

# Autumn Is Calling Platter POTTERY

# **SUPPLIES**

Bisque: Oval coupe platter
Pattern
Tissue paper
Pencil
Sharpie marker
Small and medium round brushes
Liner brush
Chippy craft brush



## **Glaze Paint Colors**

Cream, Pumpkin, Taupe, Olive Green, Golden Yellow, Dark Brown

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Paint the background with 1 coat of Cream.
- 2. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)

  NOTE: Do not trace the leaf veins, the small cream branches, or the berries onto the platter at this point.

  They will be traced on in step 7.
- 3. Paint the larger, wavy-edged leaf with 2–3 coats of Pumpkin.
- 4. Paint the slightly smaller leaf with 2–3 coats of Taupe.
- 5. Paint the banner with 3 coats of Cream.
- 6. Paint the branches and small leaves with 3 coats of Olive Green.
- 7. Once the color is dry, reposition the tissue tracing and trace on the small branches, berry clusters, and veins in the large leaves.
- 8. Paint the small branches with 2–3 coats of Cream.
- 9. Paint the berry clusters with 2–3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 10. Outline the two larger leaves and the banner with 1 coat of Olive Green using a liner brush.
- 11. Paint the veins in the larger leaves with 1 coat of Olive Green using a liner brush. Let dry.
- 12. Using the liner brush with Taupe, paint just along the edge of the small Cream branches and leaves, like shading. Also outline each berry with 1 coat of Taupe, and use 1 light coat of Taupe to paint over the outline and veins in the larger leaf. Let dry.
- 13. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the lettering onto the banner area.
- 14. Paint the lettering in Dark Brown using a writer bottle or liner brush. Let dry completely.
- 15. Dip the tips of a chippy craft brush in Taupe. Paint wispy strokes over the background area around the design. It's okay if a few brushstrokes overlap the painted design. Let dry.
- 16. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.




- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Use a medium round brush to paint the pie with 3 coats of Pumpkin.
- 3. Paint the base of the pie and the whipped topping with 3 coats of Cream.
- 4. Paint the crust edge with 3 coats of Taupe.
- 5. Using a small brush, add wiggly lines across the pie base with Taupe.
- 6. Using a sponge dotter, add dots in Pumpkin on the plate rim.
- 7. Dip the handle end of the dotter into Taupe and add smaller dots to fill in the border.
- 8. Paint the lettering in Pumpkin with a writer bottle or a small brush.
- 9. Outline each element of the pie with a Dark Taupe writer bottle. Let dry.
- 10. Glaze and fire to Cone 06

Copy paper
Scissors
Small and medium round brushes
Paper
Fan brush



## **Glaze Paint Colors**

Golden Yellow, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, Taupe Writer bottle: Black


#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Use tissue paper to trace out the 9 leaf designs onto paper. Cut out and set aside.
- 3. One at a time, paint each paper leaf cutout with a thick layer using a fan brush and place color side down onto the corresponding leaf tracing on the mug. Be sure to place the "front leaves" of the design down first, and alternate colors between Golden Yellow, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, and Taupe. Press the paper cutouts down on the mug to transfers the color.
- 4. Once all leaves are placed, use a small round brush to paint 3 coats of each color in the ovals around the top edge of the mug. Be sure to alternate the colors so that two of the same color never touch.
- 5. Remove the paper leaves.
- 6. Use a Black writer bottle to create the details on the leaves, the outlines, and the words. Let dry.
- 7. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

# **Glaze Paint Colors**

Taupe, Dark Brown, Teal, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, Pea Green, Light Tan



- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the leaf design and the lettering. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Mix 2 parts of Taupe to 1 part Dark Brown. Using a small liner brush, paint 2 coats of this color on the curved branches.
- 3. Paint each leaf with 3 coats of color, alternating between Teal, Cinnamon, Pumpkin, Taupe, Pea Green, and Light Tan. Avoid having two leaves of the same color next to each other.
- 4. Using a small brush or writer bottle, paint the two FALL words with 3 coats of Teal.
- 5. Paint the word SWEET with 3 coats of Pumpkin. Let dry.
- 6. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

## **Glaze Paint Colors**

Golden Yellow, Teal Blue, Darker Teal Blue, Cream




## **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Trace the pattern shapes onto contact paper. Cut out the shapes and adhere on the bisque in the traced areas.
- 3. Paint the background with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 4. Remove the circle stickers and paint the traced pattern with 2 coats of Teal Blue, leaving a white border around the edge.
- 5. Remove the stem stickers and paint the center of the stem with 2–3 coats of Teal Blue, leaving a white border along the outside edges of the stem.
- 6. Remove the leaf stickers. Mix 2 parts Cream with 1 part Golden Yellow. Paint the leaves with 2 coats of this mixture, leaving a white border around the edge. Once dry, dip the back end of a brush in Cream and add dots on the leaves.
- 7. Paint the center pattern of the circles with 1 coat of Darker Teal Blue. Let dry.
- 8. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

# **POTTERY**

# **SUPPLIES**

Bisque: Square plate Pattern Tissue paper Pencil Sharpie marker Small and medium round brushes

# **Glaze Paint Colors**

Golden Yellow, Cream, Dark Teal Blue, Bright Orange, Light Teal Blue

Writer bottle: Black



### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Mix 2 parts of Golden Yellow with 1 part Cream. Paint 3 coats of this color onto pumpkin #2. Reserve this color for later use.
- 3. Paint pumpkin #1 with 3 coats of Cream.
- 4. Paint pumpkin #3 with 3 coats of Dark Teal Blue.
- 5. Paint pumpkin #4 with 3 coats of Bright Orange.
- 6. Paint the stems of pumpkins #1 and #3 with 2–3 coats of Bright Orange.
- 7. Paint the stems of pumpkins #2 and #4 with 2–3 coats of Dark Teal Blue.
- 8. Paint the leaf with 2–3 coats of Dark Teal Blue.
- 9. Dip the tip of a medium round brush into Dark Teal Blue. Stipple (dab) this sparsely on pumpkin #1, creating a shadow along the bottom of the pumpkin. Add a few vertical brushstrokes along the grooves between the pumpkin segments.
- 10. Use the same stippling technique to apply Light Teal Blue on the top area of pumpkin #3. The painted effect should be heavier on the left side of the pumpkin.
- 11. Use the same stippling technique to paint the shadow effect on the right side of pumpkin #2 with Bright Orange.
- 12. Use the same stippling technique to paint pumpkin #4 with the mixed paint color (from step 2) used on pumpkin #2.
- 13. Outline each pumpkin, the leaf, and the groove lines on pumpkins #1 and #2 with a Black writer bottle.
- 14. Outline the lettering with a Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 15. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.



