ABCs of Halloween

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Square dinner plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Fan brush
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Pale Blue, Deep Orange, Bright Orange, Bright Green, Light Green, White,
Black

Writer bottles: Black, White

DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the outline of the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Apply 1 messy coat of Pale Blue to the background of the plate with a fan brush. (It's okay if this overlaps the design, which should still be visible through the light coat of color.)
3. Paint 2-3 coats of Deep Orange on the letters F and M, the bottom section of the J, the witch hat, and the top of the candy corn Y.
4. Paint alternating sections of the pumpkin with 3 coats of Deep Orange and Bright Orange.
5. Paint 2-3 coats of Bright Orange on the middle section of the J, the middle of the candy corn Y, and the center of the R.
6. Paint 2-3 coats of Bright Green in the center of the letter A. Use 1 coat of this color to add zigzags for the pumpkin leaf, dashes in the O, and the spider web in the D.
7. Paint the eyeballs on the M and the spider on the S in Light Green.
8. Paint the ghost, the top of the J, and the bottom of the candy corn with 3 coats of White.
9. Dip the back end of a brush in White and add dots in the center of the eyeballs on the M and on the witch's hat.
10. Paint the cat head and the bat with 2 coats of Black.
11. Use a Black writer bottle to fill in all the letters, the dots on the eyeballs on the M, the eyes on the spider, and the hanging thread on the S.
12. Use a White writer bottle to add details to the cat face and the bat.
13. Dip the end of brush in Bright Orange and add dots for the ghost eyes. Let dry.
14. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Oval coupe platter
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Liner brush
Chippy craft brush

Glaze Paint Colors

Cream, Pumpkin, Taupe, Olive Green, Golden Yellow, Dark Brown

DIRECTIONS

1. Paint the background with 1 coat of Cream.
2. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
NOTE: Do not trace the leaf veins, the small cream branches, or the berries onto the platter at this point. They will be traced on in step 7.
3. Paint the larger, wavy-edged leaf with 2–3 coats of Pumpkin.
4. Paint the slightly smaller leaf with 2–3 coats of Taupe.
5. Paint the banner with 3 coats of Cream.
6. Paint the branches and small leaves with 3 coats of Olive Green.
7. Once the color is dry, reposition the tissue tracing and trace on the small branches, berry clusters, and veins in the large leaves.
8. Paint the small branches with 2–3 coats of Cream.
9. Paint the berry clusters with 2–3 coats of Golden Yellow.
10. Outline the two larger leaves and the banner with 1 coat of Olive Green using a liner brush.
11. Paint the veins in the larger leaves with 1 coat of Olive Green using a liner brush. Let dry.
12. Using the liner brush with Taupe, paint just along the edge of the small Cream branches and leaves, like shading. Also outline each berry with 1 coat of Taupe, and use 1 light coat of Taupe to paint over the outline and veins in the larger leaf. Let dry.
13. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the lettering onto the banner area.
14. Paint the lettering in Dark Brown using a writer bottle or liner brush. Let dry completely.
15. Dip the tips of a chippy craft brush in Taupe. Paint wispy strokes over the background area around the design. It's okay if a few brushstrokes overlap the painted design. Let dry.
16. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Bisque: Rim charger
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Small sponge dotter

Glaze Paint Colors

Pumpkin, Taupe, Medium Brown, Cream
Writer bottles: Dark Taupe, Pumpkin



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Use a medium round brush to paint the pie with 3 coats of Pumpkin.
3. Paint the base of the pie and the whipped topping with 3 coats of Cream.
4. Paint the crust edge with 3 coats of Taupe.
5. Using a small brush, add wiggly lines across the pie base with Taupe.
6. Using a sponge dotter, add dots in Pumpkin on the plate rim.
7. Dip the handle end of the dotter into Taupe and add smaller dots to fill in the border.
8. Paint the lettering in Pumpkin with a writer bottle or a small brush.
9. Outline each element of the pie with a Dark Taupe writer bottle. Let dry.
10. Glaze and fire to Cone 06

Bisque: Shallow 8" bowl
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Fan brush

Glaze Paint Colors

Orange, Golden Yellow, Bright Orange, Black, Gray



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the pumpkin with 3 coats of Orange.
3. Paint the innermost band of the rainbow with 3 coats of Golden Yellow, the next one with 3 coats of Bright Orange, then Black, and then Gray.
4. Paint the stars with 3 coats of Black.
5. Dip the back end of a paintbrush into each of the colors in turn and add dots on background in varying sizes.
6. With a small brush, paint the face and the outline of the pumpkin with Black.
7. With a small brush, outline the stars with Golden Yellow. Let dry.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

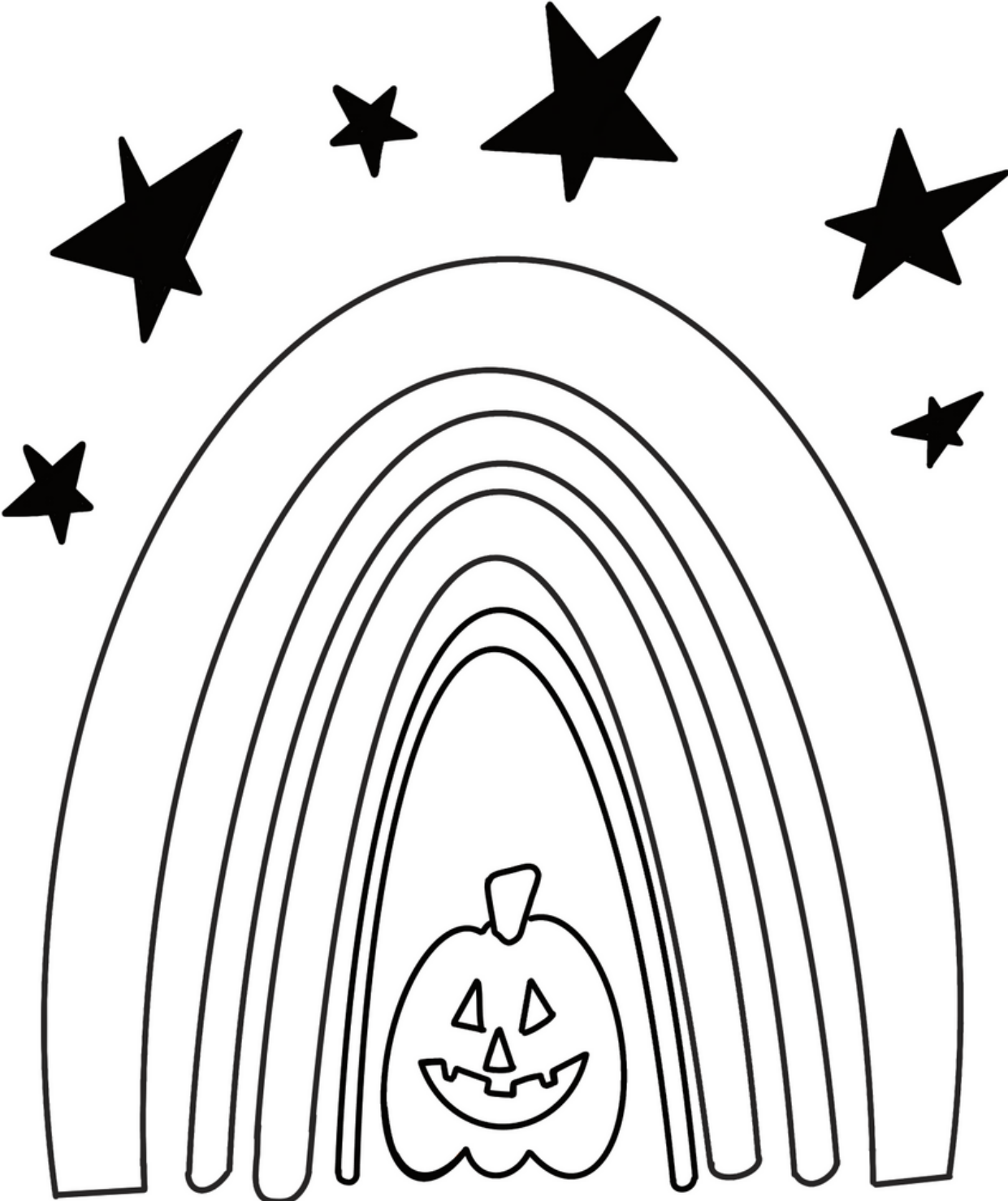

Bisque: Large mug
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Copy paper
Scissors
Small and medium round brushes
Paper
Fan brush



Glaze Paint Colors

Golden Yellow, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, Taupe
Writer bottle: Black

DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Use tissue paper to trace out the 9 leaf designs onto paper. Cut out and set aside.
3. One at a time, paint each paper leaf cutout with a thick layer using a fan brush and place color side down onto the corresponding leaf tracing on the mug. Be sure to place the "front leaves" of the design down first, and alternate colors between Golden Yellow, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, and Taupe. Press the paper cutouts down on the mug to transfers the color.
4. Once all leaves are placed, use a small round brush to paint 3 coats of each color in the ovals around the top edge of the mug. Be sure to alternate the colors so that two of the same color never touch.
5. Remove the paper leaves.
6. Use a Black writer bottle to create the details on the leaves, the outlines, and the words. Let dry.
7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

