Green, White Writer bottle in Black

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Orange: Paint the H and the middle section of the V with 3 coats.
- 3. Yellow: Paint the G and the K with 1 coat.
- 4. Olive Green: Paint the A with 3 coats and the plaid lines on the G.
- 5. Golden Yellow: Paint 2 coats on the bottom of the V; 3 coats on the buckle of the T; and 2 coats on beak of the I.
- 6. Pumpkin: Paint the inside "pie" in letter E; the groove lines of the pumpkin in the H; and the stem through the A.
- 7. Dark Brown: Paint the N with 2–3 coats and the top of the K.
- 8. Medium Brown: Paint the pumpkin stem in the H with 2 coats and 3 coats on the turkey in the I.
- 9. Cream: Paint the S with 3 coats and the woodgrain details in the N.
- 10. Tan: Paint the crust on the E and the squiggle plaid details on the S.
- 11. White: Paint the corn details in the K; highlighted the edges on the buckle on the T; eyes on the turkey on letter I; and the top section of the letter V.
- 12. Red: Paint the turkey wattle on the I.
- 13. Dark Olive Green: Paint the rosemary leaves on the branch in the A.
- 14. Outline each letter with a Black writer bottle, except for the crust section of the E. Shade the crust with Medium Brown. Let dry.
- 15. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Glaze Colors


Pale Blue, Light Yellow, Golden Yellow, Cream, Taupe, Denim Blue, Maroon, Black, White, Tan Writer bottle in Black

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Trace the outlines of the hat, arms, and crow onto contact paper. Cut out and adhere firmly to the plate, aligning with the traced pattern.
- 3. Sponge paint the background Pale Blue, using lighter application in the areas closest to the gnome and heavier application closer to the edges. Remove the stickers.
- 4. Cut out the 3 separate beard sections. Paint the largest section Light Yellow and press color side down on the plate, aligning with the traced pattern and smoothing down the edges. Remove the paper. Paint the middle section cutout Golden Yellow and position over the large painted section; pat down and smooth to the edges. Remove the paper. Paint the smallest section Cream and position over the middle section; pat down and smooth to the edges. Remove the paper. Cut out 5–6 small strips and paint each with one of the beard colors. Press down randomly to give added dimension.
- 5. For the arms: Paint the largest stripe with 1 coat of Taupe. Paint the next stripe with 1 coat of Denim Blue. Paint the next stripe on top of the large Denim Blue stripe with 1 coat of Maroon. Paint 1-coat vertical stripes of Maroon and Denim Blue on the sleeve overlapping the Taupe and Denim Blue horizontal stripes.
- 6. Paint the Hat with 2–3 coats of Taupe. Paint one patch with 2 coats of Denim Blue and the other with Maroon.
- 7. Paint the crow with 2–3 coats of Black. Paint the beak with 2 coats of Golden Yellow. Paint the eyes with 2 coats of White. Add a Black dot for the pupil of the eye and a Black squiggle at the top of the head for feathers.
- 8. Outline the design with Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Cream, Red, Maroon, Pumpkin, Medium Brown, Light Brown, Dark Brown, Red Brown, Tan Writer bottles in White, Dark Brown, Pumpkin