# **Glaze Paint Colors**

Cream, Grayish Brown, Bright Light Blue, Bright Orange, Cream Writer bottles: Dark Brown, Cream

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design.
- 2. Position the tissue tracing on contact paper and trace the banner shape. Cut out the banner and apply the sticker to the bisque.
- 3. Paint the mug with 2–3 coats of Cream.
- 4. Once dry, position the tissue tracing on the mug and trace the spots with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 5. Paint the spots with 3 coats of Grayish Brown.
- 6. Remove the banner sticker and paint the shape with 3 coats of Bright Light Blue.
- 7. Once dry, position the tissue tracing over the shape and trace the lettering and the pumpkin.
- 8. Paint the pumpkin with 3 coats of Bright Orange, avoiding the dot shapes.
- 9. Paint the dots on the pumpkin with 2–3 coats of Cream.
- 10. With a Dark Brown writer bottle, trace the lettering and add a sketchy outline around the banner and the pumpkin. Also add accent lines on the Gray Brown spots.
- 11. With a Cream writer bottle, add small spirals and dots around the edges of the banner. Let dry.
- 12. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

# **Glaze Paint Colors**

Golden Yellow, Rusty Brown, Pea Green, Light Gray, Dark Brown, Tan, Black

Writer bottle: Dark Brown



## **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Paint the flower petals with 3 coats of Golden Yellow. Do not paint all the way to the edge of the design; leave a bit of space between the petal and the edge.
- 3. Paint the curvy leaves with 3 coats of Rusty Brown. Do not paint all the way to edge of the design, leaving a bit of space between the leaf and the edge.
- 4. Repeat step 3 with 3 coats of Pea Green on the straight leaves.
- 5. Paint the vase with 3 coats of Light Gray.
- 6. Paint the center of the flowers with 3 coats of Dark Brown. Let dry.
- 7. Place a piece of paper towel or scrap paper no bigger than the design over the painted area. Dip a toothbrush in Golden Yellow and splatter the background, then repeat with Rusty Brown.
- 8. Using the back end of a paintbrush, add large Tan dots to the flower centers, placed toward the outer left side of the circular area.
- 9. Add squiggly lines on the flower petals with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 10. Use the Dark Brown writer bottle to outline everything, and add the vein details of the leaves, the stems, and line on the vase.
- 11. Use the back end of a smaller brush to add groupings of 3 black dots to the petals and leaves. Let dry.
- 12. Glaze and fire to Cone 06.

# **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Light Blue, Light Brown, Gray, Brown, Dark Green, Bright Yellow, Black, Tan


#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Transfer the pattern onto the canvas using graphite paper.
- 2. Paint the entire canvas Light Blue, avoiding the bucket area.
- 3. Paint the inside of the bucket Light Brown.
- 4. Paint the outside of the bucket Gray.
- 5. Paint the center of the sunflowers Brown.
- 6. Paint the stems, leaves, grass, and the word FLOWERS on the front of the bucket Dark Green.
- 7. Use the end of a large paintbrush or a Q-tip in Bright Yellow to paint dots for the petals around each flower center.
- 8. Blend 2 parts Bright Yellow to 1 part Brown and mix well. Paint the beehive.
- 9. Paint the lines on the beehive and the beehive support rod Brown.
- 10. Paint the handle and handle grip Black.
- 11. Paint the details on the centers of the flowers Tan, using a cross-hatch design in some and dots in others.
- 12. With a small brush, paint Brown straw lines in the top of the bucket, avoiding the leaves, flowers, and stems.
- 13. With a small brush, paint "bee" dash lines on the background and add little dots/dashes on the bucket with Black.
- 14. Sign and date your masterpiece.






# MODERN FALL FOLIAGE BOARD ART

## **SUPPLIES**

12"x12" MDF blank board or cut wood Cheesecloth Pattern Carbon transfer paper Sharpie Large flat canvas brush ½" Chippy craft brush



# **Acrylic Paint Colors**

Cream, Charcoal Gray, Pumpkin Brown

# **DIRECTIONS**


- 1. Paint the board with 1 coat of Cream. While the paint is still wet, stretch the cheesecloth over the entire board. Wrap the excess cloth around the back and tape to secure to the board.
- 2. Paint Charcoal Gray over the cheesecloth. Let dry slightly. Apply another thicker layer/coat in some areas for a more dimensional look. Let dry slightly. Remove the cheesecloth.
- 3. Once the board is completely dry, sketch out the design on the board, or trace it using transfer paper with the pattern.
- 4. Paint the top leaf solid Charcoal Gray.
- 5. Paint the middle leaf solid Pumpkin Brown.
- 6. Paint the bottom leaf solid Cream.
- 7. Using a small brush, add the lines that extend off each end of the leaves in Charcoal Gray.
- 8. Using the small brush, add the dashed lines on the top leaf in Cream, the middle leaf in Charcoal Gray, and the bottom leaf in Pumpkin Brown.
- 9. Let dry. Sign and date your masterpiece.