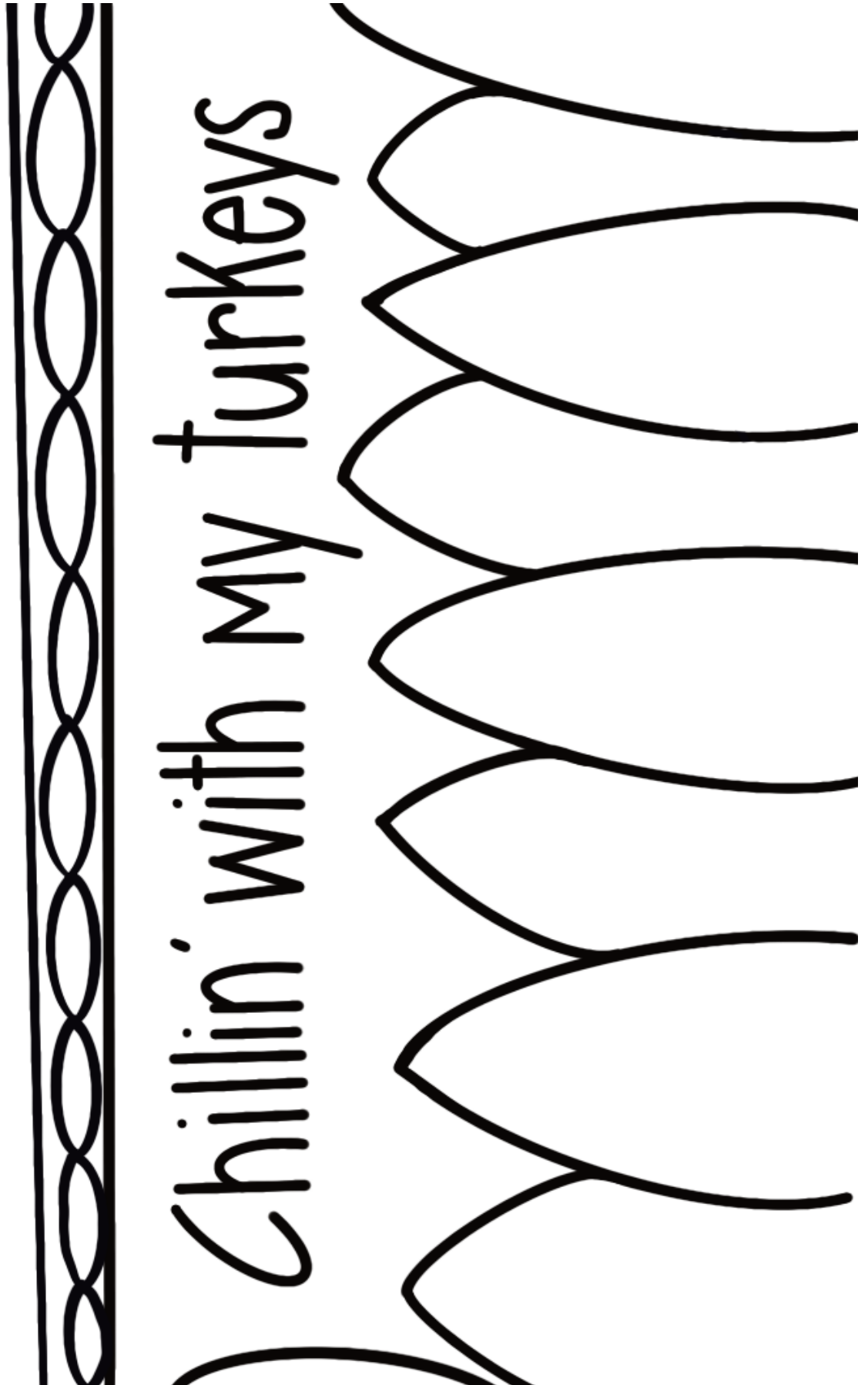

Bisque: Coupe charger
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Small liner brush

Glaze Paint Colors

Taupe, Dark Brown, Teal, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, Pea Green,
Light Tan



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the leaf design and the lettering. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Mix 2 parts of Taupe to 1 part Dark Brown. Using a small liner brush, paint 2 coats of this color on the curved branches.
3. Paint each leaf with 3 coats of color, alternating between Teal, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, Taupe, Pea Green, and Light Tan. Avoid having two leaves of the same color next to each other.
4. Using a small brush or writer bottle, paint the two FALL words with 3 coats of Teal.
5. Paint the word SWEET with 3 coats of Pumpkin. Let dry.
6. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

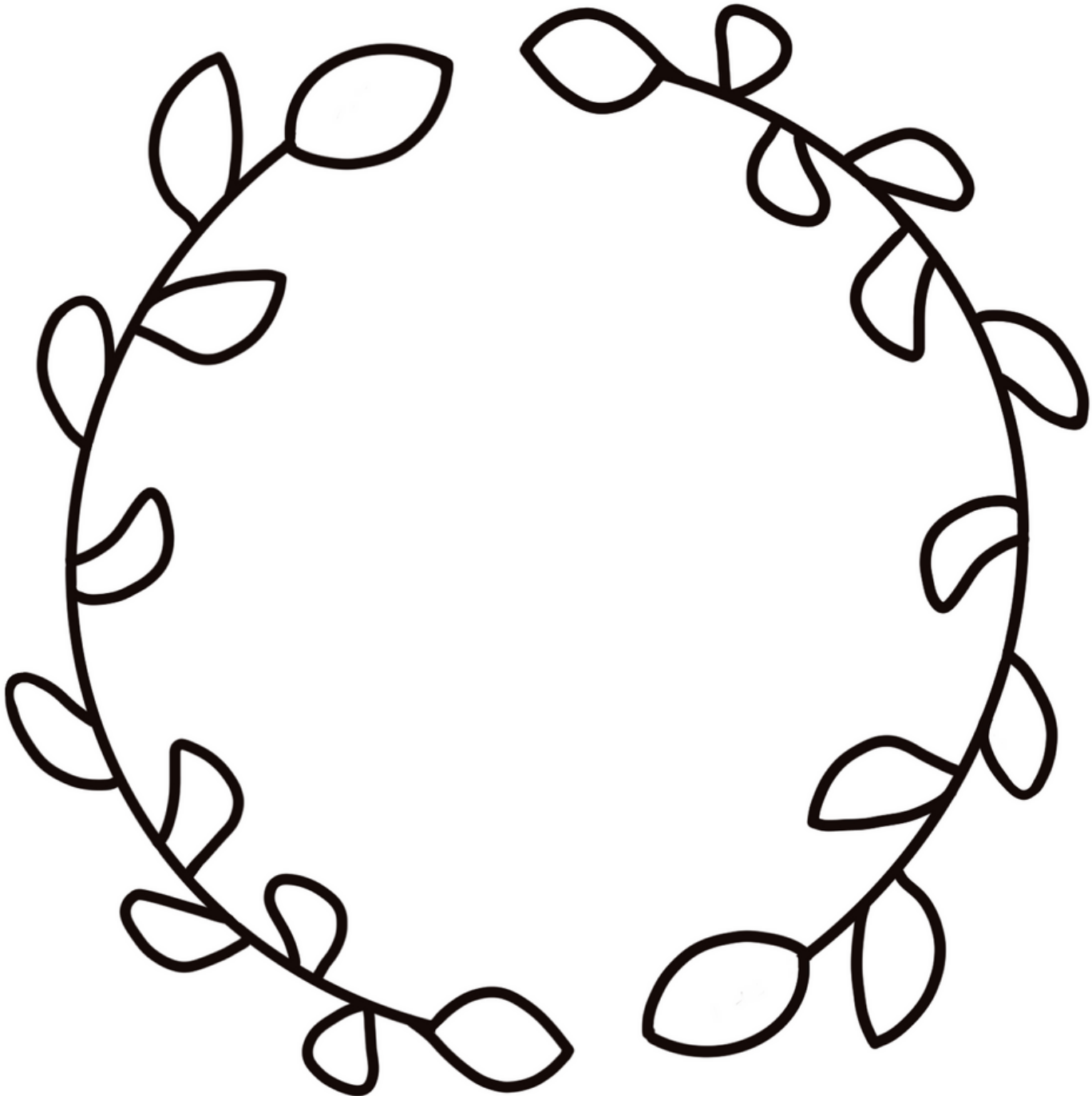

Bisque: Square coupe salad plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Contact paper
Scissors
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Golden Yellow, Teal Blue, Darker Teal Blue, Cream



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Trace the pattern shapes onto contact paper. Cut out the shapes and adhere on the bisque in the traced areas.
3. Paint the background with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
4. Remove the circle stickers and paint the traced pattern with 2 coats of Teal Blue, leaving a white border around the edge.
5. Remove the stem stickers and paint the center of the stem with 2–3 coats of Teal Blue, leaving a white border along the outside edges of the stem.
6. Remove the leaf stickers. Mix 2 parts Cream with 1 part Golden Yellow. Paint the leaves with 2 coats of this mixture, leaving a white border around the edge. Once dry, dip the back end of a brush in Cream and add dots on the leaves.
7. Paint the center pattern of the circles with 1 coat of Darker Teal Blue. Let dry.
8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