Directions

- 1. Transfer the outlines of the three pie shapes to contact paper using the tissue paper technique: Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the contact paper and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design.
- 2. Cut out the contact paper shapes. Also cut contact paper strips for the lattice design on the cherry pie slice, which will be used in step 6. Adhere the pie shapes firmly to the plate.
- 3. Paint the plate with 1–2 coats of Cream using a paint wash technique by dipping brush in water and then in color. Let dry. Remove the contact paper shapes.
- 4. Trace the lettering onto the plate using the tissue paper technique.
- 5. For the cherry pie: apply the pie strip cutouts from step 2. Paint the open areas with 1 coat of watered-down Red. Once dry, dab in a layer of watered-down Maroon. Once dry, dab in a few spots of Red. Remove the contact paper strips and paint the lines with 2 coats of Tan. Paint the horizontal lines 1 more time to emphasize the overlapping pattern.
- 6. For the pumpkin pie, paint the pie shape 2–3 coats of Pumpkin. Once dry, paint the whip cream in the center with 1–2 coats of Cream.
- 7. For the pecan pie, paint 2 coats of Medium Brown for base. Once dry, trace the oval pecan shapes on the slice. Paint in the pecans with 2 coats of Light Brown, Dark Brown, and Red Brown. (You can also use painted thumbprints for this part of the design.) Once dry, outline the swirls on the pecans with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 8. Paint all the crust edges with 2 coats of Tan. Using a liner brush, add Medium Brown outlining details on the edges.
- 9. Add details to the whipped cream on the pumpkin pie with a White writer bottle.
- 10. Create the lettering with a Dark Brown writer bottle and add the font shadow with a Pumpkin writer bottle. Let dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. Don't trace the lettering on the sign yet.
- 2. Paint the goalpost with 3 coats of Bright Yellow. Outline the shape with 1 coat of Golden Yellow.
- 3. Paint the cupcake frosting with 3 coats of Red, White, or Bright Blue. For the swirl on top, slightly dampen a liner brush and mix with Maroon for the red frosting, with Gray for the white frosting, and with Bright Blue for the Blue frosting.
- 4. Paint the bottom of the cupcakes with 3 coats of Chocolate Brown. Once dry, use a White writer bottle to add the football stitches.
- 5. Paint the grass area with 3 coats of Green. Once dry, use a White writer bottle to make the field lines. Using a liner brush, paint Dark Green grass sprigs between the cupcakes.
- 6. Paint the sign with 3 coats of Red. Once dry, reposition the tissue tracing on the sign and transfer the lettering. Create the lettering with Black and White writer bottles.
- 7. Make the stick figure with a Black writer bottle.
- 8. Using the back end of a paintbrush, add multicolored dots to the background. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

LEAF MUG

Bisque: Large Mug Pattern printed on plain paper Scissors Contact paper

Small and medium brushes

Glaze Colors

Black, Gray, Golden Yellow, Pumpkin, Maroon, Olive Green, Writer bottles in Dark Teal


Directions

- 1. Cut out the larger leaf and the four smaller leaves from the paper pattern.
- 2. Trace around the larger leaf 4 times on contact paper and cut out. Adhere contact paper leaves firmly to the mug.
- 3. Mix 1 part Black and 2 parts Gray. Paint the mug with 3 coats of this Charcoal mixture.
- 4. Remove the leaf stickers.
- 5. Paint a paper leaf with Golden Yellow. Press it paint side down within the open space of one of the larger leaves. Press down the paper to the edges, then remove.
- 6. Repeat step 5 for each of the other leaves, using Pumpkin, Maroon, and Olive Green.
- 7. Outline the leaves with a Dark Teal writer bottle and fill in with simple doodle designs. Let dry.
- 8. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.


White, Gray, Yellow, Orange, Coral, Red, Bright Green, Light Teal, Dark Teal, Medium Purple, Deep Purple Writer bottles in Black, Gray

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the whole pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing on the contact paper and retrace the just the outline with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design.
- 2. Cut out the bat sticker and adhere firmly to the plate, with the feet at the very top. Also cut out two separate circles and two separate small triangles for use in step 6.
- Sponge 1 coat of White over the entire plate. Add Gray to the same sponge, and apply it just around the left and lower edge in a crescent moon shape, narrowing the area as it rounds towards the right side of the plate. Remove the sticker
- 4. Align the tissue paper tracing with the unpainted bat area on the plate. Trace the details with the Sharpie.
- 5. For the wings, start with the lightest colors near the body, ending with the deepest colors to the outer sections of the wings. Paint each section with 3 coats of Yellow, Orange, Coral, Red, Bright Green, Light Teal, Dark Teal, Medium Purple, and Deep Purple.
- 6. Adhere the stickers for the eyes and fangs. Paint the body with 2–3 coats of Black.
- 7. Remove the stickers. Add Green dots in the center of the eyes for pupils.
- 8. Using a Gray writer bottle, add a smile and outline head and body.
- 9. Outline the wing sections with a Black writer bottle using sketchy, broken lines. Let dry.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Taupe, Off White, Peach, Orange, Black


Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. The skeleton body is a watercolor technique that is meant to give blotchy coverage. Water down Taupe and drop color in puddles over the head, body, and arms, omitting the eyes, bowtie, and rib cage.
- 3. Repeat the same technique with Off White but placing color just here and there over the painted Taupe areas. Some of the Taupe should show through.
- 4. Dip a liner brush in water and then in Taupe. Highlight some small areas of the skeleton body.
- 5. Paint the bowtie with 2 coats of Peach.
- 6. Mix Black and a little Taupe to create a Charcoal haze color. Paint the rib cage, the mouth, and the nose.
- 7. Paint the outer ring of the eye Black. Paint the inner circle Off White. Let 1 coat of the Off White slightly overlap the Black. Use the back end of the paintbrush to add mismatched Black pupils.
- 8. With the back end of a brush, add dots of Orange on the bowtie.
- 9. Dip a liner brush in water and then in the mixture of Taupe and Black. Outline the body parts and bowtie.
- 10. Dip a round brush in water and Orange. Paint the background with messy brushstrokes.
- 11. Dip a brush in Black and drag the edge along the outside edge of the plate. Let dry.
- 12. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Glaze Colors