# **DIRECTIONS**


- 1. Roll out a 10"x10" clay slab, ¼-½" thick.
- 2. Place the pattern pieces on the clay. Trace around the shapes with the skewer and cut out. Smooth the edges.
- 3. Using the point of the skewer, etch out the plaid lines on the top of the acorn and the stripes on the bottom portion.
- 4. Place the acorn on the dessert plate and slightly form the clay to the dish shape. Let dry.
- 5. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 6. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.

# FARMHOUSE FLOWER PLATTER

#### **SUPPLIES**

Bisque: Medium oval platter (pattern easily adaptable to other plate styles)

Pattern
Tissue paper
Sharpie
Contact paper
Scissors

Chippy craft brush
Small and medium round brushes

#### **Glaze Colors**

Cream, Maroon, Golden Yellow, Sage Green, Dark Brown Writer bottle in Dark Brown




#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the solid and the dotted lines of the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the SOLID LINES of the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Don't trace the plaid design inside the flower yet.
- 2. Place the tissue tracing on contact paper and trace the dotted line of the pattern. Cut out the design. Place the sticker over the traced pattern. (Note that the cutout is slightly larger than the traced pattern to create a white space surrounding the traced pattern.)
- 3. Lightly sketch a vertical line about 2" from each edge of the plate.
- 4. For the background, paint 1–2 coats of Cream on the small side sections with chippy craft brush using vertical brushstrokes.
- 5. Rinse and dry the chippy brush. Paint the center section of the plate with 1–2 coats of Maroon, slightly overlapping the painted Cream sections.
- 6. Peel off the sticker. Paint the center of the flower with 1–2 coats of Cream.
- 7. Reposition the tissue tracing and trace the plaid lines in the center of the flower. Paint alternating sections of the plaid with 1–2 coats of Maroon.
- 8. Paint the petals with 2–3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 9. Paint the stem and leaves with 2–3 coats of Sage Green.
- 10. Using a small brush or writer bottle with Dark Brown, outline the plaid center squares, the petals, the stem, the leaves, the veins, and add dots in the painted Maroon sections.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

# HAPPY PUNKIN SEASON PLATTER

#### **SUPPLIES**

Bisque: Medium oval platter (this pattern is easily adaptable to other plate shapes)

Pattern

Tissue paper Sharpie

Plain paper Scissors

Small and medium round brushes



Cream, Pale Blue, Pumpkin Orange Writer bottle in Pumpkin Orange, Red, Teal Blue



#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Using the same tracing, transfer the silhouette of the pumpkins to plain paper and cut them out. Paint the pumpkins with 1 heavy coat of Cream and place painted side down on the traced pumpkin pattern. NOTE: Be sure to paint the correct side of the copy paper to cover the pattern.
- 3. Starting at the bottom of the plate, paint 1–2 coats of Pale Blue, working up to middle of the plate and arching up in the center. Add a little bit of water to the Pale Blue and paint from the middle to the top of the plate, decreasing the color into the lightest coverage at the top to create a faded look.
- 4. Peel off the paper cutouts. Retrace the lettering and pumpkin vines if needed.
- 5. Using a liner brush or writer bottle with Pumpkin Orange, outline the pumpkins and add details to them.
- 6. Paint the pumpkin stems with 2 coats of Pumpkin Orange.
- 7. Fill in the heart and add stitch lines along the edge of the plate with a Red writer bottle.
- 8. With Pumpkin Orange writer bottle, trace the vines and the lettering for PUNKIN.
- 9. With Teal Blue writer bottle, trace the words HAPPY and SEASON.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

## **SUPPLIES**

Bisque: Oval rectangle platter

Pattern

Tissue paper

Sharpie

Plain paper

Scissors

Small and medium round brushes

Chippy craft brush

Detail liner brush

## **Glaze Colors**

Light Blue, Cream, Tan, Taupe, Coffee Brown, Maroon, Gold, Navy Blue, Moss Green, Pumpkin Pie Orange, Black Writer bottle in Black




#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Use the same tracing to transfer the gnome silhouette onto contact paper and cut out.
- 3. Adhere the contact paper cutout over the traced pattern on the bisque.
- 4. Cut 6–7 strips of plain paper, long enough to go across the bottom of the plate.
- 5. With a fan brush, add a little bit of water to slightly thin out the Light Blue. Paint 1–2 coats of Light Blue across the top third of the plate.
- 6. Rinse brush and paint 1–2 coats of Cream on the remaining portion of the plate.
- 7. One at a time, paint a strip of paper with Tan using a nice, even coat. Place the painted strip of paper color side down on the "ground" area over the gnomes' feet. Smooth out the bubbles. Repeat the step, layering the paper pieces in no particular order, overlapping here and there.
- 8. Sponge paint 1 coat of Taupe on top of the papers and slightly extend the paint line above the top paint strip. Add Coffee Brown to the same sponge and paint the area at behind the gnomes and towards the middle of the plate to resemble dirt.
- 9. Once dry, remove the paper cutouts and sticker.
- 10. Paint the left gnome with 3 coats each of Maroon and Taupe.
- 11. Paint the middle gnome with 3 coats each of Gold and Navy Blue.
- 12. Paint the right gnome with 3 coats each of Moss Green and Pumpkin Pie Orange.
- 13. If needed, retrace the wheat/straw on the gnomes' hats. Paint each one with 1–2 coats of Tan.
- 14. Paint the gnome noses with 2–3 coats of Cream.
- 15. Paint the gnome shoes with 3 coats of Black.
- 16. Outline the gnomes and the wheat with Black.
- 17. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.


# **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. With a round brush, paint 1–2 coats of Cream over the feathers, turkey spots, eyeball, and beak.
- 3. Using the chippy craft brush, paint the background with 1–2 coats of Taupe using messy brushstrokes, painting up to the turkey and feathers.
- 4. Using a detail liner brush or writer bottle with Black, outline the turkey body first, followed by the spots on the turkey, ending with the turkey's facial features.
- 5. Paint the turkey body with 2–3 coats of Black.
- 6. Paint the feet and outline the feathers with a double line in Black.
- 7. Paint the wattle with 2 coats of Maroon.
- 8. Paint the lettering Maroon.
- 9. Paint dashes around the rim of the plate with the Black writer bottle.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.