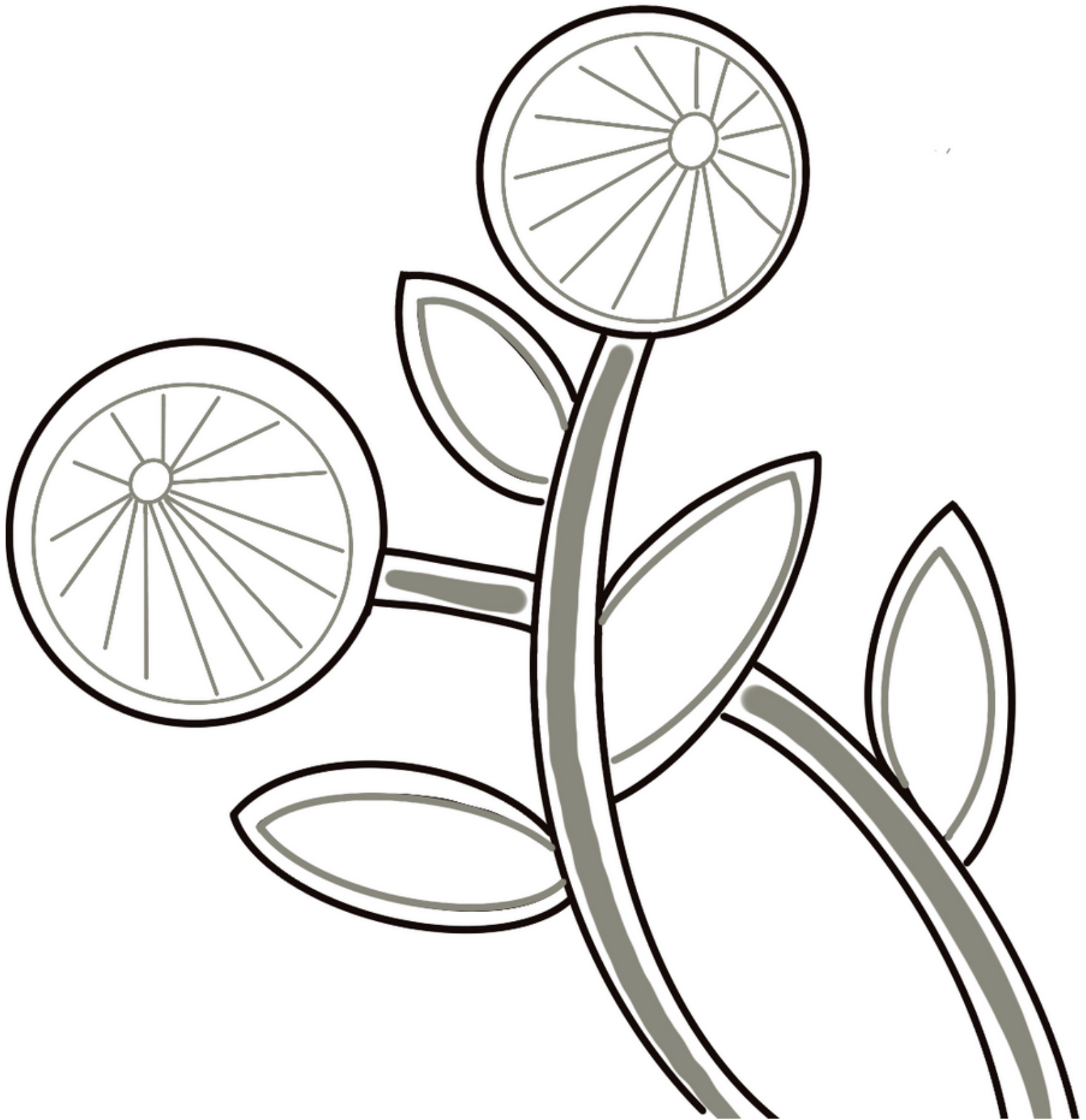

For the Love of Pumpkins and Candy Corn Charger

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Squircle or square charger
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Chippy craft brush

Glaze Paint Colors

White, Orange, Yellow, Taupe, Brown



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the letter L, the tip of the candy corn, and two stripes of the letter E with 3 coats of White.
3. Paint the pumpkin, the middle stripe of the letter E, and one dot on the letter L with 3 coats of Orange.
4. Paint the bottom stripe of the letter E, the middle of the candy corn, and two dots on the letter L with 3 coats of Yellow.
5. Paint the top stripe of the letter E and 2 dots on the letter L with 3 coats of Taupe.
6. Using a chippy craft brush, streak White horizontally through the colored portions of the letter E.
7. Use a liner brush to add white vertical lines down the pumpkin segments.
8. Use the liner brush to outline each letter, the circles in the letter L, the candy corn sections, and the pumpkin with 1–2 coats of Brown. Let dry.
9. Add dashed horizontal lines in the E and around the dots in the letter L.
10. Paint the stem of pumpkin with 3 coats of Brown. Let dry.
11. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

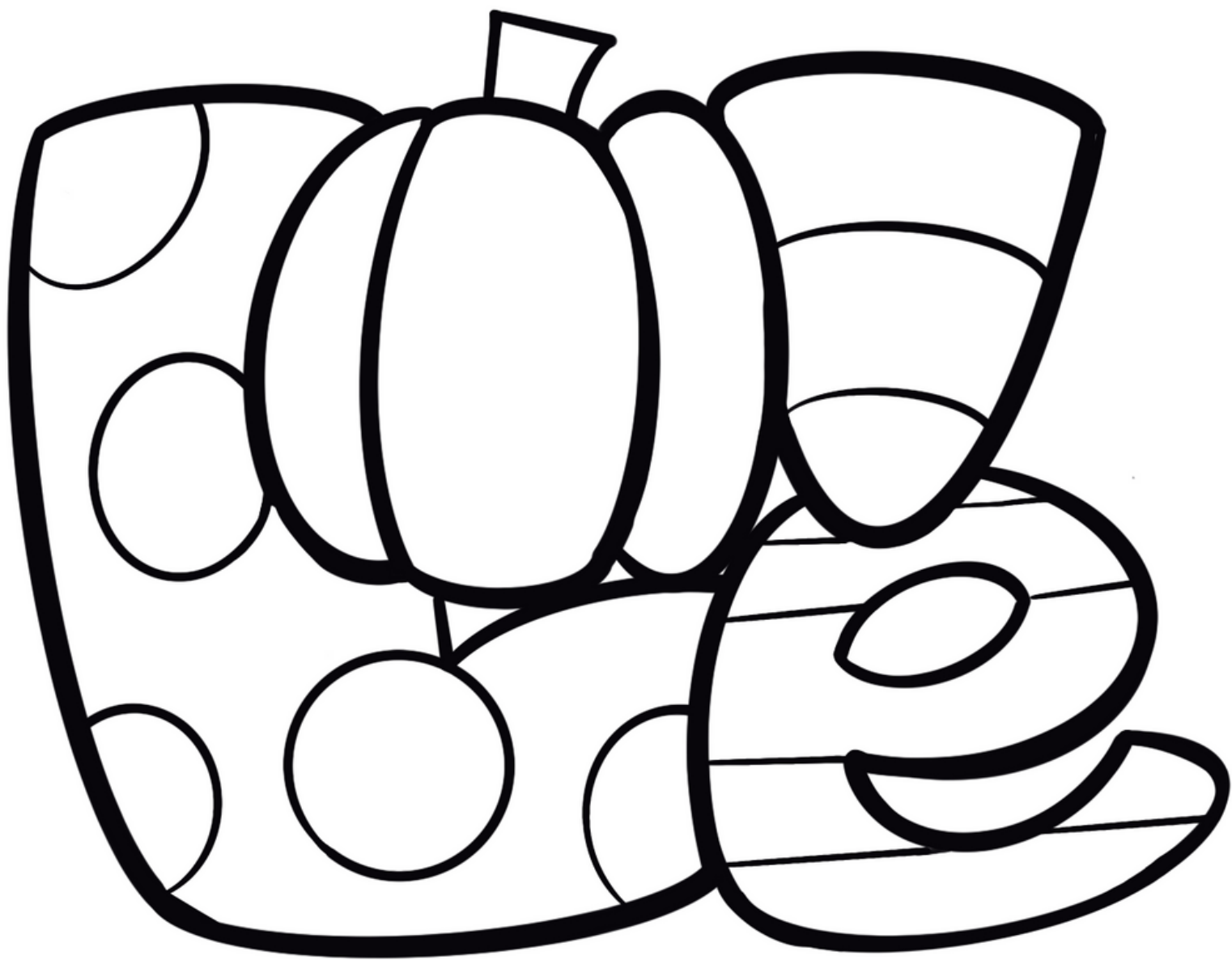

Bisque: Coupe charger
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
¼" painter's tape
Sponge
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Grass Green, Blue or other team color, Golden Yellow, Black, White
Writer bottle: White



DIRECTIONS

1. Place lines of thin painter's tape horizontally across the plate, about 2½ inches apart.
2. Sponge the background with 2 coats of Grass Green.
3. Once dry, pull up the tape. While the background is drying, work on the next step.
4. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the outline of the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
5. Paint the helmet with 3 coats of Blue or your favorite team color.
6. Paint the goalpost with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
7. Paint the lettering with 3 coats of Black.
8. With a small brush or writer bottle, paint small horizontal lines along the edge of the plate with White. There should be 8 evenly spaced lines between each set of larger tape lines. Let dry.
9. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Square plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Golden Yellow, Cream, Dark Teal Blue, Bright Orange, Light Teal Blue
Blue
Writer bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Mix 2 parts of Golden Yellow with 1 part Cream. Paint 3 coats of this color onto pumpkin #2. Reserve this color for later use.
3. Paint pumpkin #1 with 3 coats of Cream.
4. Paint pumpkin #3 with 3 coats of Dark Teal Blue.
5. Paint pumpkin #4 with 3 coats of Bright Orange.
6. Paint the stems of pumpkins #1 and #3 with 2-3 coats of Bright Orange.
7. Paint the stems of pumpkins #2 and #4 with 2-3 coats of Dark Teal Blue.
8. Paint the leaf with 2-3 coats of Dark Teal Blue.
9. Dip the tip of a medium round brush into Dark Teal Blue. Stipple (dab) this sparsely on pumpkin #1, creating a shadow along the bottom of the pumpkin. Add a few vertical brushstrokes along the grooves between the pumpkin segments.
10. Use the same stippling technique to apply Light Teal Blue on the top area of pumpkin #3. The painted effect should be heavier on the left side of the pumpkin.
11. Use the same stippling technique to paint the shadow effect on the right side of pumpkin #2 with Bright Orange.
12. Use the same stippling technique to paint pumpkin #4 with the mixed paint color (from step 2) used on pumpkin #2.
13. Outline each pumpkin, the leaf, and the groove lines on pumpkins #1 and #2 with a Black writer bottle.
14. Outline the lettering with a Black writer bottle. Let dry.
15. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