White, Cream or other skin color, Purple, Black, Orange, Deep Yellow, Green, Brown, Red, Gray


Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Paint the ghosts with 2 coats of White.
- 3. Paint the legs 2 with coats of Cream or other skin color. Also paint the feet with this color for the ghosts with flipflops and slippers.
- 4. For the ghost with socks, paint 1 coat of Purple and add small dots of Black. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Orange and the stem Green. Add 2 Cream ovals for the eyes. Add dots of White in the center of the ovals. Add dots of Black in center of the white eyes.
- 5. For the ghost with flippers, paint 2 coats of Deep Yellow. Paint the pool float with 2 coats of Green. Paint the goggles Purple. Paint inside of the goggles Cream. Add small circles of White inside the goggles. Add dots of Black in center of the white eyes.
- 6. For the ghost with high-top tennis shoes, paint the soles White, the shoe top Orange, and add details in Black. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Orange and the stem Green. Add 2 Cream ovals for the eyes. Add dots of White in the center of the ovals. Add dots of Black in center of the white eyes.
- 7. For the ghost with boots, paint 2 coats of Brown. Paint the bottom stripe of the candy corn with 2 coats of Deep Yellow, the middle stripe with 2 coats of Orange. Outline the entire candy corn in Black. Add 2 Cream circles for the eyes. Add dots of Green in the center of the circles. Add dots of Black in center of the green eyes.
- 8. For the ghost with flipflops, paint the flipflops Black. Paint the cup with 2 coats of Red and outline the cup and cup opening with Black. Paint the sunglasses Black. Add half moon shapes on top of each eye section of the glasses.
- 9. For the ghost with slippers, paint the slippers 2 coats of Green. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Orange and the stem Green. Paint Black oval outlines for the eyes with a dot in each center of the eye outline.
- 10. Outline each ghost with Gray. Let dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUNFLOWER OWL MUG

Bisque: Large mug

Pattern

Contact paper

Pencil Sharpie Scissors

Small and medium brushes



Black, Orange, White Writer bottle in White


Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the owl onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the mug and retrace the pattern (including the wing) with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Trace the flower silhouette onto contact paper and cut out. Adhere the sticker to the mug, aligning with the traced pattern.
- 3. Paint the owl with 2-3 coats of Black.
- 4. Peel off the flower sticker.
- 5. Paint the flower with 3 coats of Orange, leaving the eyes unpainted.
- 6. Paint the centers of the eyes with 2 oats of Black.
- 7. With a White writer bottle, add dots to the eyes and squiggles on the wings.
- 8. Paint the inside of the mug with 2–3 coats of Orange, leaving sketchy brushstrokes toward the top edge. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

WHEELBARROW WISHES PLATE

Pottery Painting Project

Supplies

Bisque: Coupe dinner

Pattern Tissue paper Pencil Sharpie

Scissors

Small and medium brushes

Fan brush Liner brush Water

Glaze Colors

Taupe, Cream, Dark Brown, Olive Green, Teal

Directions

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Water down Taupe. Dip a fan brush in the mixture and swipe brush slowly along the edges of the diamond shape. Continue this technique to fill in to the edge of the plate.
- 3. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Cream. Paint the stem with 2 coats of Taupe. Paint the pumpkin groove details with 1 coat of Taupe. Paint the stem details with 1 coat of Dark Brown.
- 4. Paint each leaf with 2 coats of Olive Green. Outline the leaves and the stem with 1 coat of Dark Brown.
- 5. Paint the entire wheelbarrow with 2 coats of Taupe. Dip a dry flat brush in Teal, slightly dab off, and paint the wheelbarrow with vertical and horizontal lines to create a plaid pattern, using only 1 coat on a stripe. You do not want full coverage; some Taupe should still show through. Add some Cream to the same brush and paint a similar pattern here and there to create texture. Repeat the random brush strokes with Olive Green.
- 6. Paint the wheels with 2 coats of Dark Brown. Add a line of Cream to highlight the spokes and the stand.
- 7. Using a liner brush, outline the edges of the wheelbarrow in Dark Brown.
- 8. Add Teal and Olive Green stitch-like lines along the edges of the diamond shape. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 1. Using graphite paper, trace the Alien onto the canvas.
- 2. Paint the background Black.
- 3. For the galaxy swirl, start in the center with Teal, stippling paint and extending into the second curve of the swirl. Add Blue and continue to fill in swirl, blending colors as you go. Add Purple and continue with same technique. Add Light Purple and blend as it ends into the Black. With the same brush, pick up some White and blend into the purples and blues.
- 4. Speckle the background with White.
- 5. Paint the alien's horns and teeth White. Paint the body Orange. Paint the eyelid Red. Paint the parts of the eye White, then Teal, then Black.
- 6. With small liner brush, outline the eye elements, the teeth, and the smile with Black. Allow to dry.