## **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Do not trace the lettering onto the bisque yet.
- 2. Use the same tissue tracing to transfer the silhouette of the turkey onto contact paper. Cut out and place on the platter.
- 3. Using a fan brush, paint the background with 3 coats of Golden Yellow.
- 4. Remove the sticker when the painted edges around the sticker are dry.
- 5. Paint the turkey body with 2–3 coats of Medium Brown.
- 6. Paint each feather one color using 2–3 coats of Orange, Red, and Bright Blue.
- 7. Paint the beak with 3 coats of Orange.
- 8. Paint the wattle with 3 coats of Red. Let dry.
- 9. Reposition the tissue tracing and transfer the lettering. With a Dark Brown writer bottle, fill in the letters and outline the whole turkey.
- 10. Slightly water down Orange, Red, and Bright Blue. Use a brush to splatter each color over the design.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.) Don't trace the lettering yet.
- 2. Paint the whipped cream with 2 coats of Cream.
- 3. Paint the pie with 3 coats of Pumpkin Pie.
- 4. Paint the crust with 3 coats of Tan.
- 5. Outline the whipped cream with a White writer bottle.
- 6. Reposition the tissue tracing and transfer the lettering to the pie area.
- 7. Outline the pie and fill in the letters with a Brown writer bottle.
- 8. Outline the crust with a Pumpkin writer bottle.
- 9. Paint the border detail with Pumpkin.
- 10. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

#### **DIRECTIONS**


- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- 2. Trace the facial features (eyes, beak, gobbler) onto contact paper and cut out. Position the sticker on top of the traced pattern.
- 3. A watercolor technique is used for the turkey tail. Starting with the lightest colors (Yellows), dip brush into water and then into the color. Dab areas with messy brushstrokes in no particular order or pattern, just randomly in the tail area. Dip brush into water and repeat the step with the Oranges, finishing with the Reds. Go back over any colors you want to darken or highlight.
- 4. Paint the turkey head with 2–3 coats of Light Brown, painting over the stickers.
- 5. With a Light Brown writer bottle or a small liner brush, trace the lines of the tail pattern to complete the tail.
- 6. Remove the stickers from the turkey face and paint 2–3 coats each, using Golden Yellow for the beak, Maroon for the pupils, and Red for the gobbler.
- 7. With Dark Brown writer bottle, fill in the lettering, and outline the turkey facial features and the turkey head.
- 8. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

- 1. Place tissue paper over the pattern and trace the design (including the dashed and solid lines) with a pencil. Position the tissue tracing on the bisque and retrace the design with a marker. (The marker will bleed through the tissue, transferring the design.)
- Trace the dotted line patterns (shapes only) onto contact paper. Cut out and stick over the traced pattern.
- Paint the background with 2 coats of Plum pottery glaze or a similar color in regular glaze. Once the background is no longer shiny, remove the stickers.
- For the designs, begin painting each one using the lightest color in the palette for that subject. Paint each color 1–2 coats, as follows:
  - ·Pumpkin: Bright Orange, Orange, Medium Green, Light Green
  - ·Butternut Squash: Yellow, Bright Orange (seeds in the squash are bare bisque)
  - ·Carrot: Bright Orange, Pale Orange, Medium Green
  - ·Apple: Red, Cream, Medium Green, Light Green, Black
  - ·Pomegranate: Berry Purple, Red, Cream
  - ·Eggplant: Purple, Deep Purple, Medium Green, Light Green
  - ·Brussel Sprouts: Medium Green, Light Green
  - ·Radish: Salmon, Maroon, Medium Green, Light Green
  - ·Red Onion: Berry Purple, Pink
  - ·Berries: Red, Maroon
- 5. Outline all of the veggies and fruits in Black with a writer bottle or a liner brush.
- 6. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 5. Paint the B with 3 coats of Navy.
- 6. Using a Navy writer bottle, make a sketchy outline on the D and the S.
- 7. Outline the turkey leg with a Pumpkin writer bottle.
- 8. With Cream writer bottle, add dots along the edge of the B. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

This project uses leaf shapes in various sizes and shapes. Only the leaves with multiple branches are traced onto the squares and painted. The remaining leaves are stickers and paper cutouts. This project can easily be adapted to smaller or larger bisque by using less or more square shapes.