Contact paper

Glaze Paint Colors

Cream, Grayish Brown, Bright Light Blue, Bright Orange, Cream
Writer bottles: Dark Brown, Cream



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design.
2. Position the tissue tracing on contact paper and trace the banner shape. Cut out the banner and apply the sticker to the bisque.
3. Paint the mug with 2–3 coats of Cream.
4. Once dry, position the tissue tracing on the mug and trace the spots with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
5. Paint the spots with 3 coats of Grayish Brown.
6. Remove the banner sticker and paint the shape with 3 coats of Bright Light Blue.
7. Once dry, position the tissue tracing over the shape and trace the lettering and the pumpkin.
8. Paint the pumpkin with 3 coats of Bright Orange, avoiding the dot shapes.
9. Paint the dots on the pumpkin with 2–3 coats of Cream.
10. With a Dark Brown writer bottle, trace the lettering and add a sketchy outline around the banner and the pumpkin. Also add accent lines on the Gray Brown spots.
11. With a Cream writer bottle, add small spirals and dots around the edges of the banner. Let dry.
12. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Coupe dinner plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Contact paper
Scissors
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Sponge

Glaze Paint Colors

Teal, Dark Gray, Light Gray, Berry Purple, Bright Light Green,
Bright Blue, Orange, Black, White
Writer bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Don't trace the spiderweb onto the plate yet.
2. Use the tissue paper to trace the bat, the center opening shape, and the small window onto contact paper. Cut these shapes out and adhere to the plate over the traced design.
3. Paint the birdhouse shape with 3 coats of Teal.
4. Paint the vertical pickets on the fence Dark Gray. Paint the horizontal pickets Light Gray. Add a few Light Gray vertical lines to highlight the edges of the vertical pickets.
5. Remove the center sticker on the birdhouse. Paint the area with 3 coats of Berry Purple. Avoid painting the spider body.
6. Paint the spider body with 3 coats of Bright Light Green.
7. Remove the sticker on the window. Paint every other section of the inside of the window with 2-3 coats of Bright Blue.
8. Paint the window border with 2-3 coats of Orange.
9. Remove the bat sticker. Paint the bat with 2 coats of Black.
10. Paint the grass and the scallop design at the bottom of the house with 2-3 coats of Bright Green.
11. Use tissue paper to trace the spider web and the details on the bat.
12. With a Black writer bottle, outline all the details on the design, including the spider, spider web, and central opening on the birdhouse.
13. Using a small brush, add details to the bat in White.
14. Sponge 1 coat of Light Gray around the house. Before completely dry, use the same sponge and add Dark Gray to the background area. Avoid the arched "ground" area.
15. Use a clean sponge to dab Bright Light Green on a few areas of the background. Let dry.
16. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

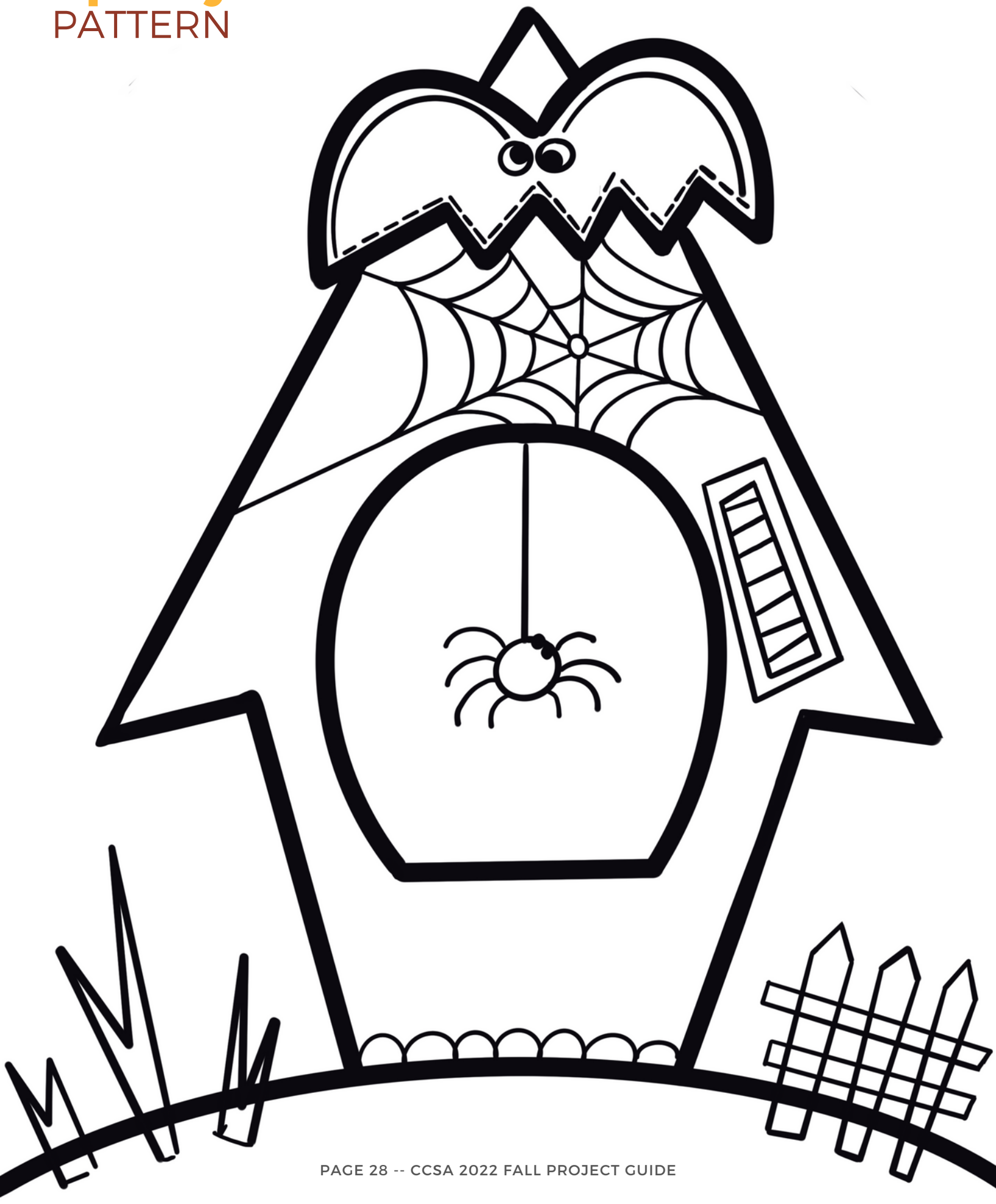

Bisque: Coupe charger
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Paper towel or scrap paper
Toothbrush

Glaze Paint Colors

Golden Yellow, Rusty Brown, Pea Green, Light Gray, Dark Brown,
Tan, Black
Writer bottle: Dark Brown



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Paint the flower petals with 3 coats of Golden Yellow. Do not paint all the way to the edge of the design; leave a bit of space between the petal and the edge.
3. Paint the curvy leaves with 3 coats of Rusty Brown. Do not paint all the way to edge of the design, leaving a bit of space between the leaf and the edge.
4. Repeat step 3 with 3 coats of Pea Green on the straight leaves.
5. Paint the vase with 3 coats of Light Gray.
6. Paint the center of the flowers with 3 coats of Dark Brown. Let dry.
7. Place a piece of paper towel or scrap paper no bigger than the design over the painted area. Dip a toothbrush in Golden Yellow and splatter the background, then repeat with Rusty Brown.
8. Using the back end of a paintbrush, add large Tan dots to the flower centers, placed toward the outer left side of the circular area.
9. Add squiggly lines on the flower petals with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
10. Use the Dark Brown writer bottle to outline everything, and add the vein details of the leaves, the stems, and line on the vase.
11. Use the back end of a smaller brush to add groupings of 3 black dots to the petals and leaves. Let dry.
12. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