- 5. Outline the jar with Black using a small liner brush. Allow to dry.



BOHO RAINBOW

Board Art Painting Project

Any color combination can be used for this project. Ideally, the trendy colors will coordinate with the felt pompoms.

Supplies

Wood board, 6"x9"
Baby wipes
Pattern
Graphite paper
Pencil
Water
Small bowl

Assorted brushes
Twine, about 30 pieces cut in 2" lengths

Hot glue gun (can substitute school glue for younger children)

Felt pompoms (1 cm ball)




Cream, Mossy Green, Gold, Teal, Taupe

Directions

- 1. Dip a baby wipe in Cream and paint the background with a wash, using the wipe to apply the color.
- 2. Trace the rainbow design on the board using graphite paper.
- 3. Paint the rainbow stripes in Mossy Green, Gold, and Teal, leaving a small space between each rainbow stripe.
- 4. Paint a thin stripe of Taupe between the rainbow stripes. Let dry.
- 5. Turn the board over. Using the hot glue gun, attach the twine pieces along the edge so they line up with the inside and outside edges of the rainbow on the front. (If using school glue, place a piece of tape over the glued pieces to be able to work on the front of the board while the glue is drying.)
- 6. Glue the felt pompoms along the bottom of the rainbow, coordinating the pompom colors to the colors of the stripes.


Cream, Teal Green, Lime Green, Taupe, Red, Leaf Green, Dark Brown, Golden Yellow

Directions

- 1. Dip a baby wipe in Cream and paint the background with a wash, using the wipe to apply the color. Let dry.
- 2. Trace the apple design on the board using graphite paper.
- 3. Mix equal parts of Teal Green and Lime Green. Paint 1 coat around the apple shape using horizontal brushstrokes. (It's okay if the paint extends onto the apple.) While the Green is still wet, use the chippy brush to create a distressed look by painting some Cream and Taupe along the edges and where the boards meet.
- 4. Paint the apple with 1–2 coats of Red. Paint the leaves with 2 coats of Leaf Green.
- 5. Mix equal parts of Red and Dark Brown to create Maroon. Paint a thin outline around the apple and the crease under the apple leaf.
- 6. Mix equal parts of Leaf Green and Dark Brown to create Deep Olive. Paint a thin outline around the leaves.
- 7. Using a pencil, lightly write the words FRESH CIDER. Using a medium flat brush, paint the letters White with sketchy brushstrokes.
- 8. Outline the entire shape with Golden Yellow.
- 9. Add a little more distressing along the edges with Dark Brown if desired. Let dry.

Chippy brush



Acrylic Colors

Cream, Taupe, Maroon (or mix of Red and Brown), Orange, Golden Yellow, Dark Brown

Directions

- 1. Dip a baby wipe in Cream and paint the background with a wash, using the wipe to apply the color.
- 2. Cut out the banner pieces and lay them out on the board, evenly space. Lightly trace around each one in pencil. One at a time, paint the paper banners with 1 heavy coat of Cream, and press them onto the board paint side down, following the pencil marks.
- 3. With a chippy craft brush, paint the background lightly with Taupe to create a distressed background. Remove the banner pieces immediately. Allow to dry. **NOTE: Steps 2 and 3 need to be completed together. If the paint under the banner pieces is allowed to dry, the patterns cannot be removed cleanly.**
- 4. Using graphite paper, trace on the letters and the pumpkins.
- 5. Using a liner brush, paint the letters Dark Brown.
- 6. Paint the pumpkins: one Maroon, one Golden Yellow, and one Orange.
- 7. Outline the pumpkins in Taupe.
- 8. Paint Taupe lines near the tops of the banner pieces to resemble string. Allow to dry.