#### **Directions**

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the squares with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque. For this design, you will need to repeat some of the squares.
- 2. Trace 3 of the solid leaf patterns onto contact paper and copy paper and cut out. You will need 7 contact paper leaf cutouts and 7 copy paper leaf cutouts.
- 3. Place the sticker cut outs in the squares, leaving 2 squares with no sticker. These squares will have the multiple leaf designs traced on them in another step.
- 4. Paint each square 3 coats of one color: Gray, Cream, Gold Yellow, Maroon, Black, Light Brown, White, Taupe, and Pumpkin. Once the squares are dry, remove the stickers.
- 5. Using the tissue paper technique, trace the multiple leaf designs onto the two squares with no cutout.
- 6. Paint 1 coat of contrasting color onto the paper cutouts and place paint side down on the matching leaf shape. Press down on the cutout to transfer the color and remove the paper. The sample shows Pumpkin on the Gray square, White on the Golden Yellow and Maroon squares, Gray on the Black square, and Maroon on the Light Brown square. The Golden Yellow leaf is on the bare bisque with no square.
- 7. Trace the multiple leaf designs on the 2 remaining squares using the tissue paper technique. Fill in the leaves with Taupe and Black writer bottles.
- 8. Using White, Black, and Taupe writer bottles, add the designs in the centers of the solid leaves. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Orange: Paint the H and the middle section of the V with 3 coats.
- 3. Yellow: Paint the G and the K with 1 coat.
- 4. Olive Green: Paint the A with 3 coats and the plaid lines on the G.
- 5. Golden Yellow: Paint 2 coats on the bottom of the V; 3 coats on the buckle of the T; and 2 coats on beak of the I.
- 6. Pumpkin: Paint the inside "pie" in letter E; the groove lines of the pumpkin in the H; and the stem through the A.
- 7. Dark Brown: Paint the N with 2–3 coats and the top of the K.
- 8. Medium Brown: Paint the pumpkin stem in the H with 2 coats and 3 coats on the turkey in the I.
- 9. Cream: Paint the S with 3 coats and the woodgrain details in the N.
- 10. Tan: Paint the crust on the E and the squiggle plaid details on the S.
- 11. White: Paint the corn details in the K; highlighted the edges on the buckle on the T; eyes on the turkey on letter I; and the top section of the letter V.
- 12. Red: Paint the turkey wattle on the I.
- 13. Dark Olive Green: Paint the rosemary leaves on the branch in the A.
- 14. Outline each letter with a Black writer bottle, except for the crust section of the E. Shade the crust with Medium Brown. Let dry.
- 15. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Trace the outlines of the hat, arms, and crow onto contact paper. Cut out and adhere firmly to the plate, aligning with the traced pattern.
- 3. Sponge paint the background Pale Blue, using lighter application in the areas closest to the gnome and heavier application closer to the edges. Remove the stickers.
- 4. Cut out the 3 separate beard sections. Paint the largest section Light Yellow and press color side down on the plate, aligning with the traced pattern and smoothing down the edges. Remove the paper. Paint the middle section cutout Golden Yellow and position over the large painted section; pat down and smooth to the edges. Remove the paper. Paint the smallest section Cream and position over the middle section; pat down and smooth to the edges. Remove the paper. Cut out 5–6 small strips and paint each with one of the beard colors. Press down randomly to give added dimension.
- 5. For the arms: Paint the largest stripe with 1 coat of Taupe. Paint the next stripe with 1 coat of Denim Blue. Paint the next stripe on top of the large Denim Blue stripe with 1 coat of Maroon. Paint 1-coat vertical stripes of Maroon and Denim Blue on the sleeve overlapping the Taupe and Denim Blue horizontal stripes.
- 6. Paint the Hat with 2–3 coats of Taupe. Paint one patch with 2 coats of Denim Blue and the other with Maroon.
- 7. Paint the crow with 2–3 coats of Black. Paint the beak with 2 coats of Golden Yellow. Paint the eyes with 2 coats of White. Add a Black dot for the pupil of the eye and a Black squiggle at the top of the head for feathers.
- 8. Outline the design with Black writer bottle. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

#### **Directions**

- 1. Transfer the outlines of the three pie shapes to contact paper using the tissue paper technique: Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the contact paper and retrace the design with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design.
- 2. Cut out the contact paper shapes. Also cut contact paper strips for the lattice design on the cherry pie slice, which will be used in step 6. Adhere the pie shapes firmly to the plate.
- 3. Paint the plate with 1–2 coats of Cream using a paint wash technique by dipping brush in water and then in color. Let dry. Remove the contact paper shapes.
- 4. Trace the lettering onto the plate using the tissue paper technique.
- 5. For the cherry pie: apply the pie strip cutouts from step 2. Paint the open areas with 1 coat of watered-down Red. Once dry, dab in a layer of watered-down Maroon. Once dry, dab in a few spots of Red. Remove the contact paper strips and paint the lines with 2 coats of Tan. Paint the horizontal lines 1 more time to emphasize the overlapping pattern.
- 6. For the pumpkin pie, paint the pie shape 2–3 coats of Pumpkin. Once dry, paint the whip cream in the center with 1–2 coats of Cream.
- 7. For the pecan pie, paint 2 coats of Medium Brown for base. Once dry, trace the oval pecan shapes on the slice. Paint in the pecans with 2 coats of Light Brown, Dark Brown, and Red Brown. (You can also use painted thumbprints for this part of the design.) Once dry, outline the swirls on the pecans with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 8. Paint all the crust edges with 2 coats of Tan. Using a liner brush, add Medium Brown outlining details on the edges.
- 9. Add details to the whipped cream on the pumpkin pie with a White writer bottle.
- 10. Create the lettering with a Dark Brown writer bottle and add the font shadow with a Pumpkin writer bottle. Let dry.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.



- 3. Mix 1 part Black and 2 parts Gray. Paint the mug with 3 coats of this Charcoal mixture.
- 4. Remove the leaf stickers.
- 5. Paint a paper leaf with Golden Yellow. Press it paint side down within the open space of one of the larger leaves. Press down the paper to the edges, then remove.
- 6. Repeat step 5 for each of the other leaves, using Pumpkin, Maroon, and Olive Green.
- 7. Outline the leaves with a Dark Teal writer bottle and fill in with simple doodle designs. Let dry.

#### **Directions**

- 1. Using a pencil, trace the pattern onto tissue paper. Position the tissue tracing onto the plate and retrace the pattern with a Sharpie. The marker will bleed through the tissue paper, transferring the design to the bisque.
- 2. Water down Taupe. Dip a fan brush in the mixture and swipe brush slowly along the edges of the diamond shape. Continue this technique to fill in to the edge of the plate.
- 3. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Cream. Paint the stem with 2 coats of Taupe. Paint the pumpkin groove details with 1 coat of Taupe. Paint the stem details with 1 coat of Dark Brown.
- 4. Paint each leaf with 2 coats of Olive Green. Outline the leaves and the stem with 1 coat of Dark Brown.
- 5. Paint the entire wheelbarrow with 2 coats of Taupe. Dip a dry flat brush in Teal, slightly dab off, and paint the wheelbarrow with vertical and horizontal lines to create a plaid pattern, using only 1 coat on a stripe. You do not want full coverage; some Taupe should still show through. Add some Cream to the same brush and paint a similar pattern here and there to create texture. Repeat the random brush strokes with Olive Green.
- 6. Paint the wheels with 2 coats of Dark Brown. Add a line of Cream to highlight the spokes and the stand.
- 7. Using a liner brush, outline the edges of the wheelbarrow in Dark Brown.
- 8. Add Teal and Olive Green stitch-like lines along the edges of the diamond shape. Let dry.
- 9. Clear glaze and fire to Cone 06.