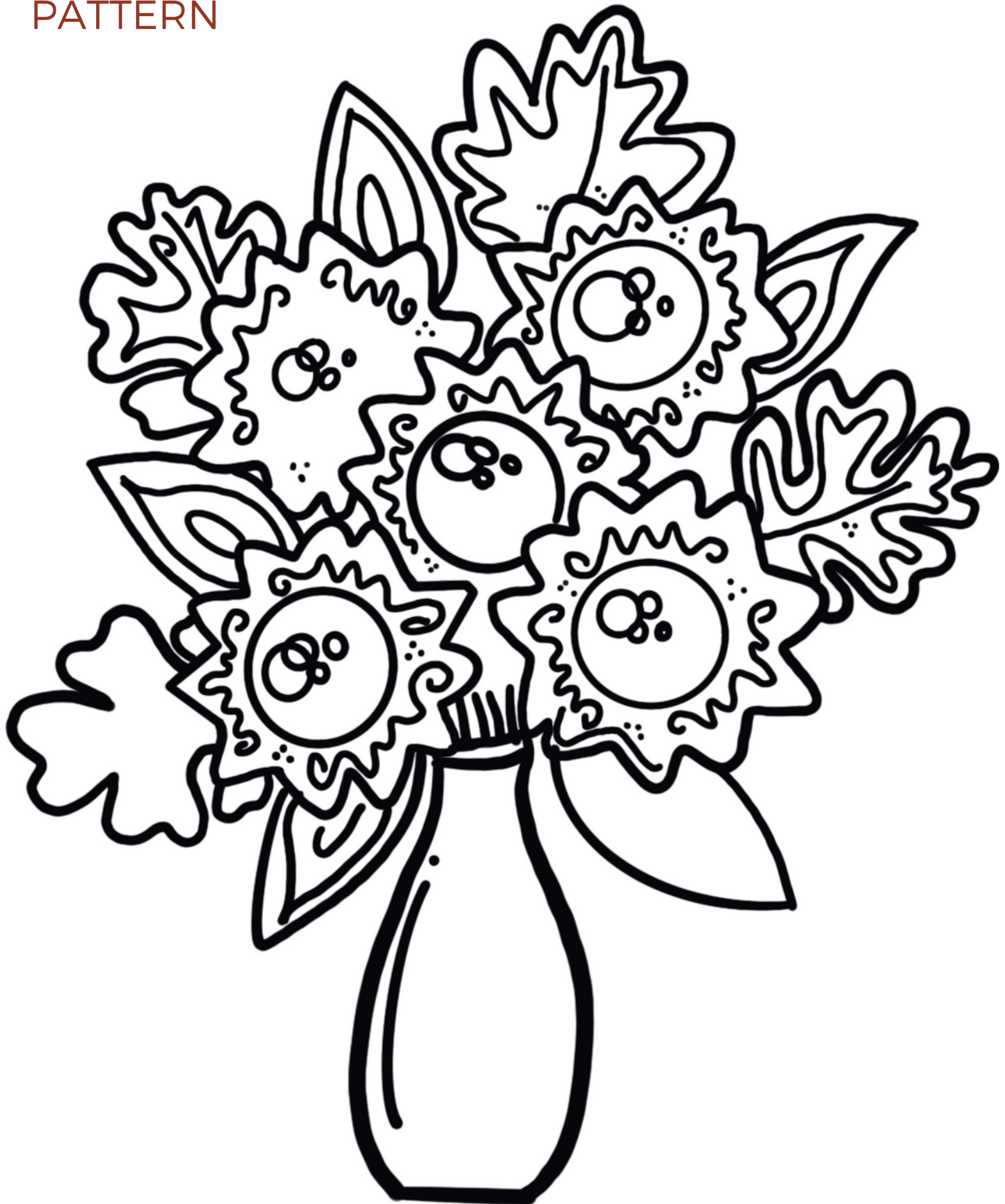

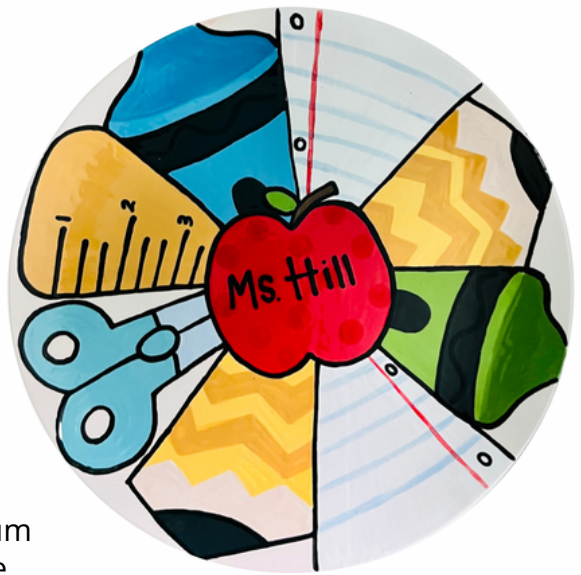

Bisque: Coupe dinner plate
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Light Yellow, Golden Yellow, Cream, Black, Light Green, Medium Green, Light Blue, Medium Blue, Light Teal, Pale Blue, White, Pink, Red, Brown
Writer bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
2. Use a pencil to lightly sketch a chevron pattern on the pencils. Paint alternating chevrons with 3 coats of Light Yellow. Once dry, fill in the blank sections with 3 coats of Medium Yellow.
3. Paint the tips of the pencils with 3 coats of Cream.
4. Mix 2 parts Cream with 1 part Black. Use this color to paint the pencil lead with 3 coats. Reserve color.
5. Paint the lower crayon (the one that is not under the apple leaf) with 3 coats of Light Green. Paint the top of the crayon with 3 coats of Medium Green.
6. Paint the blue crayon with 3 coats of Light Blue and the top of the crayon with 3 coats of Medium Blue.
7. When the crayons are dry, paint 3 coats of the charcoal color mixed in step 4 on the stripe and the oval on the crayon wrappers.
8. Paint the handles of the scissors with 3 coats of Light Teal. Paint the metal area with 3 coats of Pale Blue.
9. Paint the two areas representing looseleaf paper with 2 coats of White.
10. When the looseleaf paper area is dry, add Pale Blue horizontal lines and red vertical line with 1 coat.
11. Mix 2 parts Pink with 1 part Red and use this to paint 3 coats on the apple.
12. Dip the back end of a paintbrush in Red and add dots to the apple.
13. Paint the apple stem with 3 coats of Brown.
14. Paint the leaf with 3 coats of Light Green.
15. One completely dry, add details with a Black writer bottle. Let dry.
16. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

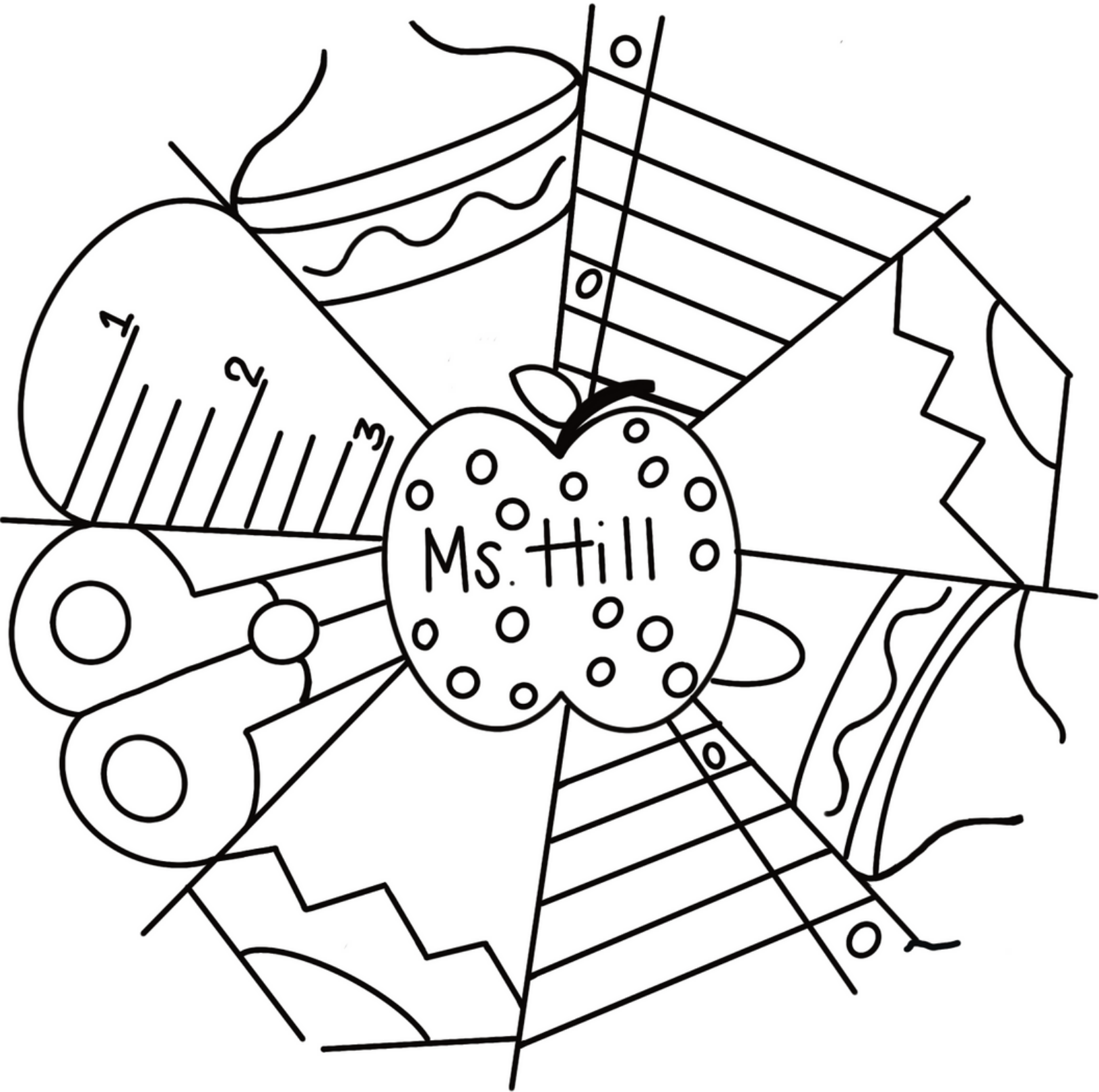

Witch's Wash Day Mug

POTTERY

SUPPLIES

Bisque: Large mug
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Fan brush
Small and medium round brushes