- 2. Paint the background around the pumpkin with a coat of Gray. To create a plaid look, paint overlapping horizontal and vertical White stripes about 1" wide. Be sure to paint the small areas that show through around the leaves.
- 3. Paint the pumpkin with 2 coats of Teal.
- 4. Paint the leaves Light Olive Green.
- 5. Paint the stem Dark Brown.
- 6. Using small liner brush, outline the leaves, vine, pumpkin, and stem detail in Black. Allow to dry.


### **Directions**

- 1. Dip a baby wipe in Cream and paint the background with a wash, using the wipe to apply the color.
- 2. Trace the rainbow design on the board using graphite paper.
- 3. Paint the rainbow stripes in Mossy Green, Gold, and Teal, leaving a small space between each rainbow stripe.
- 4. Paint a thin stripe of Taupe between the rainbow stripes. Let dry.
- 5. Turn the board over. Using the hot glue gun, attach the twine pieces along the edge so they line up with the inside and outside edges of the rainbow on the front. (If using school glue, place a piece of tape over the glued pieces to be able to work on the front of the board while the glue is drying.)
- 6. Glue the felt pompoms along the bottom of the rainbow, coordinating the pompom colors to the colors of the stripes.



- 1. Dip a baby wipe in Cream and paint the background with a wash, using the wipe to apply the color. Let dry.
- 2. Trace the apple design on the board using graphite paper.
- 3. Mix equal parts of Teal Green and Lime Green. Paint 1 coat around the apple shape using horizontal brushstrokes. (It's okay if the paint extends onto the apple.) While the Green is still wet, use the chippy brush to create a distressed look by painting some Cream and Taupe along the edges and where the boards meet.
- 4. Paint the apple with 1–2 coats of Red. Paint the leaves with 2 coats of Leaf Green.
- 5. Mix equal parts of Red and Dark Brown to create Maroon. Paint a thin outline around the apple and the crease under the apple leaf.
- 6. Mix equal parts of Leaf Green and Dark Brown to create Deep Olive. Paint a thin outline around the leaves.
- 7. Using a pencil, lightly write the words FRESH CIDER. Using a medium flat brush, paint the letters White with sketchy brushstrokes.
- 8. Outline the entire shape with Golden Yellow.
- 9. Add a little more distressing along the edges with Dark Brown if desired. Let dry.



- 1. Dip a baby wipe in Cream and paint the background with a wash, using the wipe to apply the color.
- 2. Cut out the banner pieces and lay them out on the board, evenly space. Lightly trace around each one in pencil. One at a time, paint the paper banners with 1 heavy coat of Cream, and press them onto the board paint side down, following the pencil marks.
- 3. With a chippy craft brush, paint the background lightly with Taupe to create a distressed background. Remove the banner pieces immediately. Allow to dry. **NOTE: Steps 2 and 3 need to be completed together. If the paint under the banner pieces is allowed to dry, the patterns cannot be removed cleanly.**
- 4. Using graphite paper, trace on the letters and the pumpkins.
- 5. Using a liner brush, paint the letters Dark Brown.
- 6. Paint the pumpkins: one Maroon, one Golden Yellow, and one Orange.
- 7. Outline the pumpkins in Taupe.
- 8. Paint Taupe lines near the tops of the banner pieces to resemble string. Allow to dry.

- 4. Dip a paper piece into a paint color and place along the top of the corn pattern line. Continue to dip papers into colors and place in horizontal lines, keeping within the pattern. Some papers should overlap, and others should be surrounded with space.
- 5. Once the ear of corn is filled with paper pieces, paint 1 heavy coat of Golden Yellow over the paper pieces, covering any exposed bisque within the corn shape.
- 6. Repeat step 5 on the other ear of corn. Paint 1 heavy coat of Olive Green over the paper pieces, covering any exposed bisque within the corn shape.
- 7. Once the Golden Yellow and Olive Green coats are dry, remove all the paper pieces.
- 8. Slightly water down some Golden Yellow, Pumpkin, and Olive Green. Alternating colors, paint the leaves with 1–2 coats of each color.
- 9. Fill in the lettering with a Cinnamon writer bottle. (If pattern isn't visible, use tissue paper to retrace the letters.) Let dry.
- 10. Glaze and fire to cone 06.

- 3. Adhere the contact paper leaves to the plate on top of the traced design. Place the middle leaf down first with the stem end at the bottom of the plate. The other 2 leaves will overlap the middle leaf and the stems will point toward the top of the plate.
- 4. Using a fan brush, paint horizontal brush strokes over the leaf cutouts with 1 coat of Cream.
- 5. Dip a chippy craft brush in Taupe, dab off slightly, and paint random horizontal paint strokes across the background. Do not make this solid coverage.
- 6. Peel off the contact paper on the left leaf. Paint the leaf with 1 coat of slightly watered-down Pumpkin. To create dimension, paint one copy paper cutout heavily with Golden Yellow. Align the edge of the cut out to the painted leaf and place on top. Smooth the paper with a finger and then peel off.
- 7. Repeat step 6 with on the leaf on the right using slightly watered-down Olive Green, and then Pea Green on the copy paper.
- 8. Repeat step 6 on the middle leaf using slightly watered-down Cinnamon, and then Bright Red on the copy paper.
- 9. Once all the paint is dry, use the tissue paper tracing to transfer the lettering.
- 10. Paint HELLO with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 11. Paint FALL with a Cream writer bottle. Once dry, outline the letters with a Dark Brown writer bottle.
- 12. Using a Taupe writer bottle, paint stems on each leaf. Let dry.
- 13. Glaze and fire to cone 06.