Glaze Paint Colors

Bright Orange, Neon Green, Dark Gray
Writer bottle: Black



DIRECTIONS

1. With a pencil, lightly sketch a curved shape at the top of the mug for the moon.
2. Using the fan brush, apply 3 coats of Bright Orange to the background, avoiding the moon area at the top.
3. Paint 3 coats of Neon Green on the inside of the mug and the moon shape at the top of the mug.
4. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
5. Paint all the shapes in the design with 3 coats of Dark Gray. Let dry.
6. Use a Black writer bottle to outline to the shapes and add the string between the two posts. Let dry.
7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

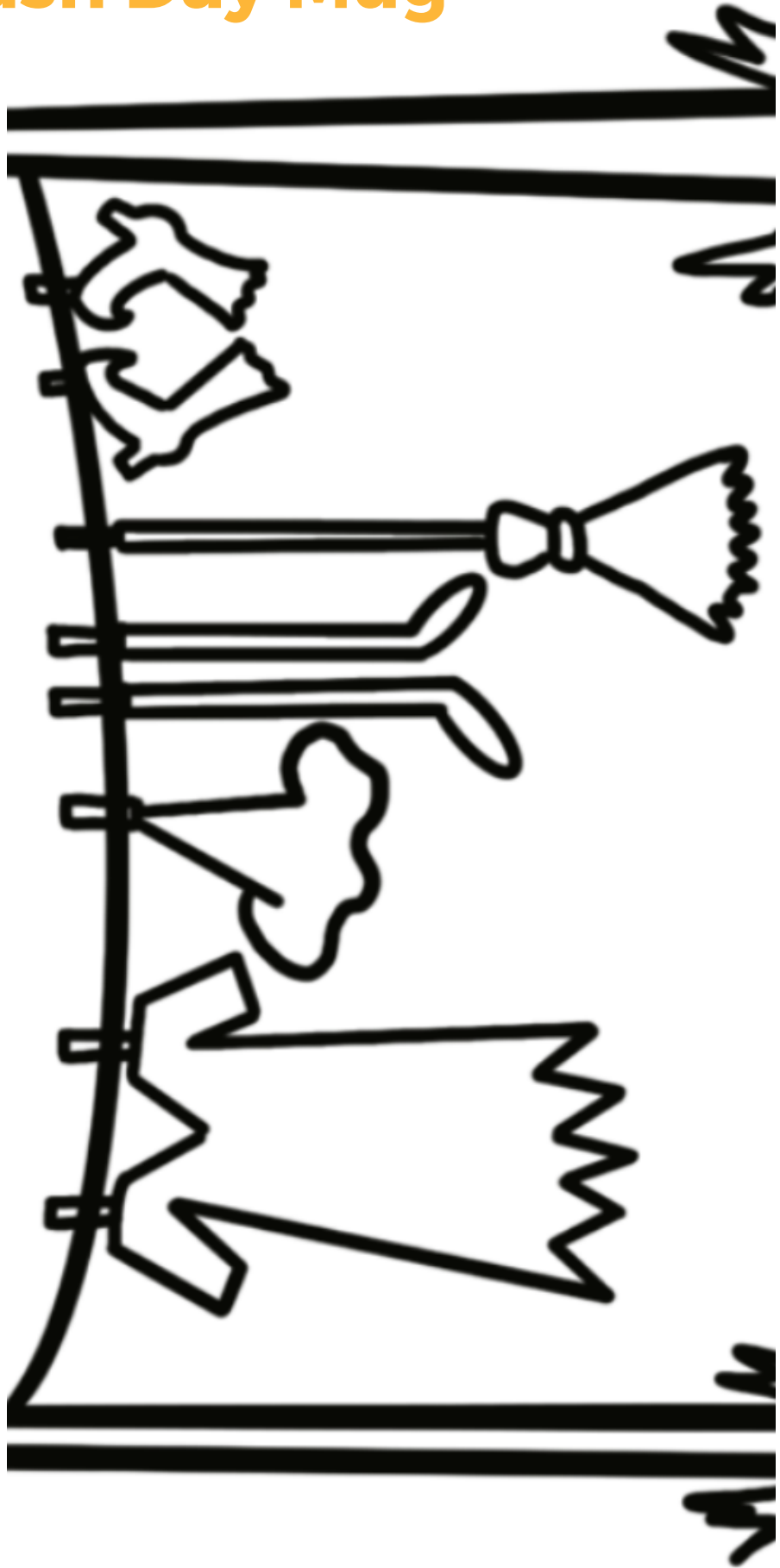

DIRECTIONS

1. Roll out two 8"x10" clay slabs, each about $\frac{1}{4}$ – $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick.
2. Place the pattern pieces on the clay. Trace around the shapes with the skewer and cut out. Smooth the edges.
3. Lay the cheesecloth over each cutout. With a rolling pin or dowel rod, press the cheesecloth into the clay to create a burlap texture.
4. Wrap the half-circle clay piece around the cone form to shape the hat. Score the edges with a wet toothbrush and attach to each other to make the hat shape. Gently remove the cone base once formed. If needed to maintain shape, stuff the inside with some newsprint.
5. For the hat brim, notch out triangles and small rectangles along the edge. Smooth the edges.
6. Score the base of the cone shape with the wet toothbrush and attach the notched piece around the bottom edge of the clay cone shape to form the hat brim.
7. Bend random edges of the hat brim to create dimension. Let dry.
8. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
9. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
10. Cut 10–12" length of twine and tie around the base of the hat for decoration.