If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint. Before firing, allow clay to dry until leather hard (may take 24–72 hours). PAINTING GUIDELINES: Place the leaf slab on a piece of cardboard. Paint the leaf with 1 coat of Cream. Paint a second coat of Cream in the center where the handprint cutout will be. Place the cutout on the wet paint and apply another coat of Cream to adhere the paper to the leaf. Layer colors in this order in the small cup: Pumpkin, Burgundy, Coral, Olive Green, and Pale Yellow. Pour over the leaf, covering as much of it as possible. Gently tilt the cardboard to move the colors around on the leaf. (Note: Try not to pour into the center of the handprint cutout; rather, try to keep it just around the edges. This will make it easier to remove the paper cutout once the paint sets up and begins to dry.)
- 5. Once fired, attach wire for hanging if desired.





- 1. Using a large square brush, paint the entire canvas with 1 light coat of White.
- 2. Without rinsing the brush, pick up Raw Sienna and blend into the White in random spots across the canvas, keeping it out of the very center where the leaf will go. Use vertical brushstrokes about 1–2 inches long.
- 3. Again, without rinsing brush, pick up Yellow. Paint with small vertical brushstrokes 1"-2" long in random areas.
- 4. Continue adding colors using same technique as above using Orange, Red, and White. Layers will begin to overlap slightly.
- 5. Rinse brush well and dry it. Lay in Raw Sienna randomly, filling in any remaining White spaces.
- 6. Using the same type of brushstroke, add Dark Brown only in the top left and bottom right corners.
- 7. Using same type of brushstroke, add Gold and Copper, keeping the metallic colors around the edge of the canvas and leaving the center of the canvas free of metallic. Allow to dry.
- 8. Use a pencil to draw a leaf in the center of the canvas. Using a round brush, paint the leaf with 2–3 coats of White. Allow to dry.
- 9. Trace "thankful" onto the leaf using graphite paper. Draw the letters in Black paint or Sharpie marker. Also outline the leaf in Black.



- 6. With a clay tool, smooth the seam between the coil and the dish shape. This is now the bottom of the apple.
- 7. From pinches of clay, sculpt an apple stem and a leaf. Score the backs of each of these and attach them to the top of the apple.
- 8. With a clay, tool add texture to the coil that forms the apple core.
- 9. With dampened fingertips, smooth out all seams.
- 10. Allow the clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 11. Paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. Or fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.

- 11. After firing, string the pieces together by bringing the line or wire through the holes to create a hanging chime.



- 5 Texture the triangle shape with the stamp.
- 6. Bring the 2 sides of the triangle shape toward each other. Score the upper edge of one side and the lower edge of the other and press it together to form a short cone.
- 7. Score the top of the tube and the inside lower edge of the cone. Press the cone on top of the tube to attach.
- 8. From the leftover clay, sculpt windows, a door, and any other feature you'd like to add to the home. Be sure to score the backs of each piece before pressing them on the clay house.
- 9. Allow the clay to dry for about 15–30 minutes, and then paint with glaze colors of your choice. Allow to dry.
- 10. Remove newspaper.
- 11. Fire to cone 06.

#### **Directions for Gnome**

- 1. Roll a small smooth ball.
- 2. Roll out a small slab and cut out a small triangle with 2 long sides. Bring the long sides together to form a long cone shape. Smooth and mold this shape into a gnome hat.
- 3. Score the inside of the hat and press it onto the clay ball.
- 4. Roll a flat semicircle for the gnome's beard. Score the back of it and press it on the lower part of the gnome body.

- 6. Roll a very small ball for the gnome's nose. Score the back of it and press it just under the hat, at the top edge of the beard.
- 7. Allow the clay to dry for about 15–30 minutes, and then paint with glaze colors of your choice. Allow to dry.

- 1. From pinches of clay, sculpt a mushroom cap and stem.

- 7. On the front edge, paint the mug with 1 coat of Burnt Orange. Outline it with 3 coats of Burnt Orange.
- 8. Paint the whip cream with 3 coats of White. Allow to dry.
- 9. Paint curved lines in the whip cream in Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 10. On the second side, paint the word autumn in Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 11. Paint the words that's, what, is, made, of in Leaf Green. Allow to dry.
- 12. Splatter the whole bisque piece lightly with Orange, Leaf Green, Gold, and Burnt Orange. Allow to dry.
- 13. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

- 14. With the pointy end of the wooden skewer, make 1 or 2 small holes at the top of the clay circle to use for hanging the finished project.

DecoArt Social Artworking and Americana Paint Parchment, Sand, Deep Yellow, Yellow Oxide, Leaf Green

#### **Directions**

- 1. Cut off enough clay to form a softball-sized ball. Roll, pat, and squeeze the clay between cupped hands to make a lumpy ball. Throw the ball onto the foam work mat.
- 2. Using the sides of your fists, pound the clay ball to a 1/4" slab.
- 3. Place a paper plate, right side down, on the clay slab. Using the pointy end of the wooden skewer, trace around the plate. Leave the excess clay on the mat to use later.
- 4. Carefully lift up the cutout clay circle with the paper plate. Press the other paper plate on the clay to make a "sandwich."
- 5. Lift off the top paper plate. Leave the clay in place on the bottom plate for support and a steady work surface.
- 6. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the clay.
- 7. With the wooden skewer, cut out a 3" circle from the center of the clay plate. Remove the circle, leaving a wreath shape on the paper plate.
- 8. Cut off enough clay to form a softball-sized ball. Roll, pat, and squeeze the clay between cupped hands to make a lumpy ball. Throw ball onto the foam work mat.
- 9. Using the sides of your fists, pound the clay ball to a ¼" slab.
- 10. Place the cardboard patterns on the clay slab. Using the pointy end of the wooden skewer, trace around the shapes to cut them out. Cut out 8 ears of corn and 16 corn husks/leaves.
- 11. Gather the excess clay from around the cut out shapes and set it aside to use for another project.
- 12. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the clay shapes.
- 13. Score the backs of 2 corn husks and adhere them on the sides of a corn ear. Repeat with all the other ears of corn.
- 14. Score the backs of the corn and the top of the clay wreath. Arrange and adhere the 8 ears around the circular wreath with the tips of the corn pointing outward.
- 15. Use the pointy end of the wooden skewer to make 2 holes at the top of the wreath for hanging.
- 16. Allow clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).