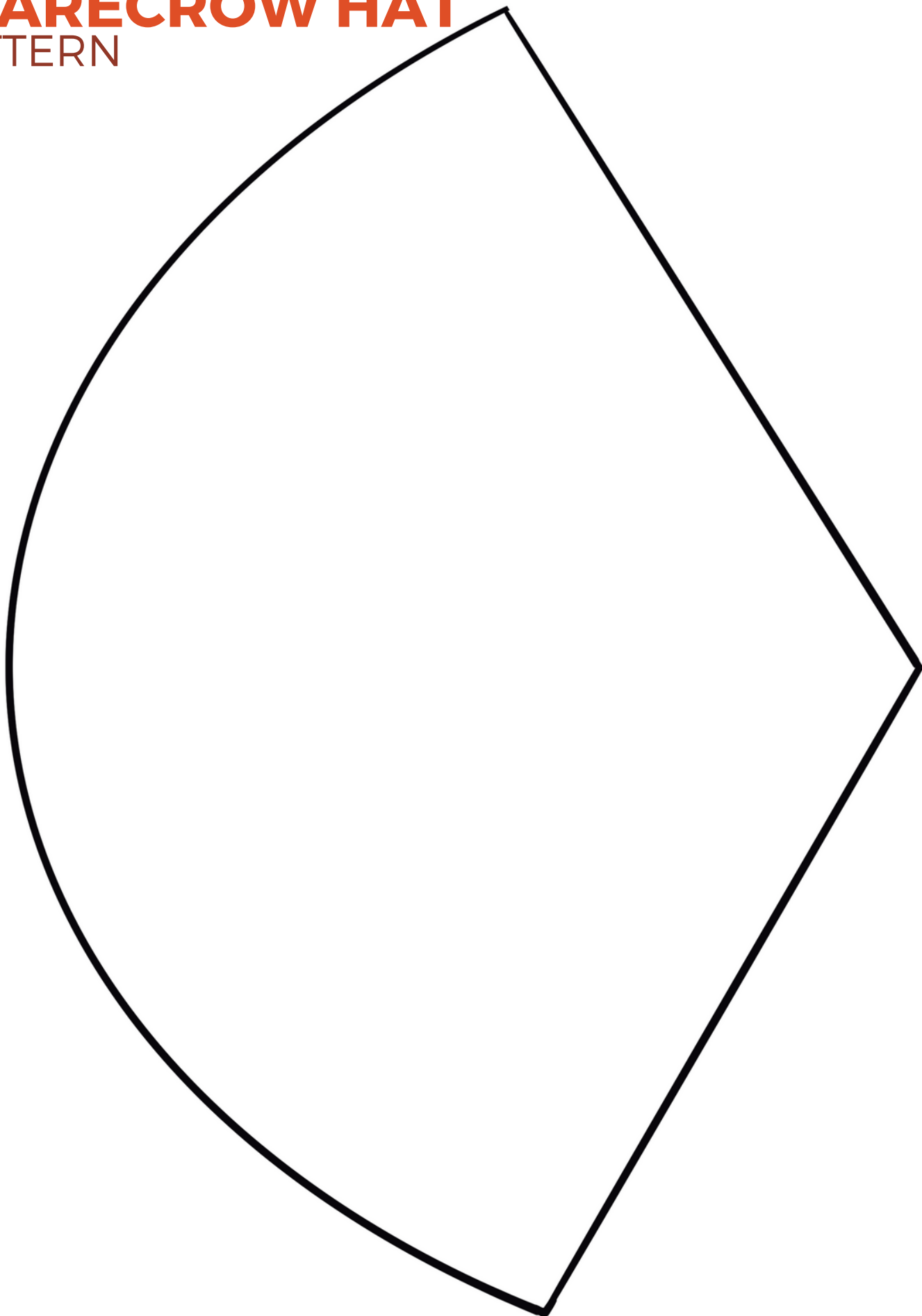

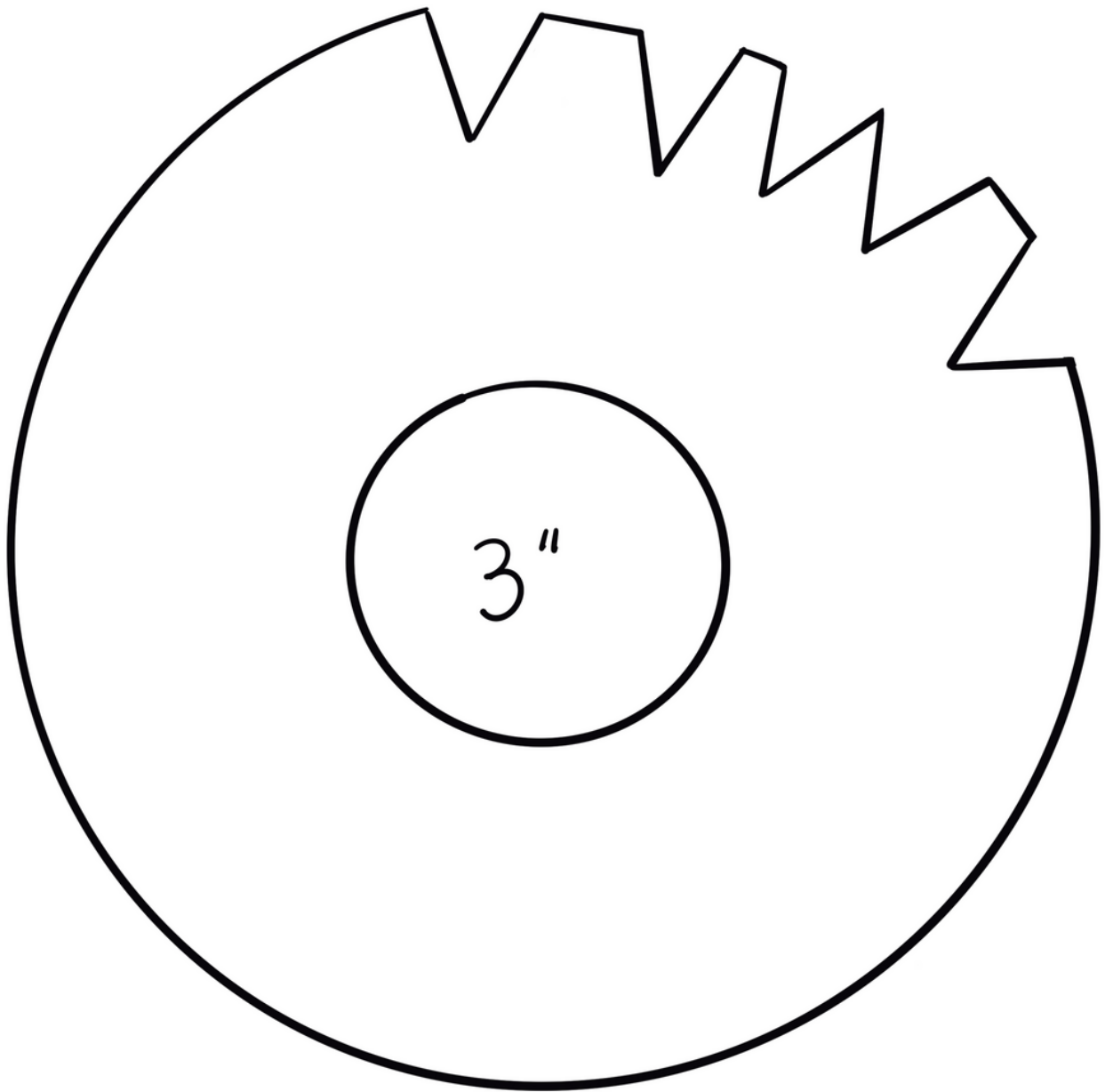

DIRECTIONS

1. Roll out two 8"x10" clay slabs, each about ¼-½" thick.
2. Place the pattern pieces on the clay. Trace around the shapes with the skewer to cut out. Smooth the edges.
3. Attach the buckles on the boots by scoring with a wet toothbrush.
4. Form 2 clay cylinders, each about ½" diameter and 1" long. Tap each end of the shape on a hard surface to create a flat edge. Tap one long side on a hard surface to create a flat edge. Insert the dowel rod into the bottom of each one, about two-thirds of the way in. Do not let it extend out the top end. With a wet toothbrush, score the flat long edge and attach to the back of the boots about where the sock and boot meet on the cutout. Once the pieces are attached, carefully remove the dowel rods. Let dry.
5. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
6. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
7. Glue the dowel rods into the holders on the back of the boots.

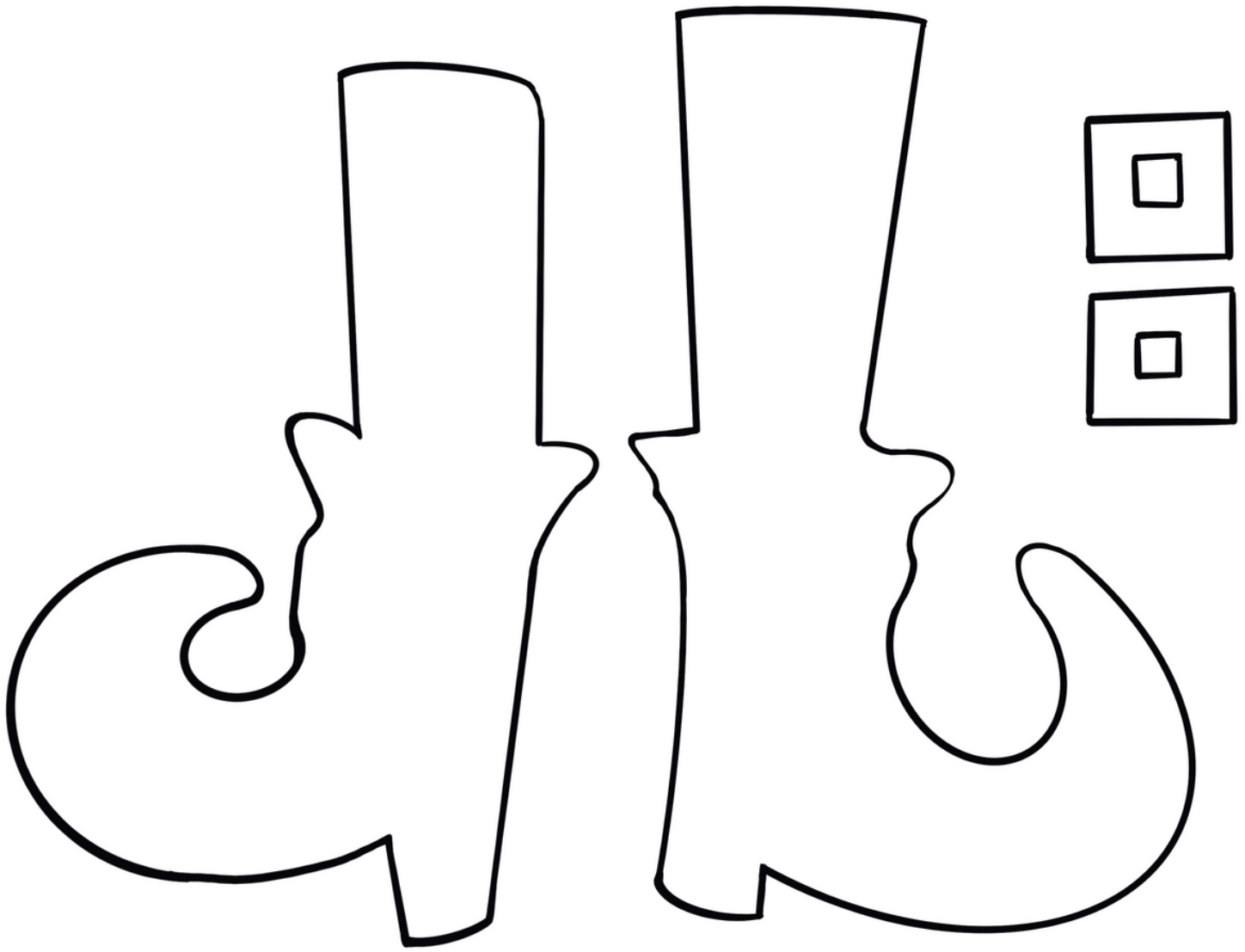

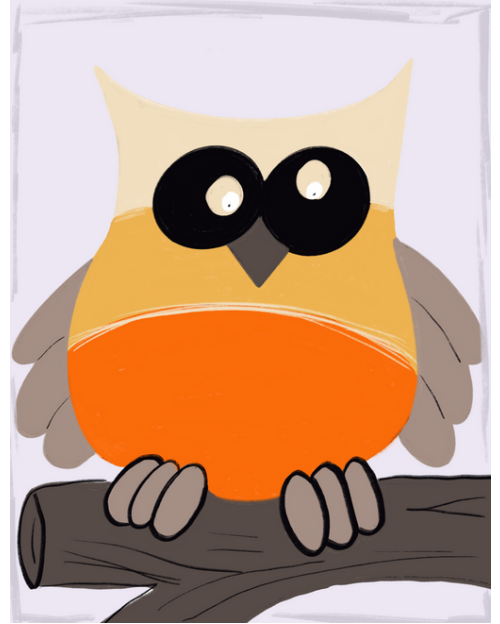

1. Transfer the pattern onto the canvas using graphite paper.
2. Paint the bottom of the owl Orange.
3. Paint the midsection of owl Golden Yellow.
4. Blend 2 parts Cream and 1 part Golden Yellow and mix well. Paint the top section of the owl and the inner circle of the eyes with this blend.
5. Paint the wings, talons, and beak Taupe.
6. Paint the branch Gray-Brown.
7. Paint the outer circle of the eyes Black.
8. With a small brush, outline the talons, outline the branch, make the branch lines, and add small lines dividing the sections of the wings.
9. Using the back end of a paintbrush, add a tiny Black dot in each eye for the pupils.
10. With a small brush, paint thin sketchy lines dividing the sections of the owl in the Cream blend color from step 4.
11. Sign and date your masterpiece.