- 17. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. <u>Or</u> fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 18. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 19. After the glazing and firing or the painting is done, use the twine and raffia to make a hanger and a large, loose bow at the top.



Round brushes in assorted sizes
Two 2 7/16" wooden tie pegs

#### **Directions**


- 1. Cut off enough clay to form a softball-sized ball. Roll, pat, and squeeze the clay between cupped hands to make a lumpy ball.
- 2. Push your thumb into the center of the ball. Make a pinch pot, pulling the clay into a bowling pin shape. Pinch a small beak shape from the top (head).
- 3. Cut off enough clay to form a softball-sized ball. Roll, pat, and squeeze the clay between cupped hands to make a lumpy ball. Throw the ball onto the foam work mat.
- 4. Using the sides of your fists, pound the clay ball into a 1/4" slab.
- 5. Place the cardboard pattern of the tail feathers on the clay slab. Using the pointy end of the wooden skewer, trace around the shape to cut it out.
- 6. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the cutout.
- 7. Gather the excess clay from around the cutouts and form it into a ball. Pinch off little bits for the wattle and eyes.
- 8. Score the wattle and eyes and adhere to the turkey head around the beak.
- 9. Score the front center area of the tail feather cutout and the back of the pinch pot. Adhere the tail feathers to the turkey body.
- 10. With the flat ends of the wooden tie pegs, make holes at the front bottom of the turkey body. Remove the pegs.
- 11. Allow clay to dry to leather-hard stage (may take 24–72 hours).
- 12. If using glazes, paint with glazes and then fire to cone 06. <u>Or</u> fire to cone 04, then paint with glazes, then dip and fire to cone 06.
- 13. If using acrylic paints, fire to cone 04 or cone 06, then paint.
- 14. After the glazing and firing or the painting is done, push the wooden dowels into the holes. Secure with glue if needed.

- 7. Using the long liner brush, outline the cornucopia and fruits and vegetables in Tuxedo. Allow to dry.
- 8. Paint 3 coats of Sunkissed over the back of the plate. Allow to dry.
- 9. Glaze and fire to cone 06. (Optional: If the entire plate is fully covered with 3 coats of color, you can omit the clear glaze.)







- 6. Place the 1½" square of Brown on top of the feathers, covering the bottom tips of the triangle). Affix with pinpoints of glue on the corners.
- 7. Using the pattern as a guide, place and glue the eyes, beak, gaggle, and feet.
- 8. Arrange the Green, Yellow, and Orange chips as a border around the edges in an alternating pattern. Affix chips with pinpoints of glue.
- 9. Place project on Thin Fire paper.
- 10. Fire to contour fuse.

- 6. Set this piece aside to dry to a leather-hard stage.

- 10. Paint the feathers Gold, Red, and Orange on the outside of the back end of the bowl.

## **Pumpkin Votive Holder Clay Hand Building Project**

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Crumple up some newspaper to create a fist shaped ball. (The size and shape of the pumpkins will vary, depending on the size and shapes of the paper balls.) Dampen the paper to make it easier to work with and create a smoother ball. Set it aside.
- 2. Roll out a ¼" clay slab.
- 3. With a clay cutter, cut out 5 finger-width strips. Smooth the edges with wet fingertips.
- 4. Lay the strips of clay over the paper ball.
- 5. Press the ends of the strips together where they meet at the bottom of the ball. Press it gently on the work surface to flatten and smooth.
- 6. Gather the strips at the top of the ball, and press and pinch to create the pumpkin stem. Cut off any excess clay.
- 7. Set aside to dry to a leather-hard stage.
- 8. Gently pull out the newspaper.
- 9. Apply 3 layers of glaze to the leather-hard clay.
- 10. Fire to cone 06.



- 6. Peel up the pattern pieces.
- 7. Paint a Black dot in the center of each eye.
- 8. Paint 3 coats of Yellow for the beak.
- 9. Paint 3 coats of Red for the gaggle.
- 10. Paint 3 coats each of Green, Red, Yellow, and Orange for the feathers.
- 11. Clear glaze and fire to cone 06.

## Scarecrow Clay Hand-Building Project

drinking straw, rolling pin

#### **Instructions**

- 1. Cut out the pattern shapes (hat, hair, flower, and nose) from the cardboard.
- 2. Roll out a ¼-inch-thick slab of clay onto the foam mat work surface.
- 3. Place the cardboard cutouts of the hat, flower, and nose on the clay. Use the clay cutting tool to trace around each shape. Remove the excess clay from around each shape.
- 4. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of each shape.
- 5. Roll out a ¼-inch-thick slab of clay onto the foam mat work surface.
- 6. Place one paper plate (right side down) on the clay slab. Use the clay cutting tool to trace around the plate. Carefully lift up the cutout clay shape with the plate.
- 7. Press the second paper plate on the clay to make a "clay sandwich."
- 8. Lift off the top paper plate. Leave the clay on top of the second plate, which will offer support and a steady work surface.
- 9. With wet fingertips, smooth the edges of the clay.
- 10. Lightly score the back of the hair shape, then lay it down and press it on across the top of the head.
- 11. Lightly score the back of the hat shape, then lay it down and press it on top of the hair.
- 12. Press the burlap square onto the hat to create texture on the clay surface.
- 13. Lightly score the back of the flower and nose shapes and press in place.
- 14. Roll up 2 small clay balls, score the back of each, and press in place for eyes.
- 15. With the straw, make 2 small holes at the top of the scarecrow hat.
- 16. Allow clay to dry to leather-hard stage.
- 17. Paint with glazes.
- 18. Fire to cone 06.