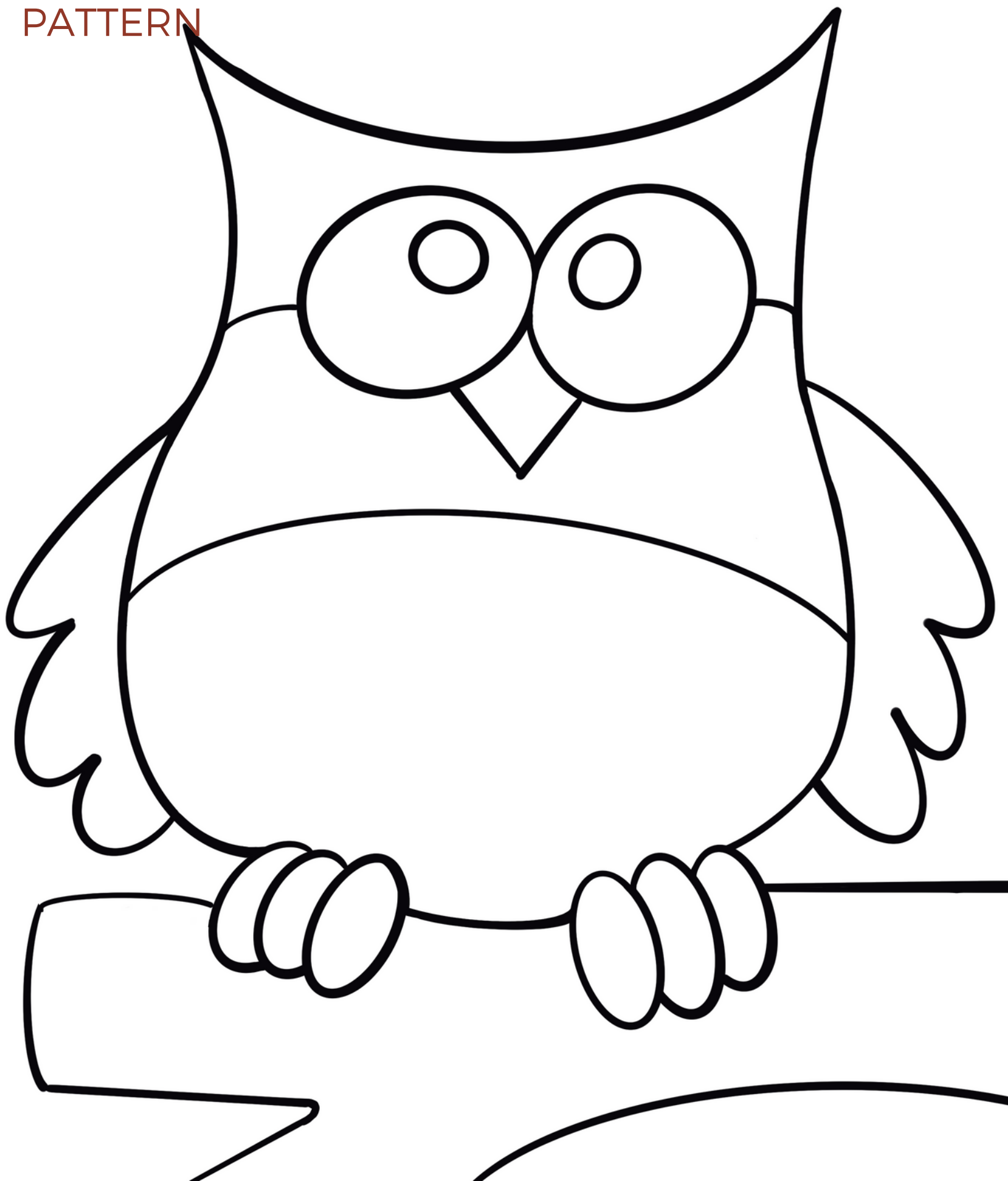

1. Transfer the pattern onto the canvas using graphite paper.
2. Paint the entire canvas Light Blue, avoiding the bucket area.
3. Paint the inside of the bucket Light Brown.
4. Paint the outside of the bucket Gray.
5. Paint the center of the sunflowers Brown.
6. Paint the stems, leaves, grass, and the word FLOWERS on the front of the bucket Dark Green.
7. Use the end of a large paintbrush or a Q-tip in Bright Yellow to paint dots for the petals around each flower center.
8. Blend 2 parts Bright Yellow to 1 part Brown and mix well. Paint the beehive.
9. Paint the lines on the beehive and the beehive support rod Brown.
10. Paint the handle and handle grip Black.
11. Paint the details on the centers of the flowers Tan, using a cross-hatch design in some and dots in others.
12. With a small brush, paint Brown straw lines in the top of the bucket, avoiding the leaves, flowers, and stems.
13. With a small brush, paint "bee" dash lines on the background and add little dots/dashes on the bucket with Black.
14. Sign and date your masterpiece.



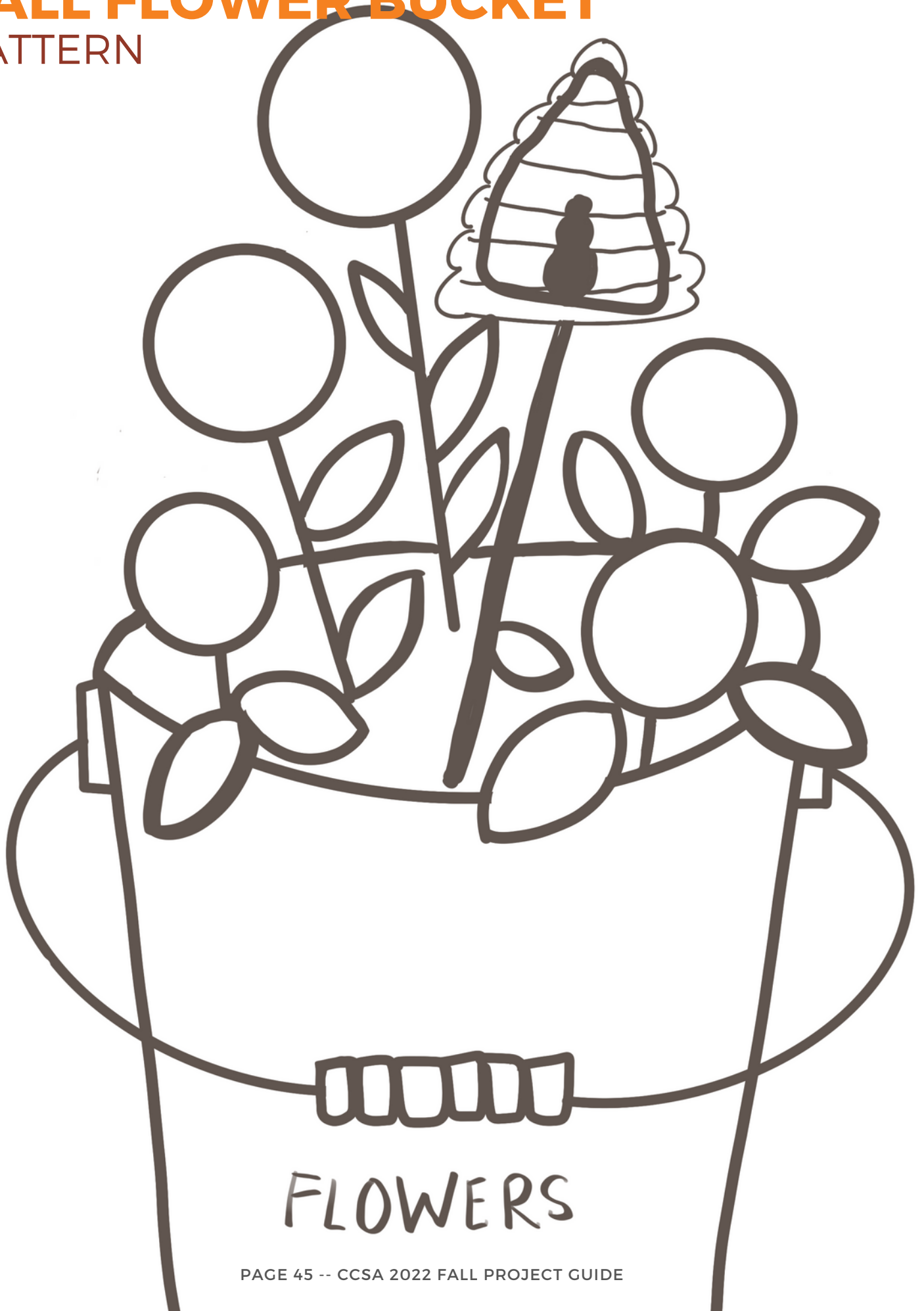
